Behind the Mask ... With NHPA Chaplain Ken Heinritz

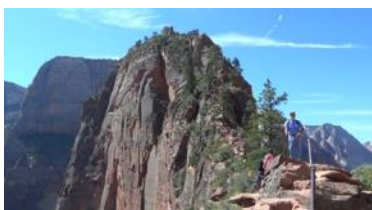

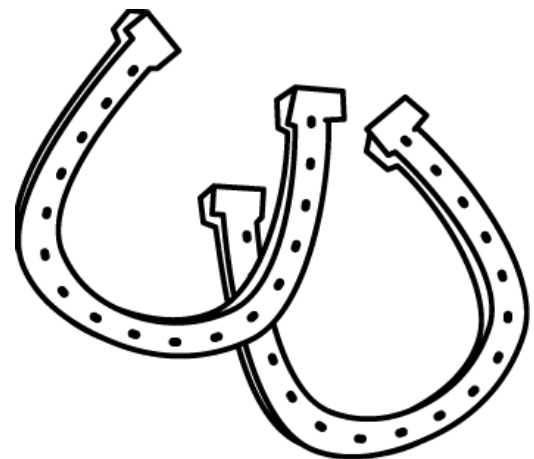

“Around the World”



It was too cold to play outside, this mid-March weekday in Milwaukee. It wasn't too cold to check about playing.

I turned off the TV and left my phone at home to walk the 12 chilly minutes to the pits. News of war and conflict has a way of rattling around your head. Perhaps an evolutionary skill we've adopted, to remain in consideration over how

people can be the worst to each other at times but not all the time.

As I was walking to the horseshoe pits in Humboldt Park, it dawned on me how little I know of our favorite pastime outside of our nation. I have read of the roots of horseshoes in Civil War battlefield downtime, which, now that I type those words out, seems absurd. Taking a break during war. But that does appear to be the case, with horseshoes in the form we'd recognize it.

Before that, it was the Roman officers apparently who played some form of the game, including amid their occupation of what is now Britain. Really, it's all likely a version of quoits, tossing and proximity games which peo-

ple play in all manners. Really, I was walking out of the house for a break from the news of war to see if it was too cold to play a game rooted in escape from war.

I reached the pits and they were no worse for the wear after a mild winter. (I'll keep my fingers crossed on that until at least we clear June.) Kicked out twigs and leaves. Dug into the sand, moist and steady – but cold. Too cold for today, probably the next day at that.

Walked back and wondered if and about horseshoes in Ukraine, of pastimes in Russia. According to a tourism website called “Traveling in the Carpathians,” there is a museum in western Ukraine dedicated strictly to the equine and veterinarian aspects of horseshoes. No mention of the game on their humble website, though with a collection that certainly appreciates the history and craft of shoes. On display – “an exquisite English horseshoe made of modern materials and considered the local rarity.”

Plodding further along online, distraction from distractions, I came across bunnock, another tossing game believed to have been concocted by Russian soldiers in remote posts of northern Siberia, with ample time and, as it turned out, horse anklebones. Horse anklebones stand upright when pitched the right way.
