the WHPA's rich history of horseshoe pitchers, horseshoes, tournaments, and all other horseshoe related history.


Paul Wiese grew up on a dairy farm outside of Augusta, WI and is the oldest of 4 children. He's happily married to his wife Korinne and they have 4 children, 2 boys and 2 girls. All but his 4 yr old pitch in the Eau Claire Horseshoe Club's sanction league on Tuesday evenings. Paul recalls pitching shoes in his backyard at a very young age. His Dad had a permanent sand court set up with lights for playing after dark. At age 12, his dad had him start pitching on his non-sanction league at Keller Park in Fall Creek, WI. He's pitched in the Keller Park league all but 9 years since he started in 1992. Paul began pitching in

the Eau Claire Club in 2005 where he was recognized as Rookie of the Year. He's also competed in the WI State Tournament the following years: 06', 08', and 18'.

When it comes to the horseshoe pitcher's tools of the trade, Paul comes well prepared. In 2017 he started collecting horseshoes and now owns nearly 200 pairs. Most of them are discontinued modern horseshoes but he also owns several hookless shoes as well. The majority of the collection is made up of Diamond brand and Imperial/ Thoroughbred horseshoes.

As a collector, Paul doesn't intend to store his horseshoes in a box but rather share them with the world. For everyone on Facebook, there's a new horseshoe group you will want to join. Paul recently started a Facebook group called: *The Horseshoe: A Pictoral History*. Paul created the group to share photos of horseshoes both old and new as well as the history behind them. His goal is to get photos of as many horseshoes in the pitching world as possible. There are many horseshoes out there that have been long forgotten and others that people have never seen. He wants to preserve as much of that aspect of the history that he can.

When Paul isn't pitching horseshoes with his family or searching the internet for his next pair of horseshoes you'll find him hunting, fishing or enjoying a great game of dartball. It's a true pleasure to have Paul, Korinne and their children as part of our WHPA family. I look forward to seeing you on the courts this year my friend.
