Please remember the State Meeting has been cancelled. At this time it has not been rescheduled, but I, or Dave Volz, will keep you all posted.



Behind the Mask ... With NHPA Chaplain Ken Heinritz

To my fellow horseshoe pitchers: at times like these we need a power packed Bible verse that when applied will bring great comfort. Make that two verses, Philippians 4:6-7 "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."

Your Horseshoe Average

Common questions and comments about horseshoe averages: How are averages calculated? Why do they only use your top 3 tournaments? In bowling they average all of your games for your average. Your year end average report doesn't represent the entire seasons pitching. My average wouldn't be that high if they averaged all of my tournaments.

This is the NHPA rule that the WHPA and all other Charters are required to follow. All Natstats average ringer percentages shall be based on the three (3) highest Nhpa sanctioned events pitched in the preceding twelve (12) months, or among the last ten (10) sanctioned events pitched during the same period, whichever occurs first. The Natstats average ringer percentage is calculated by dividing the total number of shoes by the total number of ringers pitched for those three (3) events. If a Sanctioned League ringer average is one of the three (3) highest NHPA sanctiond events, that Sanctioned League average shall be converted to an average that is based on four hundred (400) shoes.

As far as the bowling comparison, we all know the scoring differences, bonus points for spares and multiple strikes to come up with a game score versus ringers and close points to come up with a game score. The main difference is bowling averages are based on points not strikes where horseshoe averages are based on ringers not points. With that being said, they both do come up

2022 World Tournament Bid Results

It is with a heavy heart that I announce that Lansing, Michigan was awarded the 2022 NHPA World Tournament. The dates will be July 18 - 30. Being involved with the 2014 bid and the 2022 bid, both of them turned down, this one hurt the most as Stevens Point out shined all the other bids by far. Tom Coleman, the with a game average. The main difference is that in bowling your average is a league average in one establishment based on the all of the games in that season. If you bowl in more than one league, you use your highest league average to enter a tournament. In horseshoes your average is from multiple tournaments at different locations, some indoors, some outdoors, some on clay, some on sand, possibly windy, rainy, hot weather or maybe cold. Each of those tournaments are separate and your average is based on all of the games in each of those tournaments. To enter a tournament they use your best 3 for your entry average. There are also leagues in horseshoes and a league average can be used for one of your top 3 to determine your tournament average.

I'm not saying that I totally agree with the Natstats average being the best 3 of your last 10 tournaments or one year, it is an NHPA rule that has had much discussion over the past several years. But, unless there is a proposal to change it and it is passed by the delegates, this is the rule that we must abide by.

The year end average report that is published in the first issue of the WHPA newsletter is based on how WHPA members finished the prior pitching season. It shows the top 20 pitchers year end averages, who pitched in the most tournaments over the past year and the year end averages of all pitchers in 6 different Pitching Divisions. This report is from the first Natstats report of the new year. If you would like to view your past 12 month pitching record or someone else's, it is available on the NHPA website.

Featured Author Penny Steinke By, Edie McKinney Edie interviewed Penny in February regarding her writing, publishing and sharing her books and introducing her new book— Where is Horseshoe Hailey?

E- When did you first realize you wanted to be a writer? P- Years ago, I wanted to share my favorite sport with my students. I searched around and found out that there were no children's books about horseshoes. This is where my story begins. Teaching early childhood, I thought best to create an alphabet book that included facts about horseshoes. Things have changed since I published my first book, The ABC's of Horseshoes. When I got the bug to create more books, I found an easier and free way to publish my books.

E- How long does it take you to write a book?

P- That's hard to answer since being an author is a hobby at this point, so my full-time work is teaching children. Whenever I have an idea I try and jot it down. When I get time to write and craft, I take my ideas and begin by writing. I like to type my words on the computer and then print the pages. Next, I craft the pictures using a variety of art media like photographs, stamps, clip art, etc. Lastly, I scan the pages and save them as a PDF file. E- How do you get books published?

P- Amazon has a wonderful, free, print-on-demand program to publish books. It took some trial and error, but I figured it out. Having the site be print-on-demand is perfect. When I published my first book, I had to pay a lot of money for others to put together the files to be able to print and then I also had to buy a bunch of copies up front. Now, using Amazon, I can just buy copies of my books when I need some and others can also find them to purchase on Amazon.

E- Where do you get your ideas for your books? P- I wanted to create books that would do two things. One thing was to be able to teach my students some kindergarten concepts whether it be literacy, math, or science. The second goal was to help promote the sport of horseshoes. It will hopefully get the word out there about horseshoes and help promote the organized sport. Publishing books gives me the opportunity to tell children more about horseshoes and answer their questions. Others can share what their experiences are with horse-

shoes.

E- When did you write your first book?

P- 2007

E- What are your other hobbies?

P- I like to create art. I like to paint and make things. I like to read books. My favorite books are mysteries and true crime. I enjoy movies and watching sports, especially the Packers, Brewers and Bucks.

E- How many books have you written?

P- Eight. The ABC's of Horseshoes, Horseshoe Counting Book, Horseshoe Pattern Book, Horseshoe Shape Book, The ABC's of Horseshoes 2nd Edition, Where Did My Teacher Go?, When You Have to Say Goodbye..., and Where is Horseshoe Hailey?

E- Which is your favorite?

P- It's hard to pick my favorite because I am happy with all of them. Of course, my horseshoe books are my favorite. I am really happy with how *The ABC's of Horseshoes* 2^{nd} *Edition* turned out. I was able to use parts of what I created years ago and then add to it and make it even better.

I had a liver transplant in 2016 and I wrote a book for my students to try to explain about why I was gone and what I was going through. I am glad that I was able to share my experiences through this book, Where Did My Teacher Go?

Losing my mom in 2018 evoked many feelings. One way I dealt with my grief was to write a book about it. I created *When You Have to Say Good-bye...* It was hard to write, but therapeutic. I think my mom would be proud of it.

My latest book, Where is Horseshoe Hailey? is another horseshoe book in my math series, featuring my character Horseshoe Hailey. It teaches about ordinal numbers, counting and directionality. This is a fun concept for kids to learn about. In the book, kids have to describe where they see Horseshoe Hailey in relation to different shapes.

E- Do you have any adult books?

P- My goal is to write an adult book one day. When I published my first book, people asked me, "When are you going to write a book about how to throw horse-shoes?" While I don't know if this will be the exact top-ic, I would like to write an adult book about my experiences especially my evolving horseshoe game.
