THE BEST DARN HORSESHOE TEAM

Some fifteen to twenty years ago, when we began to organize our horseshoe league, our family was considered the Best Darn Horseshoe pitchers in the county. At that time, my father, his twin brother, my own brother, and I could all pitch about fifty percent - considered very good by most. Uninformed newcomers were sometimes given a spot of twenty points in a twenty-one point game. Most of the time they would lose a couple of bucks before realizing that they had been had.

When we began to organize our league, we had a lot of beginners. It was hard for them to compete against The Best Darn Horseshoe Team. So it was decided that in order to balance the league, we would have to split up. At least one of us would have to join another team. I was the one elected. It was hard, at first, to go out on horseshoe night knowing I had to compete against my own family and win for my new team but I met many new friends and found the beginners were getting better and better with each passing year.

Over the years, the league grew from just sixteen pitchers to almost one-hundred. We must have done something right. Not only were the, once beginners, getting better, some now were better. To lose to pitchers, that only a short time ago could not hit the pit let alone throw a ringer, was real progress. The league became very competitive and best of all, just plain fun.

This past winter, when we started our indoor season, the idea came up to put The Best Darn Horseshoe Team back together again. Give it one more shot, once more for old times, once more for the family. The league was close - win some, lose some - one week in first place, next week in fourth. Double ringers were common. Calls of "four dead" rang out all year. Could this family team hold up to the pressure? Would we fade in the end? Would age be a factor? We did, after all, have two pitchers on our team in their seventies.

The other pitchers, I once knew as beginners were extremely tough. It seemed as though every team in the league had one goal - beat the horseshoe family.


We may no longer be the best pitchers in the county but with four of us together on the same team? Well, I think it was the family in us that made us get that last ringer on the last pitch to win many a close game. You see, it doesn't matter to me if we won or lost the championship. To be able to say that I pitched on the BEST DARN HORSESHOE TEAM is all the championship trophy I need. Having a father, a brother, and an uncle on my team was my win.

But, you see, we did win. The Best Darn Horseshoe Team, the Hansens' from Racine County can still pitch horseshoe and still love it!

