# Charles "Casey" Jones Dead at age 84

Casey Jones, Wisconsin's finest horseshoe pitcher passed away Nov 4, 2003. He was just short of 85 years. Had been in poor health and confined to the Greenville Health and Rehabilitation Center of Plymouth, WI for the past 16 months suffering with Parkinson's disease.

He was listed as Charles Jones In his first world tournament in 1935 where he placed 6th pitching 72.7%.

While he was still a youngster a bystander at one of his expositions urged him on calling out, "Come on Casey." Whether the association was made to "Casey at Bat," or to the famous train engineer, the nick name stuck. By special ruling he was allowed to pitch that year in the men's open class in the Wisconsin state

tournament. It was the year of his first state title at the age of 17. He went on to earn 16 state titles in the next 26 years. It has yet to determined whether Jones actually entered the state competition every one of those years.

Glenn Portt, former NHPA president and respected author calls Casey, one of the greatest pitchers ever but he never won a world title. Yes, although a member of the big three, Ted Allen, Fernando Isais, and Casey, the best he could do was runner up four times. His strongest competitor he said was Fernando Isais.

Casey allowed that he could have easily won in 1946, 47, and 48. "It was a matter of just one game. When the chips were down Allen and Isais came through always pitching 85% against me."

Casey married Mary Katzenski in 1943 while serving in the U.S. Navy during World War II. They made their home in Waukesha, WI. Mary was an avid bowler and served the NHPA as secretary 1951-1955.

Another year has passed. The World Tournament in Eau Claire is over. The committee did an excellent job organizing and overseeing the event.

Time to look ahead to 2004.

In the past year, the WHPA saw improvement in membership. Now it's time to keep them, and add some new ones. I believe that every current WHPA member knows someone who is borderline about joining the association. In most cases, it's not the \$17 that keeps people out. They believe they aren't good enough. I personally run into this situation year after year. Just this fall, a young guy started working at the same company I do. I didn't know him at first, but someone told him I was into horseshoes. He asked me if I knew where he could get some better horseshoes than the Double Diamonds he had. I had an old pair of Tournament Diamonds and a pair of Six Hix that I told him to use and let me know if he could tell the difference. When I saw him a month later, he said he didn't like sharing the horseshoes because his game had improved so much, giving him an advantage over his friends. When I started talking to him about tournaments, I found out that a group of six to eight guys plays matches every week from May through September, yet they didn't know a thing about the WHPA. I'm sure they are going to find the WHPA and try a tournament soon. Even if only two of them join at first, I'll bet that if they like it their friends will follow. It is time everyone explains the WHPA to prospective members face to face.

The average member's age is getting closer to 100 every year. We need youth in our membership. That is our future!

Casey said he had to make a living and quit horseshoes at 36 years of age although we have him winning the state in 1961 at age 43.

From the high school days until he was 36, Casey entered every world tournament. There were twelve tournaments over that twenty year span. He was runner-up four times, placed third four times, fourth once, sixth twice, and tenth, once.

At the Milwaukee World tournament in 1948 Casey set the record that would stand for twenty years—87.5% for an entire world tournament. Over all the twelve world events, Casey's world tournament pitching average stands at 81.07%

By that time Casey Jones made his mark on the bowling alleys. He owned his own lanes in Plymouth, WI after spending a few years at Random Lake

He rolled thirteen, 300 games and a record number, fourteen, 800 series.


At one time he carried a 233 average over 81 games while bowling on TV stations in Milwaukee and Green Bay.

Casey was also no stranger to the golf links attaining two holes in one.

Casey, a member of the American Bowling Congress was preceded in death by his son Charles Jr., and a daughter, Debbie Miller. He is survived by his wife, Mary, and two daughters Nancy Eisentraut and Peggy Weber.

In 1968 Casey Jones was among the first members inducted into the NHPA hall of Fame and became a charter member of the Wisconsin Horseshoe Pitchers Hall of Fame in 1976.

Wisconsin Horseshoe Pitchers will never forget the great Casey Jones.






Left to right; Tommy Bartlen, Casey Jones, Karras, Ted Allen, Fernando Isais.

## 2004 Proposed Bylaw Changes:

Add New Bylaw

Two NHPA tournament sanction numbers will be issued for each Wisconsin State Tournament competition: one for regular classes and a separate one for championship classes.

Reason:

This Bylaw change would allow players who move up to championship classes to retain separate averages for each day/class of play.

The World Tournament follows this same format.

Article V Section 1 B.a. Now reads

Games in all classes, except championship, shall be

based on a limited number of shoes and the number of shoes to be determined by the Executive Board. All championship classes to be forty (40) point games.

Change first sentence to read:

Games in all classes, except championship, shall be forty (40) shoes, if inclement weather is a factor, the number of shoes to be determined by the Executive Board.

Reason:

Fifty (50) shoe games is one of the biggest complaints at the State Tournament. It has been a request for several years to make the games forty (40) shoes. Entries in the State Tournament have been declining the past few years, maybe this little face lift is in the best interest of the State.

#### Down and Back

How many pitchers of today ever saw Casey Jones pitch? 1935, when he started his reign is 68 years ago!

Pitchers were turning in some top averages 70% - 80% but other numbers were not as great. Before WWII NHPA dues were 25 cents, membership varied from one to two thousand. A pitcher could consider himself lucky to pitch 3 - 4 tournaments per year. Any pitcher whose name may be remembered today was top flight. All tournament pitchers were top flight. If not they failed to qualify.

Actually I know three pitchers who pitched with Casey. Ralph Maylahn, is a year younger and pitched exhibitions when they were both very young. Bob Wilke was once a truck driver who arranged his schedule to pitch over his lunch-hour with young Casey who lived next door to the park horseshoe courts. Tommy Bartlen pitched often with Casey. In 1951 Bartlen and Casey turned in the highest W.T. qualifying scores. They tied with 524 points each of a possible 600.

So a couple years ago we were sitting in a restaurant when Mary Jones, Casey's wife, confided that when she met Casey she knew nothing of his association with the sport of horseshoes. When one considers that she later knew only the best horseshoe pitchers, this following episode seems possible. She said once she had heard their tour bus driver claimed to be a horseshoe pitcher with a 30% average. It surprised her. She was aghast that any person with such a modest average should even consider himself part of the sport.

My side of the table suddenly went dead.

Little known fact: Casey Jones had a friend in Waukesha that traveled with him to some tournaments. One time the two went as far as Ohio. Casey's partner's name was "Swamee" Scrima—sure Tony's dad.







#### WHPA Christmas Party
