The horseshoe season is now under way. Little aches and pains that you haven't had in a long time are back. During the weekend of Club Team and the State Doubles, I really noticed the number of people with aching feet, legs, backs and arms. You wouldn't think horseshoe pitching uses that many

muscles, but it does.

The people who tell you they don't have aches and

pains are either a) in very good shape, b) young, c) a good salesperson, or d) has the ability to stretch the truth. Before your first tournament, do some walking and stretching.

The weekend, other than the aches and pains, was very nice. Seeing friends you haven't seen since the fall and talking about horseshoes, fishing, hunting, or anything not work-related takes the stress away.

Start getting your tournaments in for State. You need three tournaments between August 1, 2008 and July 31, 2009.

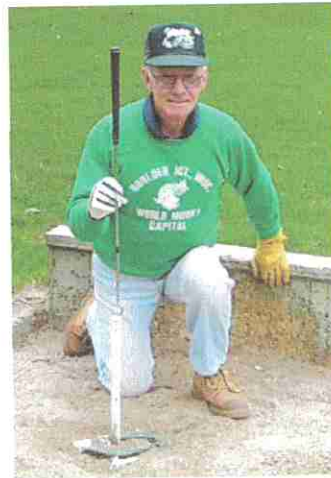

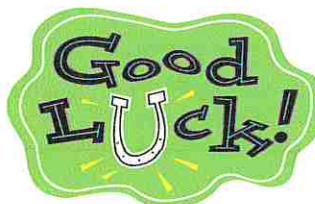

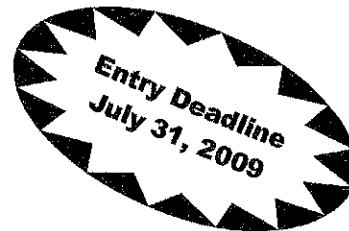
