


It was nice to see Telfer pavilion in Beloit filled to capacity again. We had 24 four person teams and filled all 24 courts in both shifts. Thank you to Tammy Newkirk for pushing this event and coming up with extra teams. I ran it a little different this year, instead of flipping a shoe and the winning captain selecting who pitched against who, I set it up so that the top pitchers on each team in each class pitched each other and so on down the line for all four pitchers. It saved a lot of confusion for pitchers trying to set up each match up on the laptops every game and a lot less mistakes were made. All you had to do is select the court and the game number and you were good to go. There were very few minor issues and everthing ran quite smoothly. In Class A, Muskego pulled off winning the title again by one game over Arkdale by beating them 3 to 1 in

the final matchup of the day. Third place had a three-way tie that was broken by total ringers with Beloit taking it by one ringer over Deansville I and two ringers over Summit Ridge I. In Class B, Summit Ridge 2 took first by one win over defending class champion Close Doesn't Count. In Class C, Summit Ridge 3 edged out Summit Ridge (Merrimac) in the last round and won first by half a game. Beloit 8 dominated Class D with 3 of the 4 pitchers on the team going 5 and 0. I also made a change on the trophies, instead of updating the plates on them I put the winners' picture and names on them. They will be changed out each year with the new winners. I also made up past winners display boards for each class with winners and pictures. There are some years with missing pictures, so if anyone has any of the missing ones, please let me know! Generally, I have assistance in generating the Spring Meeting minutes. Kevin Brekke has been the main guy in this project. Due to Karla's (his wife) impending surgery, he was unable to attend the meeting. He has missed so very few over the last decades. Sending haling prayers and positive vibes to their family.

The WHPA Spring Meeting was called to order at I:01 with 41attending. Dobie lead the Pledge of Allegiance followed by Moments of Silence. Ken Heinritz was unable to attend as he had several students attending the State Welding Contest. Kathy Jaeger was also wished and sung Happy Birthday.

John Secord read the Fall WHPA minutes, which were approved; he gave the Treasurer's report which was also approved. We have \$7186.27 in our treasury.

Ist VP Dave Volz updated us with the NHPA WT information. He asked for a show of hands of those planning to attend in Lansing this year. At this date we have 8 signed up but it was early; he also asked for a show of hands of those attending for the first time. WI should be well represented. He also mentioned the deadline for the Club Team and Walking Doubles are nearing. He has 22 ³/₄ teams for Club Team needing 5 pitchers to make 24 teams for this event. He talked a bit about the Website and Regional Director job of sanctioning the pitching courts this year.

2nd VP Dan Newkirk updates us with the EC Club hosting the WHPA State tournament Sept 2/3 this year. Paul Wiese was modeling the shirt available for this event. They will be available for sale at all EC events this summer. The 2024 State Tournament will

be held in Beloit. Dan also informed and asked for help in setting up and take down of the clay, lines, filling boxes and moving clay for Telfar Arena for the Beloit May



tournaments. He and Tammy had printouts of the setup schedule for those able to help.

3rd VP Sonia Cook spoke of the JR Raffle. She had tickets and is accepting any donations for the State Tourney drawing. Tammy said she would get and donations to Sonia for the raffle in EC. We have \$5700 disbursements and a total of \$12,457.96 in this account. We have an amazing horseshoe family as everyone is willing to help when needed.

Jane Smith, WHNL editor, reminded everyone we

will need a new editor and printing staff for the WHNL next year. The duties of the editor include gathering reports from the President, Chaplain, officers



and any feature column. The tournament results and pics are provided by Dave Volz on the Webpage. It takes between 10-20 hours to get the WHNL ready for proofing, printing, labeling, and mailing. An additional but not time-consuming task is keeping the subscription list updated and banking of incoming checks. I send the list of those requestion hard copies to Gary Volz who does the final proof, sends to printer, folds, labels and sends. He had a credit card at US Bank to cover expenses. We are hoping our new editor will have access to a US Bank branch.

Jeff Secord, HOF Chair, announced Don Kangas will be inducted into the HOF in September. Don's credentials are outstanding as Jeff recently completed a detailed spreadsheet of WI pitchers. This spreadsheet will be available on our website as Dave has time to take care of this. Jeff also talked of the TW event, this the 37th year. Teams from Canada and Ohio are making an appearance after several years not attending. There are 20 teams at this time. The finals will be Sunday, afternoon, May 21 and it is guaranteed to be quite a show. WI has a chance to be the first team to win 4 consecutive times. GOOD LUCK WI! The Earl Paulson Awards are going to Sue Snyder, deceased, and Alan Francis for their participation in this tourney. NHPA Officers Gary Roberts and Jim Kinney will also be attending this event. There will be a TW in 2024. Way to go leff and Beloit!



by Justin Kern "April Signs Bring May Surprises" The signs are still up, even though

their central purpose has changed. sider seasons other than winter in southeastern Wisconsin and I used that time to visit my most familiar pits, good and in shabbiness. at Milwaukee's Humboldt Park. With each passing year, the gracious Eagle

Scout project that crafted those wooden sandbox pits show more wear, from myself and a handful of players, plus errant children and snooping animals, all multiplied by the wet and cold of our outdoors.

