

WHPA MEETING

We missed you at the T-Bird. Of all the State Tournament entrants (170 plus), only 30 voting members cared enough to attend the WHPA business meeting. But, apparently most of those present consider the meeting as important as pitching in their class. At any rate, a motion to eliminate the Fall meeting was denied by a preponderance of the voters. Dropping the Fall meeting would allow three more classes in that time frame. Unfortunately, those who like the meeting least, were not present to cast their votes. So-o next Fall you will again be urged, coaxed and cajoled to participate in the business meeting at the State Tournament. - Just what you always wanted.

Jane Smith proposed the use of sanctioned league and World Tournament averages to apply toward the 2 tournament rule. Most of the comments supported the 2 tourney rule as it stands but it was decided that the World average should count. Therefore the '86 World average will be used for the '87 State Tournament. Because of our July 31 cut-off date, be aware, that '87 World averages from Eau Claire apply to only the '88 State Tournament.

John Secord reported a treasury balance of \$388.00 and outstanding bills which would actually put the Association in red ink. John volunteered to defer his annual fee. At that point the members hastily approved a \$2.00 increase in yearly dues. State dues are now \$5.00.

Howie Voiles merely expressed some concern about pitcher identification and suddenly we had a rule requiring shirts with name and state. The vote was close, 17 for to 13 opposed, but there it was, ours to live with. The burden of enforcement of this new rule gave the "aye" voters some second thoughts. Finally it was agreed to provide pin-on plaques to those few pitchers who may forget their shirts.

Dick Hansen questioned the Board regarding scheduling of Class A; next year you can expect to see Class A and B men pitch their final games on Monday.

Hoo-ray for Al Lonning and John Secord for not objecting when they were re-elected for another term. Al does this just for fun but as you may recall, we are holding Secord's salary.

Curt Bestul provided some more insight to the '87 World at Eau Claire. We heard they expect 1200 entries; optimistically, 2000 is possible. They will use this newsletter to publish the entry blank and the address of the Convention and Tourism Bureau.

Rick Pritzlaff appointed a committee of three to evaluate the future of the Scholarship Fund. The lucky volunteers are Jane Smith, Glen Bogenschneider and Jim Haupt. Howard Voiles signed on as an interested observer.

As expected, Carl Shade presented a bid for the 1988 State Tournament. His resume listed ten points of the Trenton View facility. When asked about the raised foul line markers, Carl said it would be no problem to remove them. This was the only bid tendered. We congratulate the new Trenton View Club in West Bend and trust they will provide an experienced tournament committee.

The editor and writer of this newsletter thoroughly enjoyed a standing ovation for the production of these first few issues. We explained that, no, we are not quite covering expenses and beggars that we are, we made an appeal for advertising. We really do need some ads. So, if you are in a business that would benefit in displaying your message to 230 some pitchers all over the state, write or call us and we'll give you a standing ovation.

JUNIOR SCHOLARSHIP FUND

I would like to make a few comments and list a few figures to update you on the Junior Scholarship Fund which was sanctioned by the Association [WHPA] in April of 1985. During the 1985 season, via tournament collections, personal and club donations, a total of \$915.12 was realized and along with interest of \$18.28, the year closed on December 31 with \$933.40 in the account. Tournament contributions in 1985 ranged from several below \$10.00 to a high of \$85.84. A high of \$100.00 was contributed in October by John Gomoll as a personal donation.

The 1986 tournament contributions through August 22 have ranged from lows of nothing offered at two tournaments to a high of \$224.04 at Mountain. The Mountain Open in early August was exciting to see as gifts ranged from \$50.00 to two young fellows ages 10 or 11, who got involved by donating a few dollars of their scorekeeping wages. I saw \$129.00 placed in the Scholarship Fund container from Mountain donors and other tournament attendants in 13 minutes on Sunday afternoon, August 10. Until Mountain's outstanding response, the Goldendale Open in Germantown was the leader with \$109.05 in tournament collections along with two Memorials for a total of \$184.05. The total contributions for the 1986 season as of August 22 stand at \$857.07 plus \$33.23 in interest for a total of \$890.30 and a grand total for two seasons of \$1,823.70.

