



be: Tom Steinke and Rudy Van Fleet. Congrats to both Tom and Rudy.



Have a GREAT summer pitching horseshoes.

The days of keeping score of a horseshoe game with pencil & paper are long gone. I remember the blistering hot days of scorekeeping (outside) in 1998, the World Tourna-



ment in Ainsworth Nebraska. It was a challenge to keep your sweat from smudging or erasing the score sheet. A mistake meant erasing all three score sheets separately or else you had a



major mess on your hands. The official white was collected by the shift leader, the yellow carbon copy went to the winner, while the pink carbon copy to the loser. Recording ringers the correct way meant staying alert. An 'X' for all canceled ringers while an 'O' for ringers that counted. After a few games, you felt like a veteran. But tallying a new score after each frame was necessary. And after the game meant adding up ringer totals, ringer percentage, points & a signature. Fastforward to today & you find significant improvements to keep-

ing score. With simple clicks on the correct key, the computer does all the work. No sweating with this method . . . in fact keeping score of one game is far too easy so keeping track of two games at a time, is the new normal.

Some of the names from past rosters were missing this year. Dale Lipovsky was miss-


the second time in the 31 year history of Team World. Colorado, Kentucky, Ohio, Ontario, and



Tennessee are just a few of the teams from further away that we "locals" enjoy seeing make the trip to Beloit to participate in Team World.

There is no other horseshoe event wherein pitchers of the same state get the opportunity to band together to try to defeat opposing teams. There is also no where anyone that enters, regardless of average, has the potential to be taking on current and former World Champions, World Tournament class A participants, and State Champions, There also can be no way to explain how a lesser team from Missouri can accomplish just one win in 76 games and still say they had a great time playing Team World.

Michigan jumped out ahead of the pack early in the tournament to



be the team to chase for the coveted #I spot after the prelim round robin. The team consisting of JD Drake, Terry Beagle, Larry Hinton, and Paul Bachelor were tops on the leader board and the end of each day on Friday and Saturday.

From Rich Altis, MO #I Champion Pitcher

I think game six with Michigan may have been our best game of the pre-lims. We won the flip. Putting ing for just Greg against JD, I took Terry, Mick vs. Paul, and Steve played Larry. They tied! We won 1-1/2 games. That loss placed us second on the ladder and we did not have to set out waiting for ladder play.

Secord:

The #1 spot was up for grabs realistically for 3 teams: Michigan, Missouri #1, and Wisconsin #1. But it was MI and MO #1 on top.. Each team had 59.5 wins at the end of the round robin. This was a first in Team World history that the competition for the #I spot for the finals ended in a tie. Ringer percentage was used to break the tie and Michigan prevailed, 1,957 ringers (64.38%) to Missouri #1's 1,938 ringers (63.75%).

Altis:

Larry Hinton did another great job singing the National Anthem before the finals got underway.

Michigan has a tough team and the only pitcher to win all round robin prelim games in JD Drake. Alone at 19 wins and 0 losses is quite an accomplishment.

The head to head matchup for the final game pits Gregg Craven against Terry Beagle, Craven pitches a 72.5% game and wins. Mick Gillette plays Paul Bachelor and wins with 60%. Steve Johnson is matched ey had earlier tied but Hinton pitching 72.5% took this one. I Have to pitch JD Drake. I have never won a game from him but got lucky in my last game of this event pitching a winning 82.5%. This gave our team, MO #1 three wins and first place.

The positions of 3rd, 4th, and 5th had five teams that had a legitimate chance of getting one of those three spots to make the finals or be the one of two teams on the outside of the top five at the end of the prelims. Those teams were Wisconsin #1at 55.5 wins, Illinois #1 at 55 wins, Indiana #2, at 50 wins. Minnesota #1, and Illinois #2 at 50 wins even though George Huntington



had the highest ringer percentage in the tournament at 71.84%. Minnesota #1 was also unable to get in the top 5 as they finished $\frac{1}{2}$ game behind 5th seeded Indiana #2 even though Minnesota's team ringer per-



centage of 59.84% was the third highest team percentage in the tournament. With Missouri #I's second place seeding, they had to win two rounds in the brackets of

the finals to get an opportunity to play Michigan for the title. Missouri #1's first opponent was 5th seeded Indiana #2. A 3 games to 1 victory moved them on to the winner's match. Meanwhile, Wisconsin #1 took on Illinois #1 in the first round of the finals. These two teams finished in a two games each tie with a 120-91 point advantage for Illinois #1. Missouri #1 again prevailed with a 3 games to 1 victory over Illinois #1 to get their chance to face Michigan for the Team World Title. Wisconsin #1 fell to Indiana #2 to allow Indiana #2 to finish in 4th place behind Illinois #1. Wisconsin #1 took the #5 spot with the



In the absence of Ken Heinritz, President, Glenn Bogenschneider led the opening prayer.

