"The Cruel Shoes" by Justin Kern "Classics and Invention, Amid Utter Stupidity"

In plenty of obvious ways, Fredonia, New York is a small college town. Ten minutes from Lake Erie, surrounded by vineyards that fill the county with concord sweetness just as the fall semester begins

at SUNY – Fredonia, when the residential population doubles.

It's next to not much of anything, unless you're counting the neighboring city of Dunkirk, my hometown that, with closed factories and social clubs, felt less than collegiate. Fredonia, where the high school mascot was a hillbilly holding a moonshine jug and flailing a muzzleloader, a relic for the more current preppy population. Fredonia, a name close enough to the made-up fool's paradise in the Marx Brother's classic, "Duck Soup". Where the Buffalo Bills used to practice, where you'll occasionally spot The Flaming Lips or Sleater-Kinney while trying to record an album in the woods. The lone beacon for miles to anyone not already living in Chautauqua County.