I would like to remind everyone of the unlimited potential for growth of this program through bequests, memorials, living honors, or maybe just someone who has a feeling of benevolence. A memorial was presented

to the program in early August by Pat Sherwin and her children in honor of husband, and father, Jerry, a longtime "horse-shoer" and a member of the Goldendale Club in Germantown, met an untimely death in October of 1985. In fact, the placards you see at most of the tournaments promoting the Scholarship Fund were made and donated by Jerry in May, 1985.

The 1985 winners of the two scholarships - \$200.00 each - Debby Bestul, Eau Claire and Hank Schwartz, Random Lake.

BEHIND THE SCENE

Scorekeeping was no problem at the State this year. T.D. Dick Hansen made a deal with the Boy Scouts who handled the chore surprisingly well. Score sheets went from the Scouts to large (2 by 3) won-lost result boards at courtside where the pitchers could follow the record of their own class. From that point the score-sheets went to the computer central where they were checked mainly by Shirley McDonald and entered into the computer by Paulette Hansen, by far the "Most Valuable Worker" at State. Dick Hansen and Mike McDonald posted the official result board. Next year the result board will be entirely computer print-outs. Announcer, Len Meistad, used computer data to award all trophies.

This was only the first State Tournament at the Pitchin' Palace. Some changes and improvements are in order but overall it was professionally conducted without any rain delays.

1986 HALL OF FAME

PAT EATON

Pat was program director for teenage girls at a YMCA in South Dakota in 1966 when she began pitching horseshoes in her backyard. She moved to Eau Claire in 1969 and in 1974 started pitching in the new twelve member league at Carson Park. She compiled an impressive record as Eau Claire City-County Champion ten of the twelve years, Eau Claire Open Champ four times since 1974, Wisconsin State Ladies Champion seven times (now eight times) and has won other tournaments around the state. She has pitched in four NHPA tournaments, placing third in Class B in 1975. She was a delegate at the NHPA meeting in Ohio.

Pat is the Second Vice President of the WHPA. She is Vice President of the Eau Claire Horseshoe Club. Pat has chaired or assisted at nearly every Open and City-County tournament held in Eau Claire.

In 1984 Pat received an NHPA award honoring her for having the third highest league average in the Nation at 69.24% and for tying the third high game of 80%. She is the first woman to take the award three consecutive years and was in competition with 660 women across the Nation.

Pat and her husband, Eldon have been married since October 14, 1950. They have three sons and two grandsons.

CARL JOPPE

Carl started pitching horseshoes in the city parks in Green Bay at the age of fourteen. He has been pitching for 52 years and in that time has recorded an impressive list of accomplishments.

Carl was State Champion in 1966 and 1985, placed second four times (now 5 times) and third three times. Over the years he has won many first place trophies at tournaments all over the state. He has been a top pitcher with the Green Bay Horseshoe Club for 35 years, was singles champ five times and had three first places in doubles.

As are our other two Hall-of-Famers for 1986, he is featured in Oattie Reno's book, "The American Directory of Horseshoe Pitching".

Carl has also attained outstanding achievements in the sport of bowling. He has been bowling 52 years and has recorded one 300 game, one 299 and five 290 games. He is a member of the Green Bay Association's Hall-of-Fame.

Carl and his wife, Laverne, have been married for over 40 years. They have one daughter, Sally Ann.

JERRY KAMPS

Jerry has been promoting the sport of horseshoe pitching since 1960 when he installed one sand court. The courts grew and improved steadily until, in 1971, the eight lighted clay courts were covered with a steel roof. Over the years Jerry has worked hard to maintain Kamps Covered Courts so that they are among the best in the state.

The first Mideastern Wisconsin Open was held in Combined Locks in 1965. The Combined Locks Horseshoe Club was organized in 1967 and Jerry served as its first secretary. Also in 1967, he was involved in the chartering of a State Association affiliated with the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association. The first NHPA sanctioned State Tournament in Wisconsin was held in Combined Locks on July 22 and 23, 1967. Other State Tournaments at Combined Locks were held in 1969, when women first pitched in State for another division, 1973 when juniors were first included, 1976 and 1979.

In 1976 he was the recipient of a Special Area Award at the Red Smith All-Sports Award Banquet in Appleton.

He and his wife Rosemary, have been married since June 22, 1957 and are the parents of four children; Debbie, Steve, Jay and Amy.
