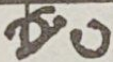

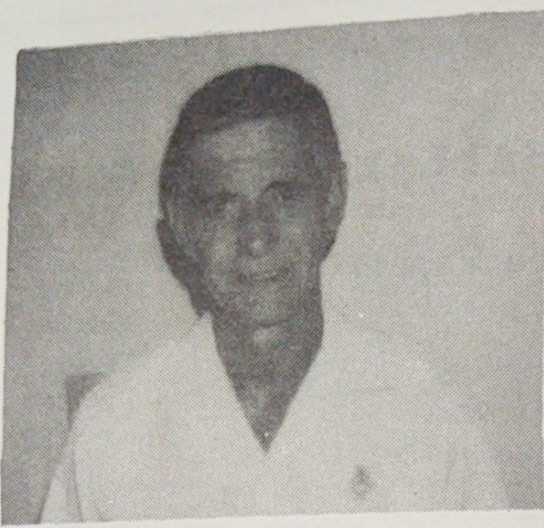

RAY SPECHT

In 1953 Ray Specht became interested in horseshoe pitching and joined the Marshfield Horseshoe League. By 1957 he had improved until he was one of the better pitchers in the Marshfield area.

Ray encouraged square dancers in the area to become involved in pitching shoes and held tournaments at Square Dance Camporees in 1962 through 1965.

After a head-on collision in 1966, he was hospitalized for over five weeks and told he would never walk or use his right arm again. Through therapy, of which horseshoes was a part, he regained the use of his arm and legs. Ray, with his son-in-law as partner, were league champions in 1974 and 1977 and second place winners in 1973, 1975, and 1976. Each year Ray lead the league with the highest ringer percentage.

Upon retiring in 1980 he formed a boys' Junior League and spent two afternoons a week instructing and supervising them. In 1982 he was instrumental in starting an Old

Timers Day League, consisting of eight men, over 62 and retired. In 1985, working with a day care center, he spent one afternoon a week with the children seven years and over, teaching them the art of pitching horseshoes and also how to keep score.

Through all these years he was a dedicated pitcher and participated in two leagues each year. He served as an officer or director over all the years and has given his full support to the club and worked hard to make a success of Marshfield Open Tournaments and also the State Tournament in 1984.

He was not active in 1986 because of heart surgery but is back in 1987, pitching in two leagues.

Prior to Ray's retirement at age 62, he was employed by Mid-State Truck Service, Inc., a GMC and IHC truck dealership. His hobbies are horseshoe, bowling, fishing, reading, and woodworking.

Ray, who will be 70 in November, writes, "I have enjoyed 48 years of married life with one of the most lovely and wonderful women in the world." They are the proud parents of five daughters and they have eleven grandchildren.

The Wisconsin Horseshoe Pitchers Association is pleased to give this 1987 Hall-of-Fame award to one who has unselfishly dedicated so many years for the benefit of the sport of horseshoe pitching.



SUSIE PRITZLAFF

Susie Pritzlaff was an avid horseshoe pitcher in the years 1972 to 1979. She was Class A champion at Germantown and Sussex. She had a high game of 74% and a tournament high of 50%. However, Susie will not be remembered for her pitching ability as much as she will be remembered for what she has done for the sport of horseshoe in Germantown and Wisconsin.

When Susie decided to retire from pitching, she not only did not drift away from the horseshoe scene, she accelerated her support of the sport. Her four sons, as well as husband Ron, have been part of the horseshoe program. Two of her sons, Rick and Bret, along with Ron, are still very active. There is no doubt that Susie, through her interest, support and encouragement, played a large part in the successes and honors accumulated by the boys over the years.

Susie was club secretary of the Goldendale Club for a few years. She has been a Wiscon-

sin delegate to the NHPA convention nine times. She has been in charge of the WHPA scrap book for over four years and has done an admirable job in keeping up with current events and finding missing information of by-gone years.

The Hall of Fame display at the Pitchin' Palace is there because of Susie's initiative and she has assumed responsibility for its maintenance.

Susie's lasting interest in horseshoe pitching was undoubtedly sparked by her father, Ed Wing. She is known as the GO of Goldendale and is always in the background ready to be of assistance with the many club activities. She has influence not only in Germantown, but in Wisconsin and nationally, as well, making it her business to correspond with officers of the NHPA. **The Horseshoe Pitcher's News Digest** of March, 1985, features Susie in an article titled "Ask Susie!" by Glen Portt.

Many of us feel that Susie's greatest accomplishment to date, at least rating equal status with the Hall of Fame display, is the founding of the WHNL (Wisconsin Horseshoe Newsletter). As editor she is doing an impressive job.

Susie is an extremely capable and efficient person with a very quiet and unassuming manner. The Wisconsin Horseshoe Pitchers Association is very happy to present this 1987 Hall of Fame award to one who has done so much for the sport of horseshoe pitching and who continues to give so unselfishly of herself.

