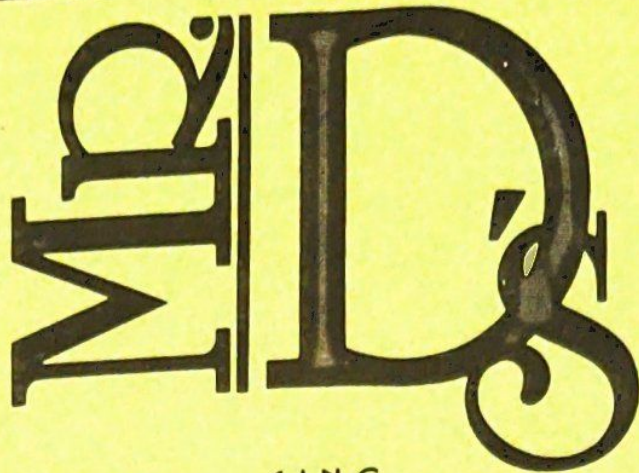

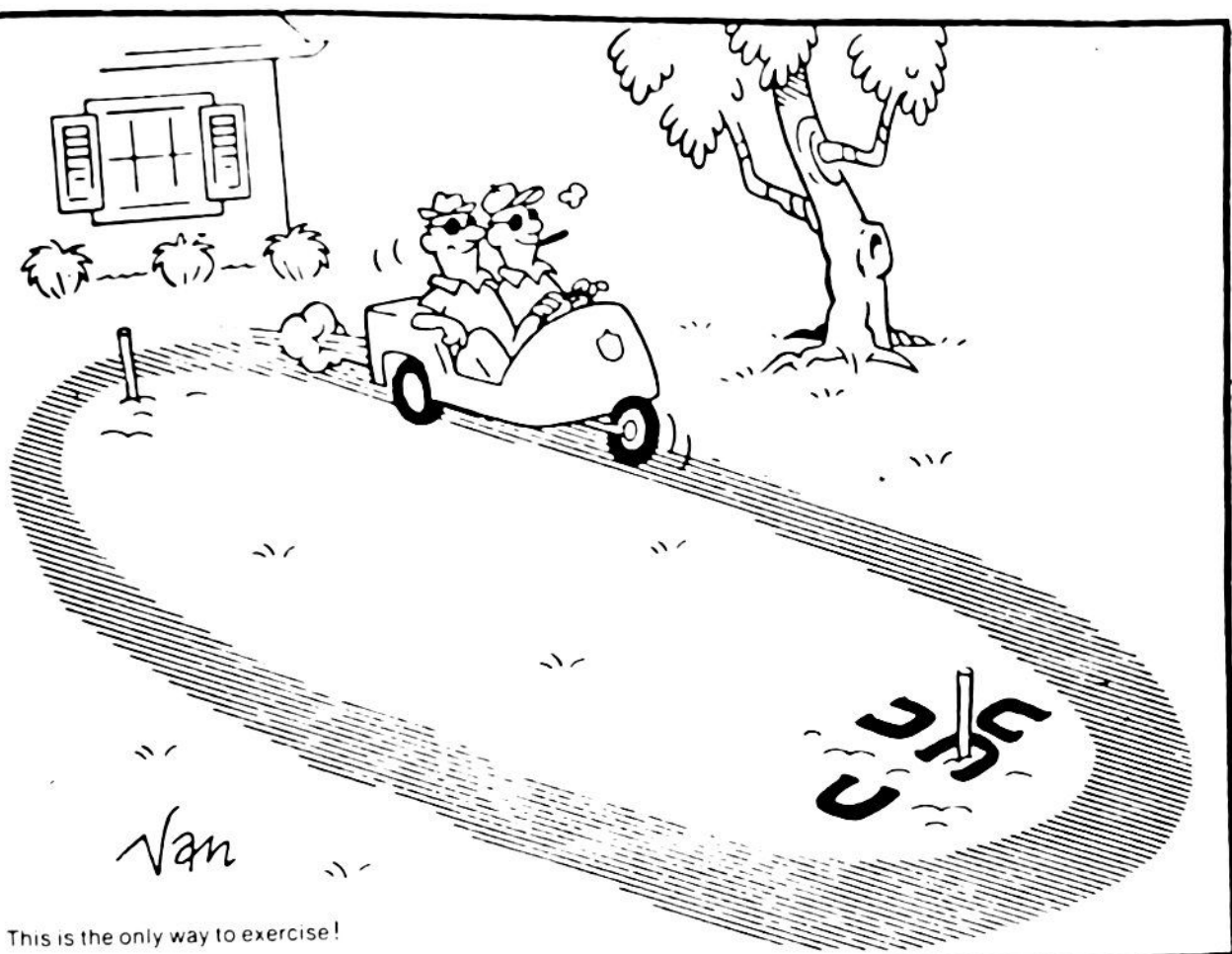

## HORSESHOE TRIVIA

The origin of horseshoe pitching is uncertain, but the game may have derived from the ancient Greek sport of discus throwing, for it is known that Roman soldiers and camp followers used horseshoes in the same manner that the Greek athletes used the discus. As the modern game evolved, the shoes were thrown for accuracy rather than distance, and stakes were added.

