WHPA President Dobie Gutweiler

As I sit down to write this, the spring pitching season is in full swing and summer pitching is on its way. Many of us are preparing to travel to Wichita Falls Texas this summer to compete in the World Tournament. While we are looking forward to the fun and the time with our friends, we are also thinking of the voting that needs to be accomplished. The two proposed rule changes coming before the delegates can be found at the following link, but I have also included a synopsis of the proposed changes.

Rule I - Pitching Divisions

Section A – Juniors (See REQUIREMENT 6. for exceptions and additional information)

Junior Cadets (any pitcher twelve (12) years old or younger for the entire calendar year) Junior Cadets may pitch from any place on the extended or full-distance platforms and shall observe the twenty-foot (20') foul line Note: Junior Cadets may choose to move into the Junior Boys or Junior Girls prior to the age guidelines, but cannot return to the Junior Cadets, once this declaration has been made.

PROPOSED CHANGE OF WORDING: (see italic/bold print for changes)

Rule I — Pitching Divisions

Section A – Juniors (See REQUIREMENT 6, for exceptions and additional information)

Junior Cadets (any pitcher ten (10) years-old or younger for the entire calendar year) Junior Cadets may pitch from any place on the extended or full-distance platforms and shall observe the twenty-foot (20') foul line Note: Junior Cadets may choose to move into the Junior Boys or Junior Girls prior to the age guidelines, but cannot return to the Junior Cadets, once this declaration has been made.

Rule I - Pitching Divisions

Section E

- I Elder Men
- 2 Physically Challenged Men
- 3 Elder Women division for age 80 and over stating Elder Women become eligible to pitch in the Elder Women's division upon purchase of an NHPA card dated for the calendar year that they become eighty (80) years old.

Rule I – Elder Women may pitch from any place on either the extended or full distance platforms and shall observe the twenty-foot (20') foul line. Elder Women must notify their Charter secretary, in advance, of the date that they intend to begin pitching from this shorter distance. Once a member declares herself a short distance pitcher, she must remain in that Division until the next year's membership card is purchased. At that time, she may switch back to the Open Women's Division, but must remain in that Division until the next year's card is purchased, etc. NOTE: See Rule 11, Section D.1 for additional information about re-qualifying. 4 – Physically Challenged Men/ Women

Physically challenged, men pitchers less than seventy (70) and women pitchers less than eighty (80) years old may be given permission, by their governing Charter, to move onto the extended platforms in the Physically Challenged Divisions with physically challenged men observing the twenty-seven-foot (27') foul line and the physically challenged women observing the twenty-foot (20') foul line. The prior completion and approval of a Medical Exemption Application Form (available from Charter Secretaries and on some Charter Websites) is required. At the World Tournament and at State Championship Tournaments, they shall compete in the appropriate Elders Divisions.

Please take a moment to review the proposed changes and reach out to your 2019 delegates to share your opinions. Remember that we represent YOU and we cannot do that without your input.

As I leave you this month, think about the reasons you continue to pitch horseshoes week after week and year after year. For me, it's the love. Love of the game and love of my shoe family. It's cheering on my friends and being surrounded by smiles. I hope to see as many of you in the pits as I can. And as soon as possible.

Pitcher of the Year Dave Volz

The Pitcher of the Year award is determined by the number of points accumulated in tournaments from August 1st through July 31st. There are 3 Divisions which are determined by the year end average printed in the first issue of the newsletter for the year. Division A is 45% and over, Division B is 30% - 44.99% and Division C is below 30%. Pitchers receive 15 points for a 1st place finish, 10 points for a 2nd place finish and 5 points for a 3rd place finish in open WHPA sanctioned tournaments. Bonus points

are awarded for attending the WHPA Spring and Fall meetings in the amount of 15 points each. If you would like to see the current standings, go to the website at www.whpahorseshoes.com/awards The site is updated as the results come in from the tournament directors. 
Fred mentioned the website, and the HOF write-ups under the persons name, only 14 missing. Dave Volz did a great job he said.