An idea at the back of my head came forth protect this place in whatever meager way you can. The Milwaukee County park system is epic and essential in our city. However, over the years, as use and regard for the number of horseshoe pits have simultaneously dwindled, the County has cut the number of public pits. We're down to two or three, leaving me grateful but guarded for this single pit at Humboldt Park just up the street from my home. (The adjacent beer garden is icing on the cake. Delicious, Modeloflavored icing on a Lakefront Hazy IPA cake.)

Having few discernable skills save writing, I decided a sign was my best approach to guard and inform people that this was sacred ground. Something to post at or near the pits, to warn the children to point their strollers to the playground over yonder, to remind the count of my hulking around large bags of sand to the dog owners that human hands dig around in this sand. In all that, I'd add niceties, rules of the game and possibly an off-brand parks department

logo.

After nearly six minutes of typing, layout and copyediting, I brought my naïve Barbara Kruger design to be laminated, before stopping off at stores to pick up thumbtacks and extra play sand, as there have been years where that was on me and other pitchers. Defend our turf, yeah, that's the thought. Me or who else? As I arrived, I pulled together my signs, my thumbtacks and my sand, and lugged it all a hundred or so yards from the road to the pits.

Here I saw a different me-

mento. No toy trucks or cigar wrappers, not a leaf pile or gift of indeterminate animal origin. In the pit, just ahead of the season, someone had already brought sand, good stuff at that, plus a small hand-rake to even it out. Whether it be county worker or stranger or Early March gave us a few days to con-fellow player, these were offerings to come back, keep pitching. Stood there with my jumbled armful of sand and tacks and posters, surprised by a place familiar, in

> With my warnings on my handmade sign, I had to pause to ask myself a toned down version of that question so often pondered on Reddit forums: am I the crank? My intent with these signs was so focused on a big underlined "NO", to pets and kids who have other places nearby to sniff and slobber for fun. Hardly inviting.

> Seen another way, the text I laid out was light on rules and primarily emphasized the ease of getting into the game that I find (mostly) relaxing and (mostly) engaging. And while the "NO" is prominent, even larger is the first word you'd likely see - "Welcome". Looking over the unprompted additional sand and hand-rake, I felt it'd still be a welcome addition to post these signs on the back of the backboards, inviting if not slightly cranky.

> (Outside of internal pontification, I also earned the label "suspicious". Weeks later, I ran into a friend who said they recognized me that day but didn't feel like it was a good time to stop over and chat as I was involved in something "suspicious" in the park, on acsoundtrack of shaking thumbtacks.)

> > A few weeks after they were posted, the signs remain. They'll stay up however long it

takes for someone to peel them away, vandalize them through boredom. That's fine. For one, I printed and laminated a bunch of them. For the time being, they should help invite visitors and the interested, with caution to the careless. All of those signs will go missing in due time, to wind and teenagers and the occasional attentive park employee. No matter, they'll have been worth a shot, to see if we get a few more pitchers this season, which, for me at least, starts promptly tomorrow in the early May sunshine as I walk with my shoes down to Humboldt Park.

Regional Directors Report

The deadline for the 2023 World Tournament in Lansing Michigan has passed and the tournament schedule should be completed by the first of June. I will be posting it on the WHPA website as soon as it is available. I don't have a final number, but I know Wisconsin will have over 50 pitchers participating this year, many who will be pitching in their first World Tournament. Reminder, all contestants must have their name and state professionally lettered on the back of their shirts. Said shirt cannot be sleeveless. No cut-offs are permitted and closed-toed shoes must be worn. For those who are attending their first World, here are a few things that may be helpful. Arrive early and check the place out! Upon arrival stop by the "WELCOME" booth which will be located in the hallway of the main entrance and sign in. The CVB will have a list of all pitchers entered. You will be asked your name and state and will be given a welcome bag which will have a World Tournament program, patch and towel as well as numerous other items and information. On your first day of pitching, you must check in one hour before your scheduled pitching time. There will be signs show-

ing you where to check in. At check-in, class group pictures will be taken and your shift director will give everyone some brief instructions followed by a question-and-answer period. You will be given your round robin card for your first day's games. You will then be allowed to go your assigned courts, but you are not allowed to enter the court pitching area until all games from the previous shift have been completed and you are instructed to by your shift director. You will be allowed approximately fifteen minutes of practice each day before your games are started. On your second and third days you will pick up your round robin cards at a designated area. You should check in there approximately thirty minutes before your scheduled start time and you should have your shoes with you because they may be doing random shoe checks where they measure and weigh your shoes. Most classes in the preliminaries are set up with sixteen pitchers per class and you will pitch fiveforty shoe games for three consecutive days. It is cancelation and they have electronic scorekeeping with paid scorekeepers. Following your last day of pitching there will be an awards ceremony for your shift after any play-off games have been completed. Good luck! Have fun and make the best of your World Tournament experience!