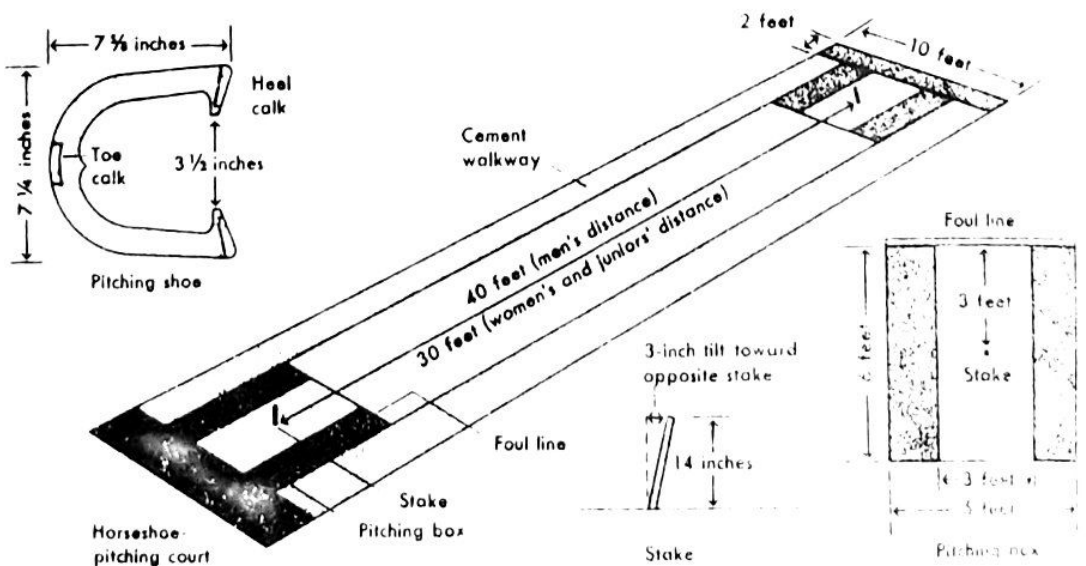
The game was introduced in America by soldiers of the British colonial garrisons, and during the American Revolutionary War pitching horseshoes was a popular diversion among both British and American Soldiers.

Horseshoe pitching was developed into a very relaxing but competitive sport during the twentieth century.

In 1920, George May of Akron, Ohio, developed a technique of pitching horseshoes in which he controlled the spin of the shoe and facilitated the throwing of ringers. Higher ringer percentages soon followed.

A shoe may not exceed  $7\frac{1}{2}$  inches in length, 7 inches in width or  $2\frac{1}{2}$  pounds in weight.

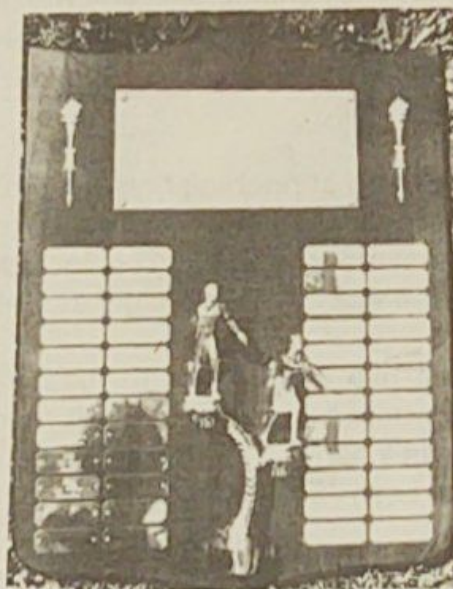
An official game consists of 50 points, an informal game 21 points. The governing organization is the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association of America, founded in 1915.





