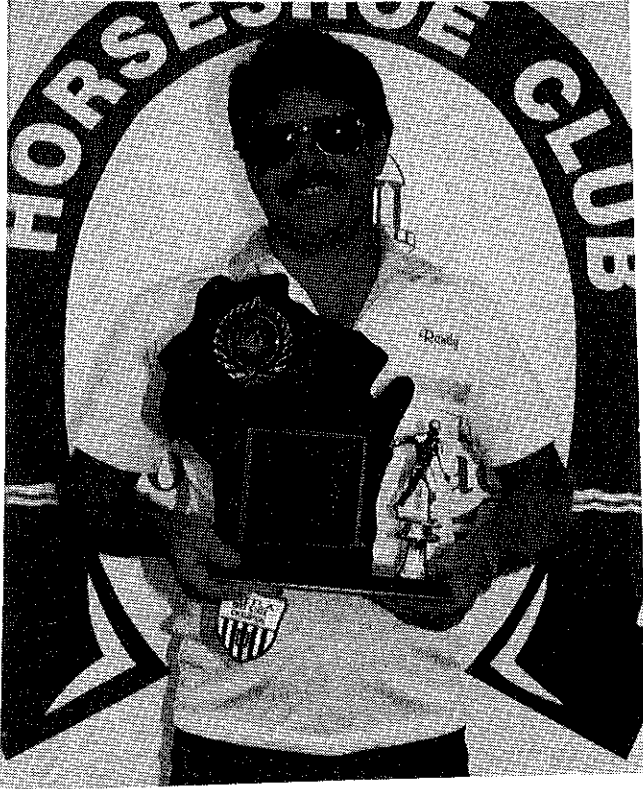

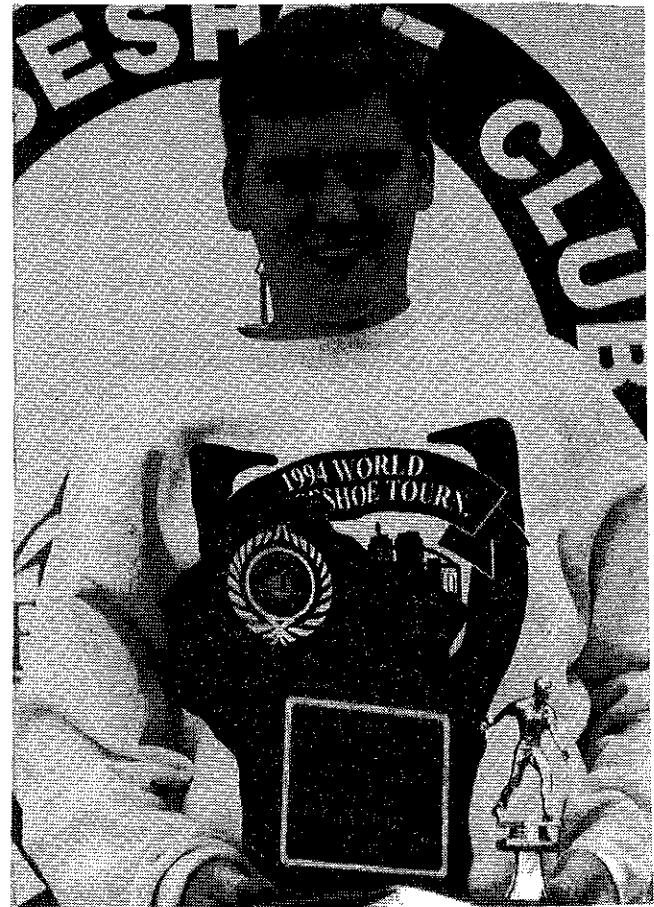

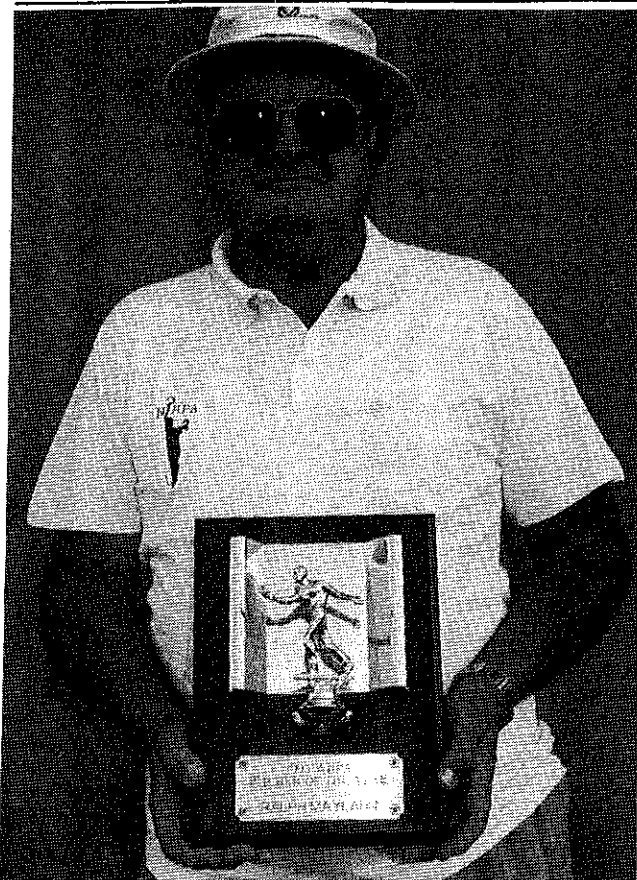

Ralph pitched in 13 tournaments, first place in 6, second or third in 5 of them. Of his 212 points, almost half came from Beloit tournaments. Maylahn, defending his Senior title from last year, was again successful this year. He is also a WHPA Hall of Fame member.