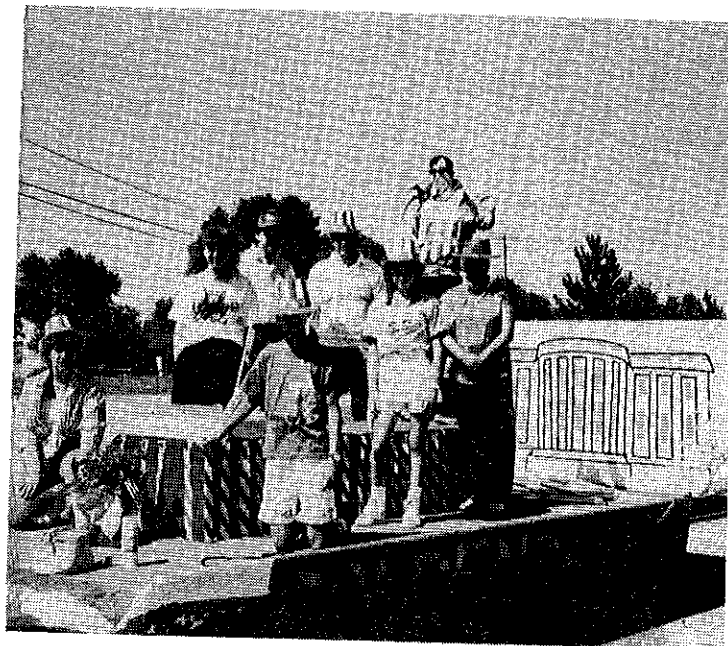

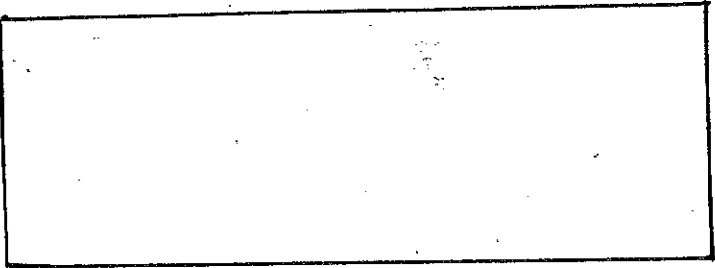

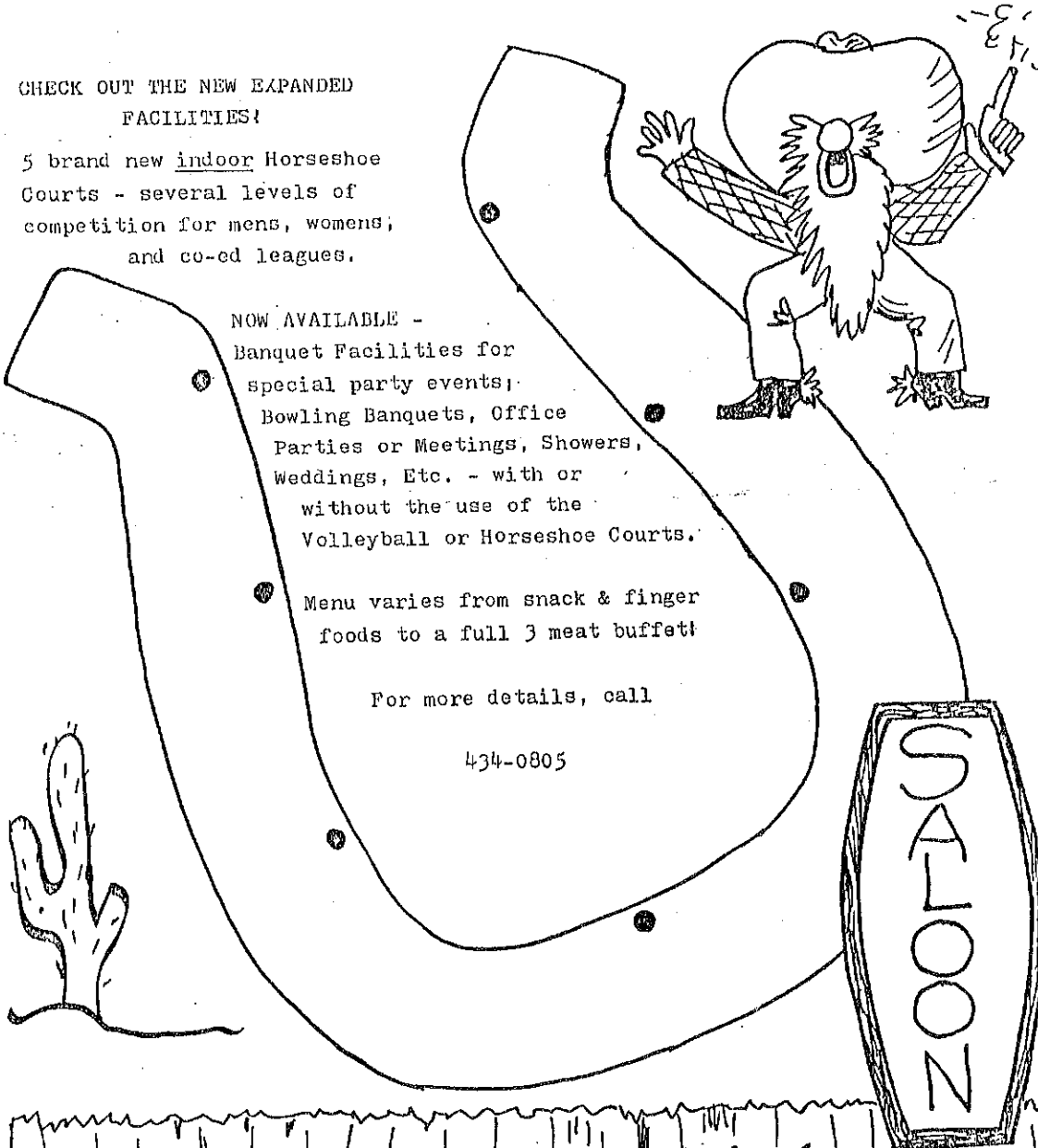
