President's Message Gary Volz Hello to all horseshoe pitchers. Last month we had our state meeting. I announced at the meeting that I will not be running for president again. At this point in my life work and family does not allow a lot of time for horseshoes. Over the last year I realized how fast my girls are growing and want to make sure I spend as much time with them as I can. My term will last through the end of this year. If anyone is interested in the position or has questions please contact me. July 31st is the deadline if you are interested in running for the position.

We just finished another successful club team and state doubles tournament. Congratulations to our new state doubles champions Lonny Trangsrud and John Brophy. I would like again to thank the whole Beloit Horseshoe Club for all their hard work.

The NHPA proposed bylaw changes for this year have also come out. This year there are some interesting proposals that could have some big effects on Wisconsin. All the proposed changes are posted on our website. I encourage everyone to look and let any of the officers know your opinions. We will have four delegates voting on these at the World Tournament in St. George. The two that could potentially affect us the most are allowing pitchers in adjacent states to join the WHPA and raising the dues from \$17.00 to \$25.00.

There are some stipulations for joining an adjacent state but many of the Illinois pitchers who are members of the Beloit Horseshoe Club could join the WHPA if this proposal passes. The other proposal would raise the yearly sanction fee \$8. This would change the yearly dues to \$33 instead of \$25. Of the \$33 the WHPA gets \$8. This is the same amount it has been and is not changing.

With cap pulled down & a focus only on her game against Mick Gillette of Missouri, Terry Beagle felt the weight of Team Michigan's goal to become the best team in the world. But as all of us know, at the very moment when you want your biggest game, sometimes the worst comes out. With Beagle who pitched an impressive 68.44% for the 3 day tournament, a 52.5% couldn't have come at a worse time. As any would understand, she slowly walked off the court dejected & sad. But little did she know, her teammates picked her up. Michigan had won it! Champions! 2 games to 2 with Michigan pulling it out as Tom Williams & JD Drake won by large margins. The total point differential was in Michigan's favor. Since neither Beagle's loss or James Dunlap's loss was not a blow-out, Michigan finished off Missouri to become the 2017 Team World Champions.





The National Horseshoe Pitching Foundations (NHPF) Grant Fred Lane


