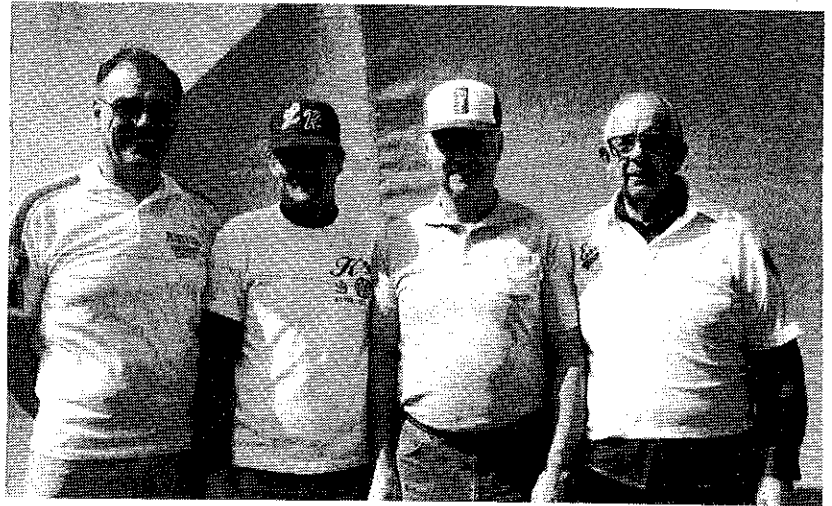

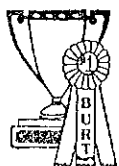
I am still looking for someone to take care of the Hall of Fame in Plover, call me if you are willing.

## MINNESOTA TEAM WINS THIRD CONSECUTIVE TITLE

The powerhouse team from Kentucky dominated the pre-lims losing only 7 of 68 games and earning one tie. Minnesota also had one tie but lost 19 pre-lim games. The Gopher state pitchers came from the third position of the ladder play-offs passing Missouri to edge the Kentucky team in a feeler gauge finish.

In the final match the tournament's two top percentage pitchers set the pace. Bev Nathe, Minnesota, and Lois Webster, Kentucky tied. "Ties stand", answered Nathe's plea. Only seconds before, Phyllis Negaard, Minnesota had lost to Ron Powell of Kentucky by 5 points. One court away Dale Lipovsky, was swinging that shoe in his finest game (90%) out-pointing Charlie Meredith of Kentucky by 16. Lu Cave, Minnesota, and Don Titcomb, Kentucky were the last pair still engaged. Titcomb had just scored four to make their numbers the same and was first to pitch the final two shoes. The ominous black backboard blocked our view but Titcomb was stretching to check his second shoe - maybe short. Cave answered with her last pair somewhat the same - one on and one a touch short. After an eternity of measuring by two judges, the short shoes were declared equally close - a dead inning; the game was a tie. The match score showed each team with one win, one loss, and two ties.

Minnesota won the match by virtue of total team points scored in this final round. The margin of 11 points hardly represented the squeaker it actually was.

The TEAM-WORLD CUP goes to Minnesota one more time - the third in three years - and the fifth title in ten years!

All teams in the five place ladder finals were former TEAM-WORLD winners with the exception of Wisconsin. The Indiana team lost the first ladder match to those Wisconsin newcomers but the Minnesota team took over from that point claiming Missouri next and finally Kentucky.

Ladder competition was intense. Every one of the five final matches was scored at 2 wins and 2 losses. Each match was decided by total points as outlined in TEAM-WORLD rules. Up for discussion this year will be a possible rule change to play out game ties in the ladder rounds.

A record of forty-two pre-lim wins, of the possible sixty-eight, was shared by Illinois-1 and Ontario-1. It was a sixth place deadlock for the 'alternate' ladder position worth \$200. Ontario-1 took the award with a greater team average - about one percent greater.

Fifth place Indiana received \$300. Wisconsin-1 won

\$450 for fourth place. Missouri-1 at third was awarded \$650. Second place Kentucky received \$900, and the Minnesota-1 winners took home the TEAM-WORLD CUP and \$1700.

