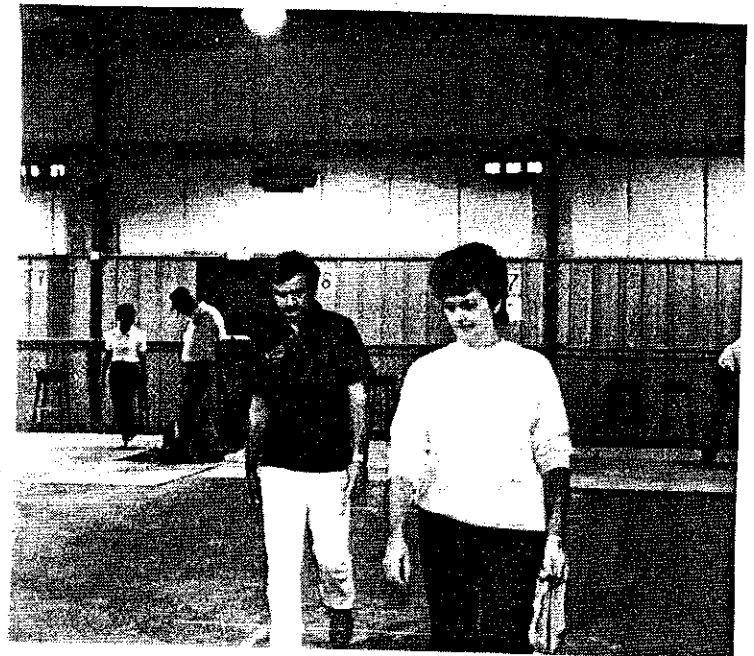

IN MEMORIAM

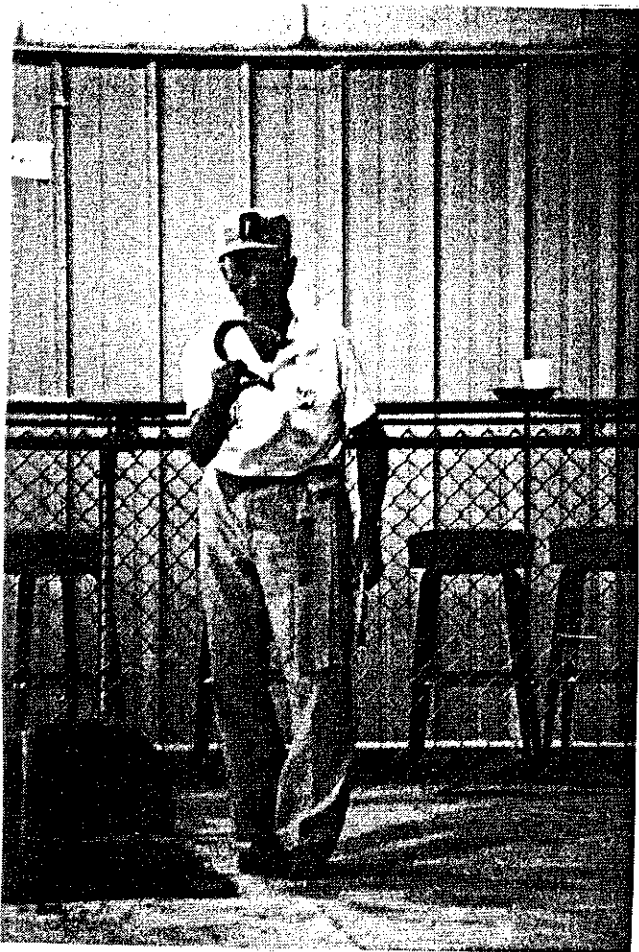
Donald "Buzz" Hendricks, 73 Benton, Wi died Saturday, November 29, 1986 at St. Joseph Mercy Health Center, Dubuque.

Born at Hazel Green, Wi, Don was a Benton resident for 38 years. He served with the army in Europe during World War II. He was past commander of the Cuba City American Legion Post. He was a member of the NHPA, WHPA and the Platteville Horseshoe Club. Surviving are his wife Dorothy, two sons, Terry of Madison and Tim of Benton, a daughter, Tamy of Torrence, California.

As a horseshoe pitcher he was an avid tournament competitor around the state winning the State Championship Class C title in 1982 and in 1983 he again won the State Championship in Class B.

RON PRITZLAFF RESIGNS

Ron Pritzlaff, Wisconsin Regional Director for the NHPA since 1983 will resign his commission at the end of 1986. Through his efforts we now have a NHPA sanctioned state tournament thereby dramatically increasing the number of NHPA cards in this state and it follows, the number of Wisconsin delegates to the National meeting. In addition to his ever-present NHPA promotional message he has often been heard expounding the value of court courtesy and how to effect it. Ron, husband of Susie (WHNL Editor) and father of Rick (WHPA President) and Bret (Class A pitcher) can hardly retire from the game but he will have more time to show his (NEW) 1961 Ford Galaxie, a collector's car. At Ron's recommendation the NHPA has appointed Jim Haupt, Milwaukee, new Regional Director for Wisconsin.



ROYCE WRUCKE

Happy Birthday Royce, congratulations, 85 years is a long time to be pitchin' shoes especially at tournament level.

