WHPA SPECIAL AWARDS

The Pitcher of the Year Award was created by then President Dick Hansen with the intention of encouraging members to participate in State sanctioned tournaments. Members received 1 point for pitching in a tournament, 3 points for a third place finish, 5 points for a second place finish and 10 points for a first place finish in their respective classes. In 1994 Dick handed the record keeping duties to Jane Smith with the suggestion to simplify the points, as over 275 pitchers were listed, and the record keeping job was time consuming. The calculations now include only NHPA sanctioned tournaments and points awarded for only first (15 points), second (10 points) and third (5 points) finishers. Record keeping is still time consuming with approximately 200 names recorded. Several suggested changes have been discussed, but no clear-cut decision in creating a more fair method of establishing the selection of this award winner.

The President's Award was also created by Dick Hansen in 1993 with the intention of recognizing a person or persons who have greatly contributed to the promotion and success of the game of horseshoe.

The Scorekeeper's Award was created by Marge Yach and Randy Rein in 1997. Their experience in hosting a weekend tournament impressed upon them the important role scorekeepers play in the success of a tournament. Horseshoe pitchers are asked to help in the selection of this winner by contacting Marge or Randy with the "scorekeeper" and reasons for this recognition. Winners of this award can repeat every five years.

The High Average Awards are designed, created and given by Gus Schram. His first award was given at the 1999 State Tournament in Wausau. He recognizes state tournament pitchers with high averages in the Mens, Womens, Elders, Junior Boys and Junior Girls divisions.

The Most Improved WHPA Pitcher Award will be given for the first time at the 2001 State Tournament. This award will be given to the person who has improved his/her pitching average the most over the past year (July 31, 2000 through July 31, 2001).

SCORE KEEPING GUIDELINES

1. Please write the LOWEST number on the left side of the score sheet and place the name of the LOWEST number on the top of the scoreboard. (consistency)
2. Display the score change on the scoreboard BEFORE writing it on the score sheet - especially the final score. (Pitchers can immediately check score and movement won't interfere with the pitchers.)
3. Rotate your scoreboard occasionally so all spectators can see the score.
4. Sign your score sheet.
5. Tie games in 50 shoe games are broken by pitching 4 more shoes until the tie is broken.
6. Ask the pitchers to wait at the END of the courts for their cards after the game. You will bring the information to them. (to eliminate distractions for pitchers on adjacent courts.)
7. If you have any questions, ask a judge.
8. Bring your completed score sheet to the tournament desk to receive a pay ticket which you will be able to turn in at the concession stand for money, food, drink, etc.

CLAYTON GAGE – 2001 Hall of Fame Inductee

Clayton Gage began his pitching as a young child of ten years old. His father bought “real” horseshoes at auctions which he and Clayton threw back and forth. In 1935 a man from Indiana, staying at the Gage family resort, showed Clayton how to pitch a turn and quarter shoe. In 1945 Clayton married Dorothy, his wife of over 50 years. They had one son, Norm, and a daughter, Roberta, who was killed in an automobile accident when she was 18. Three granddaughters, a great granddaughter and a great grandson have brightened the Gage household. Clayton worked as a Grain Elevator Superintendent for Harvest States from 1941 until retirement in 1983. When Clayton was not working he was pitching shoes with the St. Paul Municipal Horseshoe Association, Ramsey League and Bloomington tournaments. Clayton served in the US Navy from 1942 to 1945. In 1983 he moved back to the resort property on Half Moon Lake near Milltown, Wisconsin and joined the Close Doesn't Count Horseshoe league.

During his pitching career in both Minnesota and Wisconsin, Clayton blazed quite a trail. He played in over 200 tournaments placing first at least 55 times and second 45 times. He averaged around 55% until he moved to 30 feet and improved his average to the mid 70% range. He played in nine Senior Olympics taking three golds, three silver and three bronze medals. Clayton has also won Elders Class A championship titles for six years, 1995-2000. At the 2001 World Tournament in Hibbing, Minnesota, Clayton and Ed Kowatch pitched a game of 114 shoes, setting 11 world records. WOW!!! One of Clayton's most memorable moments was pitching his first 92.5% game at the Wisconsin State tournament in 1994.

Clayton attributes his successful horseshoe pitching career to his “World's Greatest Cheerleader” Dorothy, whose spirit and positive attitude pulled him through tough times on and off the court. Dorothy would be smiling proudly and bravely as Clayton is inducted into the Wisconsin Horseshoe Pitchers Hall of Fame as one of the best horseshoe pitchers in the upper Midwest! Congratulations Clayton!

