I want to take this opportunity to say thank you to all of you who came to the State Tournament in Beloit Labor Day weekend. With many events being cancelled this year, I want to commend the Beloit club for all the extra efforts they did to make this tournament a reality, and success.

We had five new pitchers come to the tournament for the first time. They are Edwin Pulfus, Adin Weller, Gerald Harris, Rayna Bauer and Jeremy Studinski. There were 107 contestants over a two-day period.

Ron Berg presented Hall of Fame inductee Dave Forseth with a tribute to his tireless work at the Sandbar Sports Arena in Arena, setting up the indoor courts after events that night into the early morning hours. Dave and others built the indoor courts, and it became the "hot spot" for the Wisconsin Horseshoe Pitching Association. I also became the home of the Hall of Fame displays in the 90's. It hosted many regional tournaments with Iowa and Minnesota and hosted three state tournaments in 2000, 2003 and 2007. In attendance were eight past Hall of Fame Inductee's, including John Udelhofen, three-time Men's Champion from the Arena club.

This tournament was special to me, being a member of the host tournament. But what I do pales in comparison to the work Dan and Tammy Newkirk do for the Beloit club every week and for the Beloit club for the past 15

years; helping with many of the tasks that make for a successful state tournament.

Dan and Tammy received this year the prestigious "Presidents Award". So well deserved. Backed by the hard work of the Beloit Club, which includes Tammy's sister Rayna Bauer who helps a lot. Gena and Dave Quaid camped out on the grounds ahead of time and did a lot behind the scenes. The Beloit club lets people camp at the club, and many pitchers take them up on this opportunity. This is a great way for pitchers and families alike to get to know each other better. This was the nineth time that the Beloit Club has hosted state since 1989.

By 9:40, the Men's Class B was pitching, outside. There was some rain afterwards, but the class did finish. The rain did force the Juniors Boys and Girls championship inside, and the Hall of Fame and Awards presentations. We were fortunate to have an indoor facility this year for some of the classes and awards. Other awards given were

Player of the Year(POY) to Penny Steinke, Jill Peterson and Richard Conrad. Most Improved Adult was Richard Conrad, Junior was Bladley Benzing.

I hope to see many of you at state next year in Eau Claire. And hopefully we will have a new group of pitchers pitching in their first state tournament and see further growth in our sport at the 99th Wisconsin State Tournament. Ringers to all.

Regional Directors Report By: Dave Volz

With the 2020 pitching season winding down, it is time to start planning for the 2021 WHPA sanctioned pitching season. I will be contacting directors to verify dates, tournament and contact information and the number of patches needed. The 2021 patches need to be ordered soon so that I can receive them before our January tournaments.

The NHPA is continuing to make updates to eShoe and integrating it with the HSMaster program. The goal is to have all 2021 tournaments set up in eShoe and a schedule for all tournaments in the US would be available for viewing in eShoe. Any tournaments run with HSMaster, will be able to send results directly to eShoe. The results and resulting averages will be updated immediately! A new version of HSMaster will be available this fall and will need to be installed in your personal computer in order to make this all work. On Oct 1st, 2020 everyone will be able to update their membership for 2021 through eShoe.

The NHPA has extended the mail in tournament program until December 31st. There is also a new Facebook group that was recently launched for Sanctioned Horseshoe Online Pitching. The 'SHOP' is a Facebook page created to host online tournaments and leagues for sanctioned horseshoe pitching. You must have a camera and pitch towards one end, or you can pitch both ways with a camera at one end but be pitching with someone to verify scores. It is a neat group with the first inaugural tournament underway.


