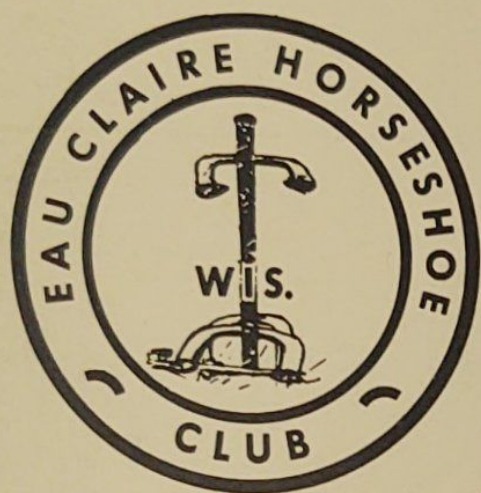
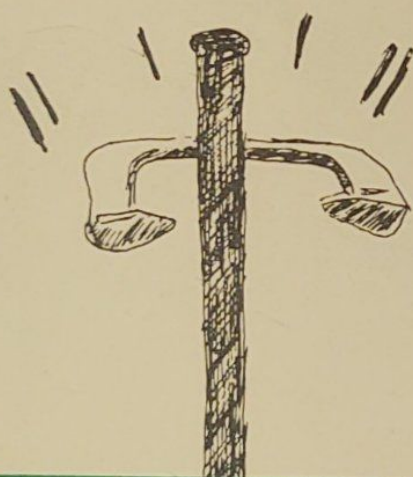

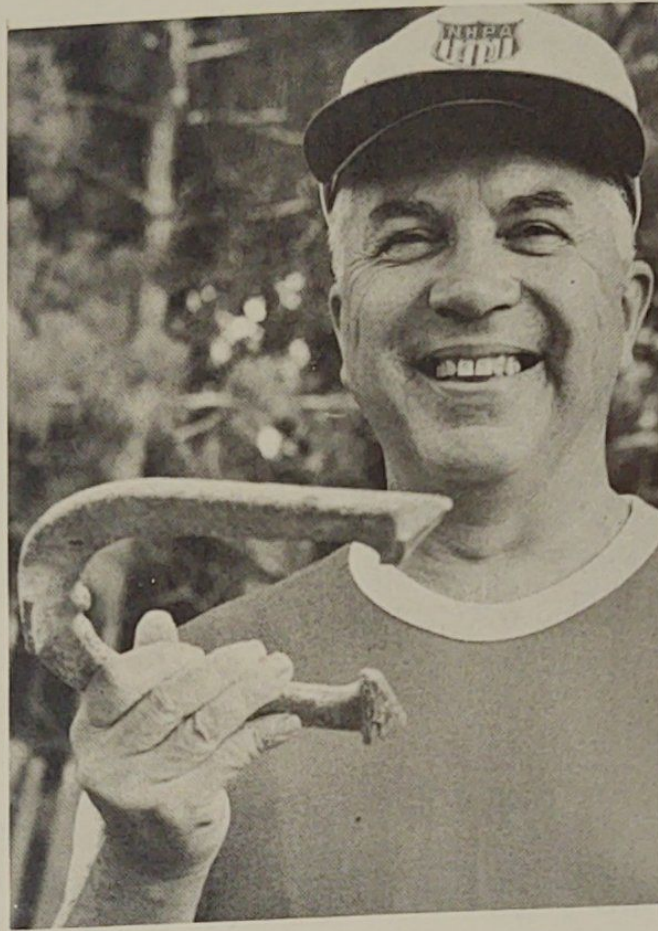
Paul Bunyan Camp, a replica of an old-time logging camp, is located near the stadium and is another of the Park's assets which we hope you will visit.

Curt Day's lowest average was in the first match against Tommy Bartten and was 79%. His next match against another opponenent was 86%, and his third match against Curt Bestul was 89%, his fourth match was 88%. Curt scored 6 points to Day's 55.