EARL PAULSON – 2001 Hall of Fame Inductee

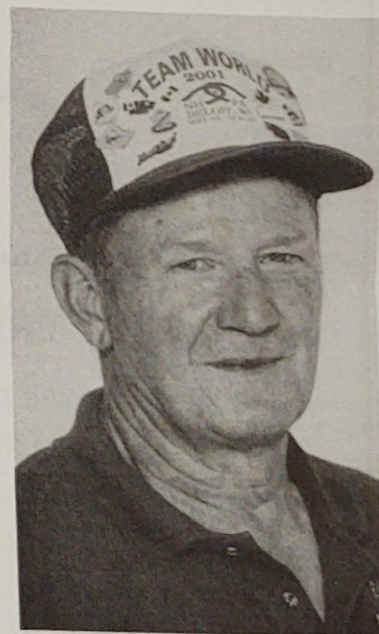
Earl has been a lifelong resident of Beloit, Wisconsin. After graduating from Beloit High School in 1947, he attended Gale Institute in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Earl began his career as Telegrapher and Station Agent for the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad in 1949. He retired in 1991. He was a member of the United States Army Signal Corps from 1951-1953. Earl and his wife, Myrt, celebrated their 50th Wedding Anniversary in January of 2001. Their union produced three sons, Dennis, Ken and Brad. They are the proud grandparents of seven and great grandparents of one.

Earl's main hobbies were the typical hunting and fishing until 1979, when he was introduced to horseshoe pitching. He got his start on Tuesday nights with a bunch of guys pitching shoes for fun (deep down we think he still pitches for fun!) He organized the Beloit league in 1983 that was sanctioned in 1985. Earl has been the sanctioned league director for sixteen years. In 1986 Earl took on another leadership position as tournament director of sanctioned tournaments. Under Earl's guidance, the Beloit club moved from a few tournaments a year to at least one half dozen a year! Among these tournaments have been the Wisconsin State tournament in the years 1989, 1992, 1995, and 2001. What a perfect time to be inducted into the Wisconsin Hall of Fame. Earl and the Beloit club have also taken on responsibility of hosting the Wisconsin State Double and Wisconsin Club Team tournaments.

Earl has pitched in World Tournament competition since 1987. He missed the 1988 tournament in Pleasantville, California. He must have enjoyed the world tournament aura as he soon worked with the city of Beloit to rent the Telfer Park hockey arena for Team World competition. This truly exciting tournament has been held in Beloit since 1990. The weekends have changed from March to April to May because of weather, but the tournament continues to draw top pitchers from the US and Canada.

Earl's prowess on and about the courts have earned him the prestigious Wisconsin State President's Award in 1998. He also has won the Wisconsin Moose Championships in 1996 and 1997.

Congratulations Earl! You have earned your place among the distinguished horseshoe people of Wisconsin.





SENECA (RED) FERGUSON – 2001 Honorary Hall of Fame Inductee

Red is a man with many geographical roots. He was born in Hackensack, Minnesota; lives in South Beloit, Illinois and spends a great deal of time in Beloit, Wisconsin. He worked in the Beloit Foundry until his retirement in 1990. He has enjoyed a variety of sports including fishing, hunting, bowling, baseball and, of course, horseshoe pitching, which seems to be his favorite.

He began pitching shoes in his backyard with friends and loved pitching shoes at his company picnics. He is a Charter member of the Beloit Horseshoe Club, bringing not only great talent and skill, but overwhelming generosity. He has pitched in the sanctioned league program for sixteen years, pitched in the South Beloit Sand Festival tournaments, pitched in the Illinois State tournament, and pitched in a number of world horseshoe tournaments. He is a three time World Class winner in the 1992, 1993, and 1994 world tournaments. Red also holds bowling titles as Illinois State Senior Champion in doubles and State Senior Champion for all events.

Not only is Red a serious pitcher and competitor but also a great promoter of the game, receiving an achievement award from the NHPA. He was one of the premier pitchers in Madison during the Wisconsin State Sesquicentennial Celebration. He has great expertise in building horseshoe courts as evidenced by the Beloit Horseshoe Club home courts. When not pitching shoes, Red can be found keeping the horseshoe grounds in tip-top condition.

Red Ferguson's generosity includes not only time but big dollars as well. He has donated over \$40,000 to his favorite sport with a large portion of it going into the construction of the Beloit Club facility. Red was instrumental in securing the land on which the 13 outdoor sanctioned courts are located and the new indoor facility. Because the Beloit Club could not agree on a name for the facility, they asked Red to name their new building. This is a great honor for a great man!

Sincere congratulations to Seneca (Red) Ferguson as Wisconsin's 2nd recipient of the Honorary Hall of Fame award.
