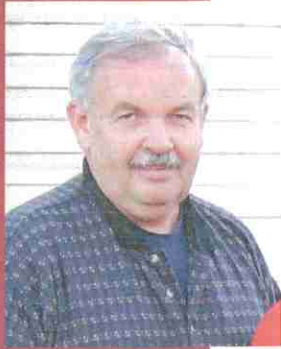

Fourman is the guy with “dry wit and never forgets a story told.” He finished his class in 14<sup>th</sup> place. Back home, as he runs his own construction crew.

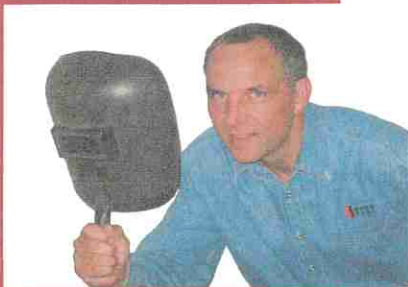
Johnson, an hourly laborer, is the youngest guy in this quintet. Watch for Davey to take his game to the highest level in coming years.

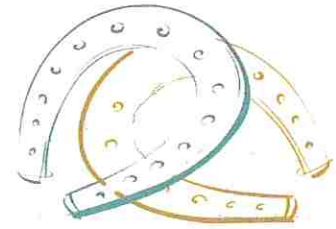

## Player of the Year Update

2011 can be a year of success, challenges, excitement, changes, and progress. After looking over the year end averages and noting the POY division guidelines, it makes sense to adjust the divisions to make the award accessible to more pitchers. There will continue to be three Divisions: A, B, C. The division separations will be adjusted to Division A- averages greater than 40%; Division B - averages between 25% and 39.99%; Division C- averages below 24.99 %.

There are over 400 WHPA members. With these separations, about 20% of our pitchers fall into division A; 43% in Division B; and 37% in Division C. points are earned by placing 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, or 3<sup>rd</sup> in a WHPA sanctioned tournament. At this time, seventeen events have been entered for the 2011 award. Competition in Division A is tight, with the top five within 20 points of each other. In alphabetical order these pitchers are **Pam Aiken, John Garvan, Ray Groskinsky, Randy Rein,** and **Mark Stevens.** Division B is also very close with the top four pitchers **Rich Hardt, Tony Scrima, Dave Volz,** and **Ed Wheeler.** There are nine pitchers tied for the fifth spot. Division C is equally tight with **Kevin Aarstad, Mel Cook, Jimmy Paulson, Linda Roeber** and **Tom Steinke** the top five.

It is early in the season. There are generally between 40 and 45 events used to determine the POY winners, so there is lots of time to participate in tourneys around the state and win this prestigious award.
