


What horseshoe pitchers do in their 'SPARE' time. Mark Mauthe / Jane Smith



Brief discussion of maintaining and increasing our membership ended with encouraging all to promote our game by word of mouth.

New Business: Russ Brockway was introduced as our new WHPA Historian taking over from John Meyer. Russ has a great collection of shoes pitched by WI champions and others from the NHPA. Check out his Facebook Page.

New Business: Election of officers - 1st VP, Jane Smith choosing not to run for reelection; 3rd VP, Sonia Cook, and Sec- Treas John Secord both planning to run for reelection. Notices for anyone wanting to run for an office must contact President Dobie Gutweiler and / or WHNL Director, Jane Smith with a written declaration by July 31 so the intent can be published in the August WHNL issue.

New Business: Dave Volz has researched a new WHPA email contact plan. This email list will be used only for WHPA business such as meeting cancellations, tournament requests for more pitchers, loss of friends, need for medical prayers, etc. It is easier to navigate and is planned to replace the Yahoo group. Emails on the sign-up sheet for this meeting will be used for this list.