Out of the money but winning more than half their games, the second team, Minnesota-2 placed ninth, ahead of all other 'second team' entries.

Eighteen teams got into it Friday Noon, pitched all day Saturday, and most of Sunday leading to the finals.

The California team notably missed this year but Ontario came with two. Kevin McLachlin recruited his wife, Karen, forming the basis for a second Ontario team. The man who plays horseshoes-on-wheels, Dennis Reid, finds the smooth surface easy wheeling. His teammate, another Illinois-3 pitcher, Abe Austin, 87½ years young, came to try it at 30 feet. Ralph Dykes, who came to write the numbers, again, is sporting a 50 year NHPA membership patch. Chad Hyatt played in place of Karl Van Sant on the only team from Indiana. Donnie Roberts, a welcome and illustrious guest, came as a non-pitcher; the sole representative of Ohio. The state of Michigan was again among the missing. There was one team of five former Junior class pitchers - Wisconsin-4. Two teams originated from Iowa, and the president, herself, of the Iowa association, Mic Wilson, played; but oh for that Iowa team capable of pitching the final five.

Its tough to stay up and maintain a winning record over the three days but two pitchers came close. Don Titcomb, Kentucky, and Randy Rein, Wisconsin-1, each won 16 of 17 in the pre-lims. Titcomb won one more and tied one in the finals. Rein became the most successful player winning both his final games. This tournament has become a time to renew the rites of Spring - a gathering of the extended horseshoe clan for some easy competition but reserve the evenings for fun. Saturday, when the games were done, the keeper of the house bar, a man called Mouse, put out some good stuff to munch on and opened his taps for all.

Despite Winter's attempt to stomp on Spring, competition for the TEAM-WORLD CUP was top flight. Saturday, pitchers rubbed their stiff fingers a little faster at the sight of snow squalls outside the arena; while listening to the local folks say, how warm it was last weekend.

Next year TEAM-WORLD has made a play for warmer weather. The date will be one week later but still a week before Mother's Day, May 4-5-6, 1995

## CLUB TEAM 1994

GOLDENDALE OUT-POINTS WINDY HILL IN PLAY-OFF  
KENOSHA RECLAIMS B TEAM TITLE

Tied in regulation play, Windy Hill pitchers had to go an extra round with Goldendale. This time teams were matched head to head according to their percentages in previous games. The match was split 2 games each but the nod went to Goldendale on points. Don Kangas won over Randy Rein by 4 points retaliating for an earlier wound. Their only losses this day were to each other. Harold Bestul, Windy Hill, got the better of Ralph Maylahn by 6 points and Lorraine Sternberg, also Goldendale, lost to Gus Schram by 3 points but Heidi Sternberg won over Greg Hehling, Windy Hill by 17 points. It was one of Hehling's better games, 50%, except this time Heidi racked 62½%.

This is the first time the Goldendale Club will be able to display the trophy for a full year. The Club won the first, and their only, CLUB TEAM event ten years ago, before the traveling trophy existed.

The Kenosha Club last won this team event the first year "B" competition was added. At that time they were known as Kenosha County. The new 'Club' won the same cash award as the A winners, \$210, but at this time there is no trophy for "B".

Seems like the defending champs from Windy Hill were not thrilled over second place. When it came time to pass the brass, just one pitcher, Gus Schram, stepped up to do the honors.

Manitowoc finally got four pitchers together and came close to Kenosha. Elaine Troullier carried the load as the only pitcher of the day with a perfect record. It may be the last time in "B" for these pitchers. When the sun is higher all their numbers will improve. Norb Strzyzewski is just starting the 30' routine and already improving.

Notice the effect of all the pitching going on at the Arena Sandbar? Two teams, both "A" claimed the indoor house as home,

As pitchers move up and down the percentage ladder there will be some fluctuation in the division of the two classes in the CLUB TEAM. This year all "A" teams entered carrying a 50% or better average. Evidenced by the results, its no easy task to live up to average.

