It looks like we have made it through another winter. With that comes the WHPA spring meeting. It is Saturday April 8th at IPM. I hope to see you there. At the fall meeting it was brought up that we should look at options for the large discrepancy in the Women's championship class. We have looked at multiple options including having more move ups from class A, using a handicap system, having no move ups, and having a split championship class. They all have some pros and cons. One option that was submitted by Jeff Secord generated much discussion. We decided it was worth showing to get some feedback from members.

The Women's Championship Preliminary round will include the top 8 entries and be a 4-player single round robin with 40-shoe games set up as two groups as illustrated in the charts below. This preliminary round robin would be scheduled at the normal Championship class time to determine which players compete in the Championship Class and Class A.

Group 1 (courts 1-2)	
1	Defending Champion
2	3rd highest entering average
3	4th highest entering average
4	7th highest entering average

Group 2 (courts 3-4)	
1	Highest entering average
2	2nd highest entering average
3	5th highest entering average
4	6th highest entering average

The results of this preliminary round robin would determine Championship Class and Class A participants immediately after this 3-game preliminary round robin is completed. Seeding would be as follows for the next round robin to begin as soon as seeding is announced:

Championship Class (courts 1-2)	
*1	Winner of either group (higher average is 1st)
2	Winner of either group (lower average is 2nd)
3	Highest average among nonwinners from prelim games from either group
4	2nd highest average among nonwinners from prelim games from either group

Class A (courts 3-4)	
1	Players that did not qualify for the Championship Class would be seeded in ringer % order (highest to lowest) based on performance in the preliminary round robin
2

- Defending Champion would become #1 Seed provided she meets the criteria to be eligible for 1 of the 4 positions. Championship Class plays a 4 player single round robin with 40 point games. Winner becomes State Champion. Winner and runner up receive trophies.
- Class A plays 4 player single round robin 40 shoe games. Winner becomes Class Champion. Winner and runner up receive trophies.
- Ties in Final Standings for 1st place will result in a playoff per State Tournament Rules. All other ties would be broken by ringer percentage for the entire day's games (all 6 games).

Pitcher of the Year (POY) Update

At this point in the 2017 horseshoe pitching season we have 158 members earning points for the prestigious Pitcher of the Year (POY) award announced at the State Tournament Hall of Fame Ceremony. WHPA members earn points several ways: by attending the Spring and Fall WHPA meetings or by placing 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in WHPA sanctioned open tournaments. 15 points are earned by attending the meetings or placing 1st in tournament play. 10 points are earned for placing 2nd with 5 points for placing 3rd. The POY Award season runs from August 2016 – July 2017. The end of year published average in Issue 1 of the WHPA determines which Division a person is placed. Division A includes averages greater than 45%; Division B - averages between 30% and 44.99%; Division C - averages less than 29.99%.

All of the Divisions are close with 19 of the 44 possible events recorded. The following pitchers are the top 5 in each division – alphabetical order: Division A – Glenn Bogenschneider, Bun Carley, Bruce McLinn, John Meyer, Leo Richter; Division B – Russ Brockway, Dobie Dutweiller, Al Holloway, Rudy Van Fleet, Rick Weller; Division C – Tammy Newkirk, Cliff Shave, Tom Steinke, Mary Thompson, Ed Wheeler.

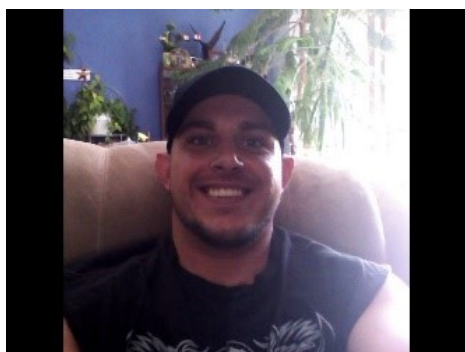
