# State Horseshoe Tourney to Open

COMBINED LOCKS — The clank of a horseshoe hitting against the iron stake will be a familiar sound in this community over the weekend as the state horseshoe tournament will be conducted at Jerry Kamp's courts.

Action gets underway Friday evening and by the time the last shoe has been tossed Sunday night, a total of 94 entrants will have had a chance to compete.

Opening the competition will be the ladies section of the tournament. This will be the first time in history that a

women's state champion will be crowned.

A total of 10 women have qualified for the state meet and all are from the Fox Cities area. The 84 men that have qualified will compete in seven divisions ranging from Class A through Class G.

### Had 34 Ringers

Top qualifier in the women's section was Ann Opsteen of Combined Locks who had 153 points and 34 ringers out of 100 shoes. Next in line was Ger Van Deurzen, Combined Locks with 134 points and 31 ringers.

Other women qualifiers, their points and ringer totals included: Marion Ristau, Combined Locks, 133 and 27; Rosemary Kamps, Combined Locks, 123 and 24; Joyce Gerrits, Appleton, 113 and 16; Mary Vandenberg, Boogaard, Kimberly, 111 and 17; Sella Dollevoet, Little Chute, 111 and 16; Vonnie Reitzner, Combined Locks, 99 and 11; Mary Jo Lamers, Combined Locks, 95 and nine and Ruth Sanders, Combined Locks, 91 and five.

The women will compete in a round-robin tournament starting at 6:30 p.m. Friday to decide the title.

The defending champion in men's Class A is Bill Glass Vesper. Glass automatically qualifies to defend his title and top qualifier was Curt Bestul Eau Claire, with 266 points and 83 ringers out of 100 shoes.

### Others in Class A

Other Class A competitors will include: Dell Calcutt, Eau Claire, 234 points and 68 ringers; Harry Emmerson, Wisconsin Rapids, 231 and 68; Wally Saeger, Ixonia, 230 and 69; Ed Schimek, Milwaukee, 228 and 64; Carl Joppe, Green Bay, 227 and 68; Ben Trolen, Fort Atkinson, 226 and 65; Bob Anderson, Eau Claire, 224 and 63; Ben Brostuen, Beloit, 222 and 62; Harold Garlie, Eau Claire, 221 and 64 and Ray Simon, Eau Claire, 220 and 63.

In Class B, the top qualifier was Bill Martin, Oconomowoc with 218 points and 62 ringer