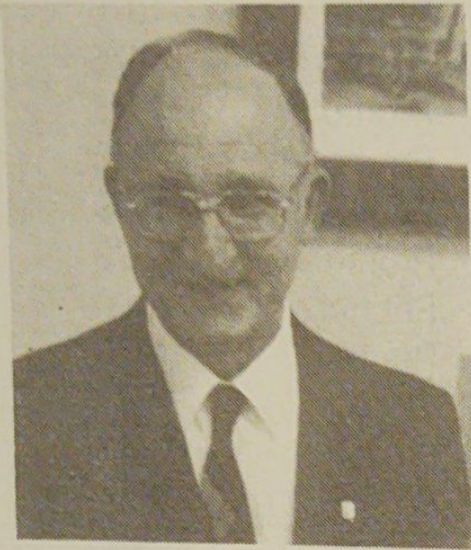

# BOB WILKE



This 1984 Wisconsin Horseshoe Pitchers Association Hall-of-Fame award is presented to Bob Wilke.

Bob started pitching horseshoes when he was a five-year-old, using the smallest pair of pony shoes he could find in his father's blacksmith shop. Horseshoe pitching was his father's favorite pastime and soon became his as his father's partner. In 1923 Bob started pitching with the Mossman shoe, which was shaped like a horse's shoe but made for pitching. Eight years later he started throwing the Gordon, and eventually the Ohio.

Bob held the Oshkosh city championship for seven consecutive years, 1930 through 1936. He pitched in his first state tournament in 1932. Although he never won the class A championship, he consistently won trophies at the many tournaments he entered throughout the state.

The state tournament was held at State Fair Park and, until about 1960, prospective pitchers went to Milwaukee to qualify by pitching 100 shoes. On Sunday morning the 16 top qualifiers started playing round robin, 50-point games, and finished between 9 and 10 o'clock Sunday night.

Bob also pitched with several "World" champions, and will never forget one of them. His biggest thrill in horseshoe pitching came when he challenged Dan Kuchinski during an exhibition at Park Plaza in Oshkosh, and beat him! Bob says it was "just luck," but he did pitch 20% better than his average.

Bob writes, "I have had the pleasure of pitching horseshoes with everyone that has held the state championship since its very beginning in 1923 up to 1982—except the very first two—namely Ed Mitchell and Seymour Johnson. This includes my having pitched horseshoe with Casey Jones before he was even a teenager as well as later on in life."

Bob has been retired the past five years; prior to that, for about 30 years, he was a vegetable grower on the farm where he grew up. For 20 years before that he worked in a greenhouse, drove truck and ran a parking lot in Milwaukee. For the past 38 years he has lived on the farm where he was born 75 years ago.

Bob and his wife, Dorothy, to whom he has been married for 39 years, have one son, two daughters, two grandchildren (plus one on the way). Their address is R. 3, Box 304, Berlin, Wisconsin 54923.

Congratulations to Bob Wilke for his many years of participation in the sport of horseshoe pitching and his success in the many tournaments he entered.

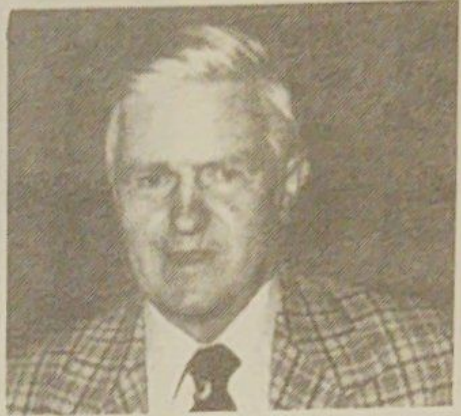

## HAROLD BESTUL

The Wisconsin Horseshoe Pitchers Association presents a 1984 Hall-of-Fame award to Harold Bestul.

Harold started pitching horseshoes when he was in the first grade, using shoes that "came off the horses' hoofs." Since his father, uncle and grandfather were horseshoe pitchers, he soon had access to regulation shoes.



He entered his first state meet when he was twenty and many in the following years until the age of 32.

Then after, a 26-year period of no competition, while raising a family and running a dairy farm, he again entered tournament competition.

He placed first in many tourneys throughout the state and, although he had second, third, and fourth place finishes, the state title eluded him. He says, "The family always kidded me. I was always a bridesmaid but never a bride." Then, in the 1983 State Tournament Championship class, the top competitors ended in a four-way tie. He had to compete in two playoff games, and at the end he was the state champion. He believes he's the oldest man—at 67—to hold the state title. Harold says horseshoe pitching takes concentration, practice, and one more thing: PERSISTENCE!

He says he has had the good fortune to have known all but the first two Wisconsin champions. He also remembers the all-day 16-man round robin competitions at State Fair Park.

Harold, who is now 68, and his wife, Martha, have been married 35 years. They have a family of ten children, six of whom are married, and nine grandchildren (plus one on the way). Their son, David, is in the seminary and will be ordained a priest in one-and-a-half years. Their address is 105 Wigwam Road, Rosholt, Wisconsin 54473.
