





Congratulations to Jeff Secord! NHPA Arch Stokes 2023 Award



2023 Arch Stokes Memorial Award RecipientJeff Secord

Established in 1958, The Stokes Memorial Award commemorates the memory of Arch Stokes, one of the most beloved and important figures in the history of horseshoe pitching. The award is presented each year to the person who has done the most during the preceding three to five years to promote, foster and build the sport. Arch Stokes was a four-time president of the N.H.P.A. His efforts rescued the game following World War II and built the courts in Murray, Utah, where the World Tournament was held 13 times.

I was awarded the Stokes Memorial Award during the awards banquet at the World Tournament this year. I was praised for my activity as tournament director and promoter of Team World and became only the fourth person from Wisconsin to be honored by receiving this prestigious award. Dick Hansen (2001), Lorraine Sternberg (2007), and Aleena Lepak (2021) received the Arch Stokes Memorial Award in past years.

I am honored for being recognized at the NHPA level for the time and effort that I put into promoting horseshoe pitching and being tournament director of an outstanding horseshoe pitching tour-



In big part to the support team and so thankful my Dad got to be in the arena with me. Pitch on my friends, pitch on.

"Easy to Get Things Done a.k.a. The Search for Consistency"

I want to be regular.
Wait, that doesn't come across quite right.
Normal, that's more like it.
Steady. The same.

This summer at the pits has been all about consistency. It's bedeviling, isn't it? That we could do something so many times, yet feel like we do it differently in a million tiny ways. When you're locked in, there is a natural and obvious sense, where the inner dialogue hushes up and you seem to pitch effortlessly. Actual athletes call it "the zone" or attribute aphorisms.

Yet one twist, step or adjustment later, and you feel like you've never thrown a horseshoe before in your life.

So this summer for me has been all about seeking consistency. There were peaks and valleys last year, which was my strongest to that point, when I settled in around a 12-percent ringer ratio. Far from champion caliber, but good enough to beat most of my friends and even fellow pitchers on a good day.

I did my level best starting in spring of 2023 to be regular. The same. A cookie cutter, a math problem. The unnervingly plain lyrics to a Talking Heads song. This drive for sameness was only amplified after seeing Alan Francis in Beloit. An absolute machine, you couldn't detect an aberration from his first pitch to his last, and his ringers proved it.

Easier said than done (especially, you know, room for less fr with me believing I could will myself in a jump of 70 summer from doinger ratio points between myself and Francis ... we work cycle of the play the same game but boy on boy does it seem break gives me addifferent). Performance psychologist Chris Pomfret — it all over again.

the job title alone lets you know there is enough of a challenge in this field to employ a cottage industry of thinkers and advisers — calls consistency the "most highly valued goal of all elite athletes and performers." So what about us non-elite athletes and performers?

Hence, consistency, rather than outright ringers, became my goal this summer. Cue the training sequence from the first "Rocky" movie or the similar and shorter training sequence from the "Mike Tyson's Punch Out" Nintendo game. Consistency for me involved a few features that I brought with me nearly every day at the horseshoe pits, in Milwaukee and back where I grew up in western New York. First was pace, making sure I wasn't in a damned hurry, especially in a sport in part meant for relaxation. Second was to isolate a few mechanics toward refinement, the idea that focusing on three or four physical motions I know lead to good or ugly pitches would limit the amount of overall adjustments or discombobulation. For me, these were elbow placement, step consistency, retaining a semi-firm grip and maintaining a smooth and straight delivery. And my third feature hit on the mental part that keeps people like Chris Pomfret employed. Something not quite right? Take in some air, walk in a circle, talk to that can of Modelo ... anything to reset and avoid the spiral of self doubt and curse words that likely keep most people from approaching me at the park.

And through early September, I have to stand by the outcomes. My ringer ratio bumped up to 16 percent – my best day most days last year – and I've tossed the best days of my life, with a quarter of my throws semi-circling that cursed stake some afternoons. The focus on a couple of the problems, with the acceptance to stop-breathe-start over, made room for less frustration and more success. A stellar summer from dedicated normalcy. With the clockwork cycle of the seasons, the upcoming winter break gives me a chance to stop and get ready to do it all over again.
