

When horseshoe pitchers include a pencil in their gear, they begin to enter the ranks of Organized Horseshoes, the NHPA. Our NHPA elects to keep averages based upon a pitcher's potential, the level at what one might expect to pitch on a good day. It has been regulated to be the top three in the last year or ten events. The method results in an inflated average. The redeeming factor is it allows for bad days to be considered throwouts. Like it or not, it does provide a con-

stant, even form for use in seeding tournament classes. True average, meaning an over -all average, as kept by bowlers, is reflected fairly accurately in league. The number shown as a sanctioned league average on a pitcher's NHPA "stat search" is close to an over-all or, true, average. It is the level one should attempt to attain or excel when pitching a game, or a tournament. Try to beat yourself.

Just remember, pitching over 30% is above average, in the 20's, maybe still learning, and 50% or better is top ten percent of all NHPA pitchers.





When Secord was the Final Word

Some years before this newsletter, about 1980, the rule was for the State Secretary to apprise all members by mail of the forthcoming WHPA spring meeting time and place. John Secord would dress the letter up a little with added information such as the State Schedule and a short list of the top Pitchers, all men.

Support Horseshoes. Enter Tournaments. Bring Friends. Let's Make 2013 Even Better!!

The schedule listed the date, the place, the number of pits, and whether sand or clay. There were as many as a half dozen or so tourneys on the list. No tournaments were sanctioned, State Tournament only partially, but did play by Secord's rules using the State Average that he kept. If you ask him, he'll tell you about the days when pitchers would sandbag using "kitchen table" averages for entry. He grew tired of the same guys winning every year. Secord started keeping track and was given the job as State Secretary and has had it ever since.