Royce was born one door west of where he now lives on December 19, 1902 at Horicon, Wisconsin. It seems it took the next 17 years before he could find a pair of shoes and then they were the original thing: right off the horse. In his words... "It didn't take too long and we (he and his brother) got 2 sets of "boughten" shoes, sorta round ones, I still have them. In the 20's they had a league in Beaver Dam. So brother and I took care of that. In 1930 they had a tourney at the State Fair. Never won that as Casey Jones, Harvey Elmerson, Tommy Bartlen, Carl Pfeffer etc. were a little too tough for us. Lots of

fun though."

Rosella and Royce were married in Orange, California in 1931 and settled on the Horicon farm. They had three "wonderful boys;" Royce Jr. and John run the farm and Steve lives in Miami, Florida.

"I have about 100 trophies from California, North Dakota, Illinois, Wisconsin, Indiana, North Carolina, Penn. Ohio, Florida and Minnesota...the first trophy I got was at Eau Claire in 1968. What a celebration. Ha! Won 2 trophies at World Tourneys in the Senior division.

In 1952 I had a farm accident in which I lost the two middle fingers on my right hand, so had to learn all over again in horseshoes and bowling and did all right. So am very thankful to be able to participate in both sports again. I credit horseshoes to be a very healthful sport and it has been very kind to me.

My average in the 70's was about 55% - high game was 74.9%. Now that I'm slipping it's about 40%. I use Allen shoes - 1 1/2 turn and am right handed. Have been Vice-President of our State Association and various offices in local leagues."

Royce and Rosella live in Florida during the winter months where he competes in the Bradenton league and goes to 5 or 6 tourneys.

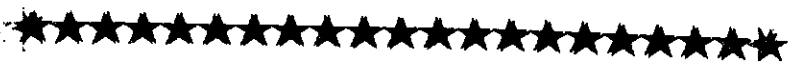



FROM THE DIGEST

Dear Mr. Cobb:

I would like to comment on the time frame Kevin Cone mentioned in his "Ringers Remembered" article.

Why do we pitchers bother keeping track of those errant shoes that do not wind up as ringers? We accomplish nothing by counting the shoe that doesn't get the job done. Close should only count with hand grenades! Ringers are the name of the game! Throw 2% or 92%, you are still trying only to make ringers. Counting only ringers is the ultimate solution to the time frame we are trying to solve. If we were to count ringers only as one point, a game could be a set number of shoes or points, count all ringers. Games would be much more on schedule, scorekeeping would be a dream come true. Judging would be a snap as only ringers would be in question. Spectators could look at the scoreboard and immediately know the game score and percentage each pitcher is hitting! No more asking, "Hey, scorekeeper, what did those two have for average?" I heard that question hundreds of times in many different tournaments. If we want the spectator and the money to become involved with our sport we must make a change.

We have a singles league which for a number of years has been using the count all ringers only method. Each pitcher keeps track of his ringers every four shoes on the board. Throwing fifty shoe games all pitchers know what they are throwing for average at all times. Very little bookkeeping, look at the scoreboards up and down the line and know what the other pitchers are throwing. Everyone knows their average for the game, the night for their improvement and for tournament average. The league is a real success usually with a waiting list to enter.

I have been fortunate to have pitched horseshoes in a few world tournaments with some great pitchers. I would love to live long enough to see these great ringer makers get on the national sport scene so the rest of the world can find out what we know

is the greatest sport going! Watching Walter Ray Williams Jr. make the big money knocking down the bowling pins is great. Watching the champ make ringers on national T.V. would be the greatest. Come on! Let's get this game modernized for everyone! Time is of the essence!

EDITOR'S COMMENT

This letter was written by Harvey Bilz of Janesville, printed in the National Horseshoe Pitchers Digest recently. We agree with Harvey. The cancellation system is holding back the future of this game as far as the reality of horseshoes being a spectator sport. The count all ringers game for the higher percentage pitchers in tournament play is the answer to a sport that has been held back long enough.

What we need is more people speaking out on this issue. Out-behind-the-barn days are long gone. For those of us who enjoy watching Walter Ray Williams Jr. bowling on T.V., think; how would it look if Walter Ray threw 4 strikes and his opponent also threw 4 strikes and no score on the scoreboard..... The shoe that isn't a ringer but is within six inches of the stake could stay in the game. The count all system is the answer. WHAT IS YOUR OPINION?

In existance for about eight years, we are located on Hy 24 between Muskego and Big Bend at the Muskego Moose Lodge. We pitch on ten sand courts and have been averaging about 40 men and 15 women. We run a handicap league every tuesday, May through August. Throughout the summer we try to get up match games with other leagues but havn't been too successful lately. One of our best players, Wayne Franzen, runs an open tournament every June and each year it seems to grow a little. We encourage our players to pitch in open tournaments around the state. The ones that do, seem to really enjoy it and come away better players for it.

On Tuesdays we charge \$3.50 per person. This pays for free beer or soda all night and each player may invite a guest. About once a month on horseshoe night we have a free cookout. Also from the \$3.50 we sponsor a family picnic in September. Each player may bring a guest and also their children. Games and prizes are always planned for the children.

Every February when the wind and snow is blowing and you are so bored you can't stand it, Wayne Franzen, runs a winter tournament. The pits are shoveled out; fresh sand put in; a big fire is built and everyone has a great time.

In March we run a bowling outing for all the horseshoe people. Each player may bring a guest. After bowling we have a get-together where once again all food and drink is paid for from \$3.50 per night.

We are proud of our horseshoe club. Anyone who wants to join is more than welcome.