All in attendance were presented with a meeting agenda complete with hot topics for discussion. To speed up meetings also received were the previous

meeting's minutes in written form.

Alas the treasurer's report is still read by the State Secretary, John Secord indicating a working balance of \$2800.

Referring to her work on the P.O.Y. award, VP, Jane Smith thanked tournament directors for results including the top three. A new brochure is in the works to include a webpage check for all clubs.

Second VP, Eddie Wheeler announced the 2016 State Tournament will be hosted by the Bull Falls Club verified by Randy Rein.

Although 3rd VP, Sonia Cook was not present she is trying to locate a former junior, Ryan Hyatt without success.

Hall of Fame director, Jeff Secord, had the big news of the day. The 2015 selection of the committee was a dead-heat therefore **Rudy Van Fleet** and **Tom Steinke** will both go into the WHPA Hall this year.

Mark Mauthe, speaking for the 2015 State Tournament reported there will be no camping at the courts but there is opportunity in town with eight sites. Recommending early reservations he will publish the hotel—motel info online. T-shirts are on sale at #13 each. Mauthe noted a connection with the Beloit Club adding their aim is electronic scoring.

Cash awards, an ongoing suggestion for the State Tournament, were discussed by the ex-



were discussed by the executive board. They feel that cash at the State level would only be possible with corporate sponsorship. Although there remain some dissenters. It was said, other states paying cash are known to limit awards, to one trophy per class.



A funding source was offered of assessing each tournament participation \$1 per. (Later research found that move would accumulate approximately \$ 1,400/yr.) Mark Mauthe's poll of pitcher's indicate most support the choice of cash awards. Cash awards for the State Tournament may not a dead issue, yet Randy Rein stated he likes it the way it has

been and is currently going.

Bogenschneider pointed out the WHPA might like to initiate a Mentor's Program to aid Junior participation. Perhaps a group of volunteers to assist juniors with entry fees and/or transportation. There was not much response. Jim Haupt said he'd help but not run the show.

Another pass-out announced a membership contest called EACH ONE-REACH ONE. Time frame, Jan. 1st 2015 to Sept. 30, 2015. Rules: One entry for each new member. Eligibility: Any WHPA member or club. Drawing: Fall meeting need not be present to win.

Reminders: World Tournament entries closed May

18th. Four event participations required. World shirts are available through John Secord or online at \$30. Bylaw changes will be considered at the next, 2016, spring meeting but must be submitted on or before the 2015 Fall meeting. Finally, officers up for re-election at the fall meeting will be President and 2nd Vice President. Bogenschneider's last words, **"I will not be a candidate."** Meeting adjourned 2:10 pm

In the absence of a qualified volunteer candidate for the WHPA presidency nominations will have to be accepted from the floor at the fall meeting. Don't hesitate. Nominate —now. New Champions team of the year, Summit Ridge, the guys from the Lake Delton Sportsmen's Club unseated the defending champs, the Muskego Moose. The winners led by Larry Grabowski the only pitcher without a loss in the entire class. He and teammates, Rich Peterson, Bun Carley, and Dave Volz made the day being just one game up.

Beloit One with two pitchers, Jesse Garza and Tom Bird, winning all games overwhelmed B class with 17 wins—a blow-out. They lost only three games all day.

Northern Wisconsin squeaked out a win in C a seven team class. Susie Erickson led the team with a 5/1 record. Check the result columns. See that the winners were only two games up on the sixth place team. Most places, two through six had to be decided by ringer percentages due to ties. A 25 team entry forces one seven team class. This group of pitchers was selected for the duty of dealing with a bye round because they are all considered to be experienced and accomplished pitchers.

Beloit entered six teams in this event. Three of those teams were in D class. Beloit #4 took the honors in D class. Joel Ramsdell and Rowen Swick did the job with all wins. Honorable mention should be made of the Homestead-2 team leader, Christina Heinritz for her winning ways, 5/0.

We had a cameo appearance from Wisconsin's oldest active pitcher, LeRoy, the Moose Meyer, age 90 years young pitching for the Com Lox team.

100 pitchers makes Club -Team the most popular money tournament annually in this state: First place paid \$192/team; second paid \$128; and third paid \$64. Class C also paid thru 4th place.

For some pitchers it is their indoctrination to computer scoring which was a breeze. This event requires a lot of prep work but could not go until Jimmy Paulsen shows up with the computer setup.

The Club-Team of 2015 is in the books.

Besides being a nice sunny day the price of gas in Beloit was 17 cents per gallon less than home.