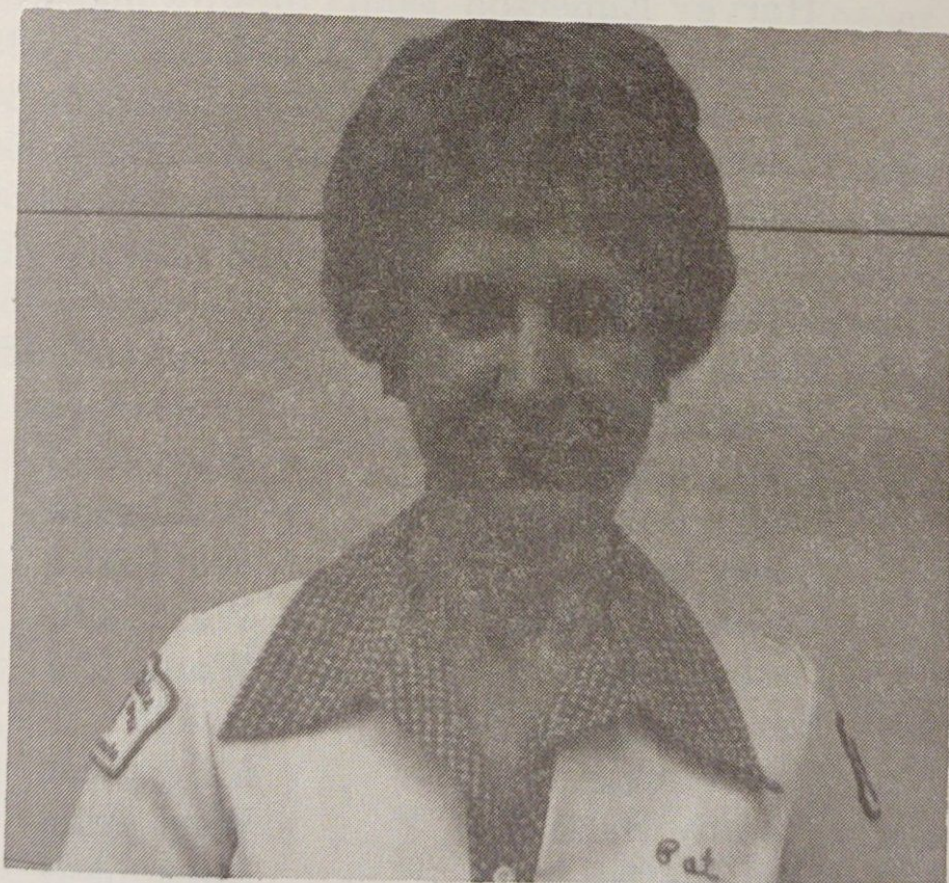

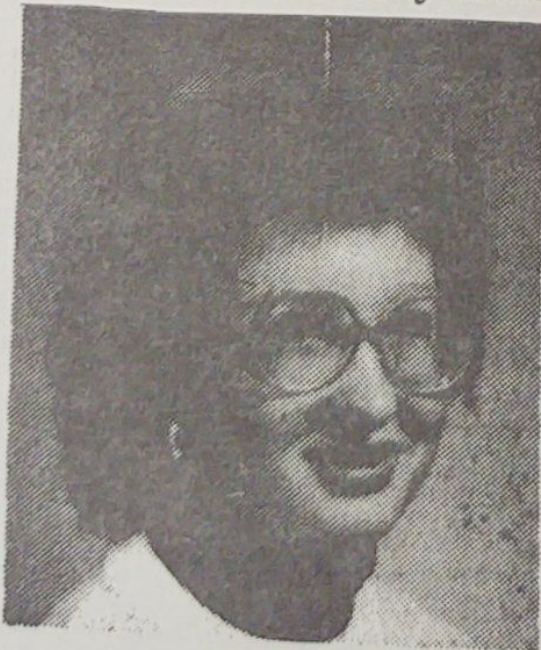

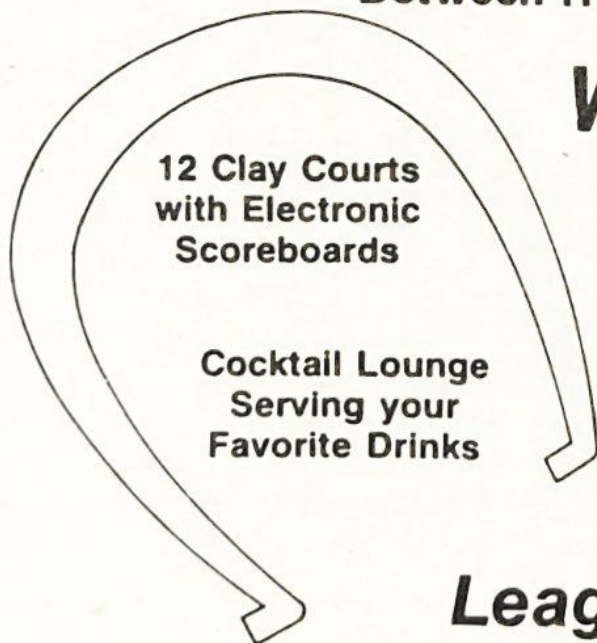
