WHPA FALL MEETING REPORT

The 2007 WHPA State Fall Meeting was called to order by WHPA President Tom Steinke at 1pm at the Delton Sportsman Club with 41 members present. WHPA Chaplain Ken Heinritz started the meeting off with an opening prayer before officers began giving their reports.

John Secord, WHPA Secretary/ Treasurer, read minutes from the last meeting, then reported the WHPA's bank balance as of October 27, 2007 is \$2,266.13.

Jane Smith, WHPA 1st Vice President, presented awards to the clubs that participated in the Club competition during the State Tournament. See page 4 for full results.

Terry Sternberg, WHPA 2nd Vice President, thanked the Deansville and Sandbagger clubs for their splendid presentation of the past State Tournament. He then gave the floor to Randy Rein, director of the 2008 State Tournament. The traditional tournament book will be available carlier this year so pitchers can take advantage of coupons. Hard-shell camping will be allowed in the parking lot of the indoor facility. Look for a pancake feed hosted by the local Lion's Club. Raffle tickets are already available for an authenticated Brett Favre-autographed football, which was passed around at the meeting. Rein also announced that the arena is available for a modest rental fee to any other horseshoe club and it will house the 18 courts familiar to the tournaments hosted in Wausau. See

page 6 for more on the 2008 State tournament.

Sonia Cook, WHPA 3rd Vice President, reported that the Junior Scholarship fund raised \$740 this year and is accepting donations for next year's raffle.

Lorraine Sternberg, NPHA 3rd Vice President, just got back from the National club team tournament at the new Hall of Fame facility in Missouri, and she could not say enough about it; it must be seen to be truly appreciated. Four teams from Wisconsin did see it, two from Beloit and one each from Combined Locks and Kenosha. Next year's national club team tournament will be at the same location.

Dick Hansen, NHPA Secretary/ Treasurer, announced that the 2008 World Tournament will be earlier this year, July 7-19, meaning an earlier entry deadline as well. The tournament will be conducted on the fairgrounds in the heart of York, PA. The order of various pitching divisions should be approximately the same as other years. The setup is said to be one of the best Hansen has ever seen, comparable to the 1991 Biloxi, Mississippi World Tournament. Lodging should not be a problem in this city the size of Madison.

After the meeting officially adjourned, Hansen showed a tape of scenes taken at the HOF building in Missouri. See page 13 for a story on the Grand Opening of the NHPF Hall of Fame facility.

Ken Jaeger, NHPA Regional Director, congratulated Randy Rein on his efforts producing a new court layout in River Park of Mosinee, WI. There are only four courts, but the full walkways cater to all divisions.

On court sanctioning, the latest word is that all courts previously sanctioned prior to 2007 are grandfathered as conditionally sanctioned today, but the assessment forms for all court layouts are still required and to be submitted to Jaeger as soon as possible.

Tom Steinke, WHPA President, reminded members that 2008 is a bylaw-change year. Be prepared! Send your proposed changes in writing and early.

State 2009 Bids

Two clubs bid on the 2009
State tournament: Platteville and
Beloit. Mark Mauthe made the
pitch for the Platteville and
Arena clubs to co-host at Platteville. Mouse Beckius, President of the Beloit club, made his
bid and said they are always
ready to host another State tournament.

Probably based on the acceptance of the 2004 Platteville State and the recent success of the Sandbaggers in Arena, the vote went in favor of Platteville, 16 to 15.

Elections

Running unopposed, Tom Steinke, John Secord and Terry Sternberg were re-accepted to their present offices by acclimation.

Other Business

Your Agent, Jim Haupt, made a bid to promote the '08 State and all others to come. This year, the Newsletter is offering space to the organizers for ongoing reports. He also created a season-long poster to be hung everywhere a shoc may be pitched. The poster is available online for all to copy. He also made a suggestion to change the entry requirement from three sanctioned events to two, an idea that was not well-received. Instead of additional promotional support from the members, it was stated that the reduction of tournaments required should be submitted as a bylaw change, effectively ending all discussion of the idea.

Penny Steinke wrote a book! It's called *The ABC's of Horseshoes*, and is principally aimed at youth but a very nice presentation for any reader. Copies available from Penny directly at \$15 for soft cover, \$20 for hardcover. Hansen offered to buy 100 copies on the spot.

Ken Heinritz suggested that Pam Aiken should get a round of applause for her production of the Newsletter following the State tournament. She was quick to thank Jim Haupt and Jane Smith for their hard work, along with Jimmy Paulson for

engineering the issue and the **Beloit HSC** for sponsoring his work. Aiken also stated that cost has become an issue for the Newsletter and asked for any advertisers to publish their card, similar to **Chet Hermansen**.

At various points during the meeting, the life of the Newsletter was also discussed. For instance, once again the Newsletter was said to be necessary to all pitchers and the subscription cost could be included in the state dues. As a compromise, Ed Wheeler proposed

that each new member receive one complimentary copy, sponsored by the WHPA for a price of \$2. Members agreed and the motion was passed.

Kevin Brekke has been sorting various lists to determine a better way to make the *Pitcher of the Year* award. A fourth category was suggested but not accepted. For the present, the parameters will remain the same. Regardless, Brekke stands by to advise, based on his relentless study of the facts from NATSTATS.

Edie McKinney has produced a form to assist anyone nominating a member to the WHPA Hall of Fame. The form is available from Edie, in this Newsletter on page 15, and online. She asks that nominations be submitted by February 1, 2008.

At 3pm, the meeting was adjourned. Ω



The individual record is updated normally on the first and third week of the month, so is apt to be behind by a week or two.


World Tournament Accomplishments




impressed he was of the site and the building. The dedication ended with the ribbon cutting at the entrance of the new building.

BEHIND THE MASK

WITH KEN HEINRITZ



Have you ever met a horse-shoe pitching legend? I believe I have: Idaho native **Don Titcomb**. Each morning at the World tournament, horseshoe pitchers had the opportunity to take in history, as told by this 82 year old. Don has pitched horseshoes for 70 years of his life, and a fine pitcher he was in his prime, winning the World Title in 1960. He finished runner up in 1958 and 1959.

Winning a World title takes more than the ability to throw ringers. It takes physical endurance, mental temperament, some luck in the form of breaks and an absolute refusal to yield to pressure. It took Don six hours of pitching each day for six consecutive days to win the tournament. That's 2,878 shoes and 2,443 ringers for an 85% average. He assured me that he has a record that will never be broken. In a game during one stretch, he threw 105 ringers out of 108 shoes pitched. I too agree that these astounding numbers will never be matched.

No doubt some of you are thinking of our current great Alan Francis. Surely it's possible for him to conquer, maybe pitching solo! But in a World Championship game, it takes two men pitching at a 97% clip in the same game. By comparison, Alan's longest match in the 2007 World Tournament was against Walter Ray Williams Jr., where he threw only 54 shoes.

According to the <u>American Heritage Dictionary</u>, a legend is "a person who achieves legendary fame." Don, in my book, has reached the level of a legend.

I leave you with a thought about one who is supremely greater than Don:

> "For at just the right time Christ will be revealed from heaven by the blessed and only almighty God, the King of all kings and Lord of all lords."
