

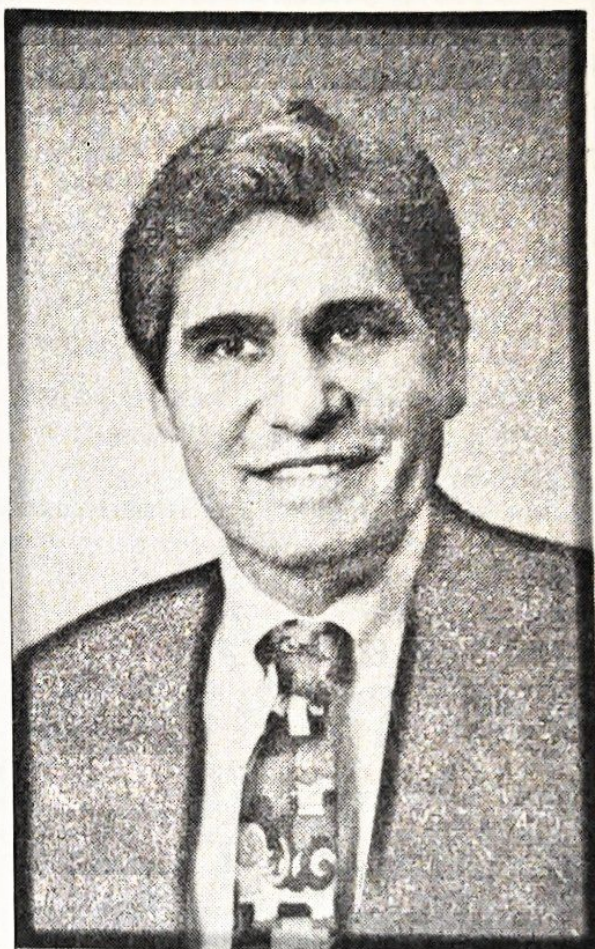

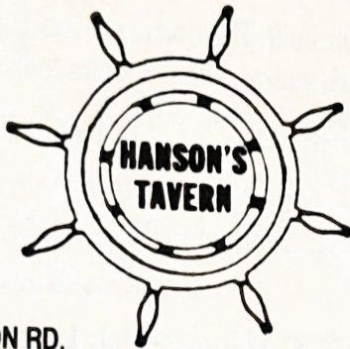

HISTORY OF BELOIT'S HORSESHOE PITCHING CLUB

Horseshoe pitching in the Beloit area, as in many parts of Wisconsin, probably goes back to the early part of this century, primarily at picnics or in back yards.

During the first part of the 1940's, Fairbanks Morse Co. of Beloit had several courts built where employees would play during their lunch period. Some organized contests were held during this period.

One of the first pitchers from Beloit to participate in the State Tournament was Earl Ramquist. During the 40's, 50's and 60's, Earl pitched against some of Wisconsin's best pitchers culminating in winning Class A at State in 1955.

In the late 1950's Earl, Ben Brostuen, Al Walmsley and others built eight clay courts with cement walkways in the Vernon Avenue Park. These courts were used through the mid 1960's. Because of vandalism to the courts it was felt a private home would enable better care of the courts.

Don Goldsmith's parents had five acres where four shaded courts were built. These were used on Tuesday evenings and Saturdays from around 1967 until the early 1980's, ending each season with a doubles tournament.

Because the courts were about 100 yards into Illinois, it was felt more courts should be built in Wisconsin.

At this time Earl Paulson's cousin had bought the Hitchin' Post Saloon on the west side of Beloit, with plenty of room for courts behind the saloon. A deal was made, and with the hard work of Earl Paulson, Ken Lovaas, Bud Renley, and many others, the present courts were built.

Men's and Women's NHPA Sanctioned Doubles Leagues on Tuesdays and Ringers Only League on Thursdays are going strong, plus pitching for fun on Saturday afternoons.

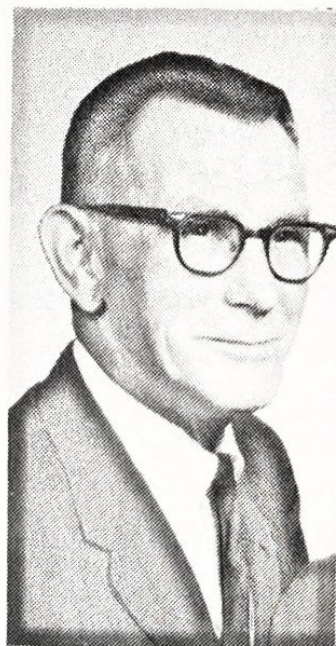
The Beloit Moose Club also has a well represented league.

As a founding father of competitive horseshoe pitching in Beloit, Earl Ramquist's encouragement to beginning pitchers is evident today by the continuing participation in the Beloit area.

Earl passed away in 1983, but his love for the game is alive in a new generation of pitchers. We dedicate this State Tournament to his memory.

