The 2021 World Tournament is underway at Winnemucca, Nevada. We have 16 pitchers from Wisconsin pitching in this year's event which runs from July 19th through July 31st. A list of those pitching and the times they pitch can be found on the WHPA website home page. You can also access some live video feed, results and other information by clicking on the 2021 World Coverage Page link.

The summer tournaments are in full swing and most of

the Tournament Directors are now using the HSMaster tournament program. It was upgraded on the 1st of January with the new eShoe program which makes it much easier to update player averages and for sending in their tournament results. Don't forget to thank your Tournament Directors for all the work they do!

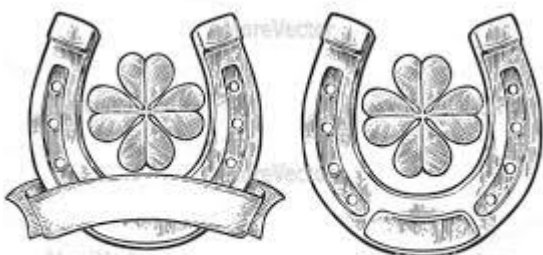