CLUB TEAM is an expensive operation. Thanks to the Beloit Club we benefit from the fruit of their labor in set-up and they offer the portable courts free of charge. Building rental is costly but cash awards amounted to 75% of the entry fees. First place was \$210; second place, \$140; third was worth \$70.

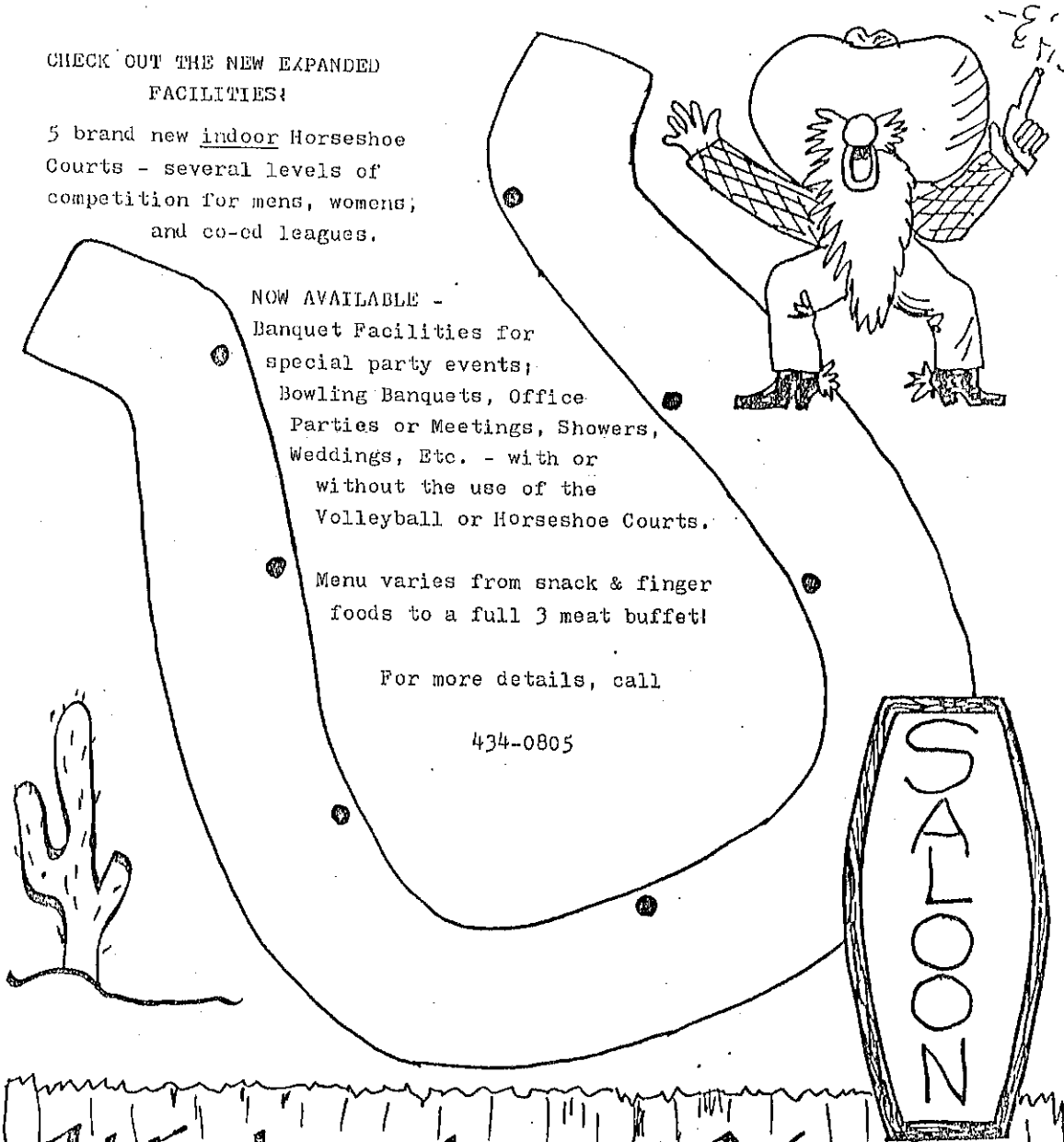