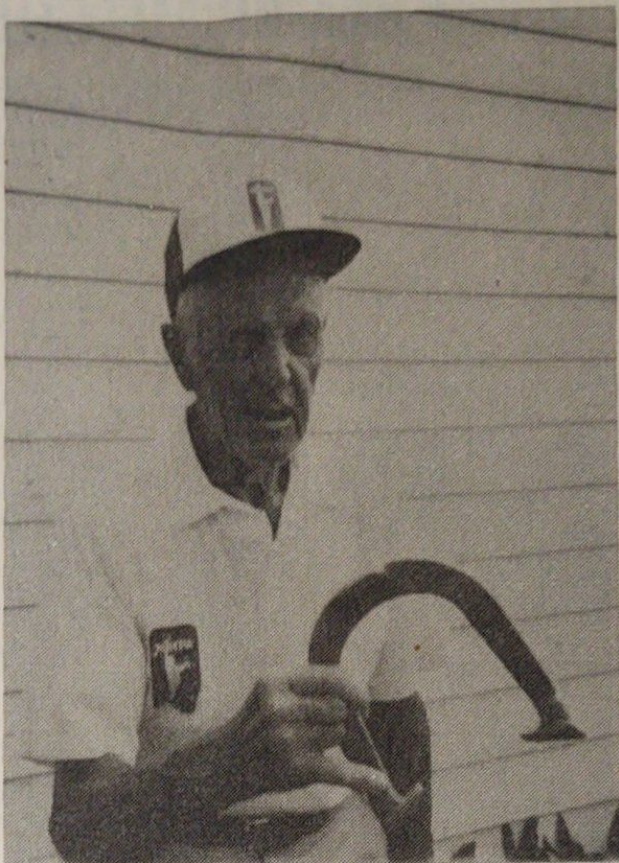

ROYCE WRUCKE



Our 1988 Senior State Champion, Royce Wrucke, has been pitching horseshoes for 70 years. He was born on December 19, 1902 in Horicon and started pitching shoes at the age of 17 using the original shoes "right off the horse". Before long, he and his brother got two sets of "'boughten' shoes, sorta round ones". They played in a league in Beaver Dam. Royce says he never won the State Fair Tournament as Casey Jones, Harvey Elmerson, Tommy Bartlen, Carl Pfeffer, etc., were too tough.

His first trophy was won at Eau Claire in 1968. He placed first in his division in six state tournaments from 1969 to 1980. After coming in fourth in 1987 in the senior class, he returned in '88 to defeat C.L. Ollerman in a playoff for first with a record of four wins, one loss and 41.6%.

Royce owns more than 100 trophies from tournaments in ten states. His average in the 70's was about 55% with a high game of 74.9%. He pitches the Allen shoe a one and one-quarter turn. He has been Vice President of the WHPA and has held various offices in local leagues.

The Wruckes have been spending five cold months at Arbor Terrace Trailer Park in Bradenton, Florida where they enjoy bridge, shuffleboard and bicycling. Of course, Royce's favorite pastime is horseshoe pitching. When they first went to Florida he and Swen Bowman build a regulation court along the park fence. Finding the light soil unsuitable for the pit, Royce began carrying clay from Wisconsin to Florida each winter and now it resembles a proper clay tournament court. He pitches every day and competes in five or six tourneys.

When the geese return to Horicon Marsh, Royce and Rosella, who have been married 58 years, come back to their 150-year-old home at 5246 Highway 33, Horicon, Wisconsin 53032. They have three sons: Royce, Jr. and John who run the farm, and Steve who lives in Miami, Florida. There are nine grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

The Wisconsin Horseshoe Pitchers Association is happy to present this Hall of Fame award to Royce Wrucke who is one of the best competitors and nicest people you could meet anywhere, but especially among an elite group — horseshoe pitchers.

FORREST ELMER MITCHELL



The First Wisconsin State Horseshoe Tournament Champion, Forrest Elmer Mitchell, known as F.E. was born in Indiana in 1888. In 1917 he moved to Wausaukee, Wisconsin with his wife and four children.

It is known that he was pitching horseshoes when he moved to Wausaukee and there he practiced with the town constable, Mr. Stadahaur. In 1923 he decided to enter the first state tournament at State Fair Park and he won the singles and doubles events. It is not known if he entered any more state championships after that but he did pitch in many fairs and exhibitions. His son Fred remembers a story in Chicago where bets were made on when he might miss a ringer. He also has his father's singles trophy and a gold watch that he won in the doubles championship.

F.E. and his wife, who passed away in 1944, had a total of 14 children. They operated a farm, dairy, and trucking business. He hauled granite stone from the Amberg quarry to many places in the state; also freight such as newspapers, appliances and furniture. He belonged to the Equity Livestock Association and had a contract to take cattle to market from 1939 to 1968. He was treasurer of the Wausaukee School District for ten years, one of the originators of the Marinette County Fair, and the first trucker to own an Interstate Commerce License which entitled him to haul to seven states in the midwest.

Because of his accomplishment 66 years ago, we find it fitting that F.E. Mitchell, the very first Wisconsin State Champion, is now a member of the Wisconsin Horseshoe Pitchers Association Hall of Fame.

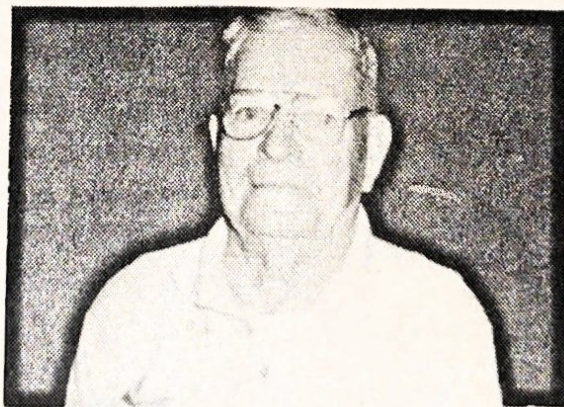