The trip to this year's State Tournament was down a not so beaten but very well-marked path through the back of the Fond du Lac Fairgrounds. The drive was a little bumpy but it was nice to be able to park by the courts. This year in FDL, the tournament was divided from the annual car show by a snow fence. There were more car enthusiasts hanging over this fence than there were heifers at the fence in Brothertown. A gate in the fence soon attracted new horseshoe spectators to the courts. Saturday afternoon was a typical day in Fond du Lac - sunshine and a 15 MPH wind with even stronger gusts, but no one gave up on their game. For some unexplainable reason, that famous Fond du Lac wind was no where to speak of on Sunday. It was great horseshoe pitching weather for most of the weekend with Saturday's wind being the only complaint to hear of. The Fond du Lac Club was a great host for State Tournament, if I do say so myself. Special thanks to all of those helpers that were there to do the "grunt" work that is rarely noticed until it's not done. The tournament would not have looked as polished as it did without the hard work and long hours of Jane Meier, club president. Along with all of her other responsibilities, she organized another plentiful group of scorekeepers for the weekend. It is a rare sight to see more scorers than courts for most of a tournament.

So, next year Eau Claire will host the big event. If there is anything that you would like to see improved over this year's State Tournament or if there is anything you would like left alone, come to the Fall and/or Spring Meetings to voice your opinion or just cast your vote. This is every members' tournament so we all have a voice about how it should be conducted.

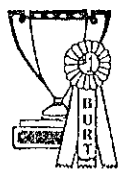



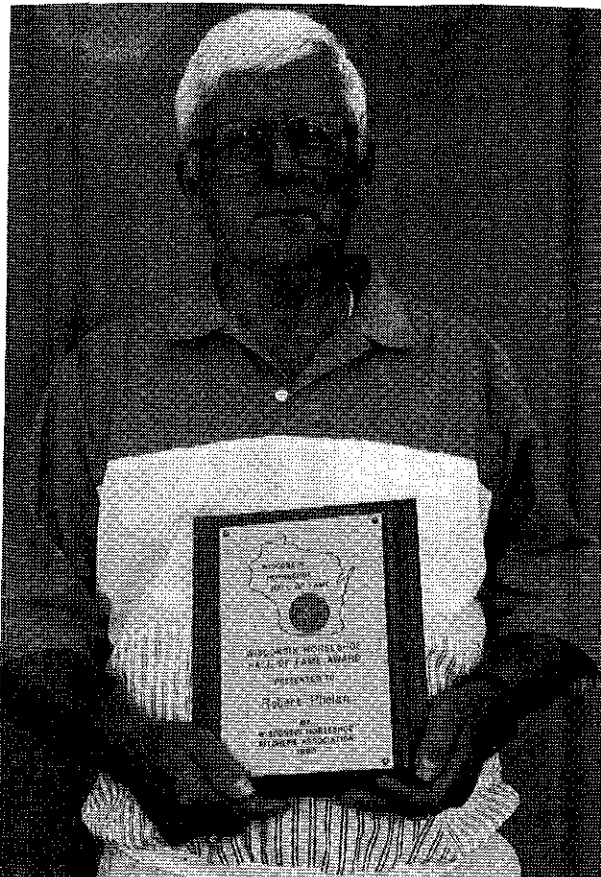

BOB PHELAN STARTED PITCHING HORSESHOES IN 1949 WHEN HE WAS A STUDENT AT OSHKOSH TEACHERS COLLEGE. HE PITCHED IN LEAGUE AT GENE VANDEHEY'S AND JERRY KAMPS'S BAR QUITE A FEW YEARS. BOB PITCHED IN MANY TOURNAMENTS AROUND THE STATE AND WON MANY FIRSTS AND SECONDS.

BOB WAS ELECTED THE FIRST SECRETARY/TREASURER OF THE NEWLY FORMED WISCONSIN HORSESHOE PITCHERS ASSOCIATION IN 1967 AND HELD THAT POSITION UNTIL 1973. DURING THIS TIME HE WAS CO-HOST WITH NORB GOSENS FOR THE FIRST WINTER INDOOR TOURNAMENT AT KIMBERLY. THIS TOURNAMENT WAS HELD FOR MANY YEARS AND WAS SUCCESSFUL. PITCHERS FROM ALL OVER THE STATE AS FAR AS EAU CLAIRE, MILWAUKEE AND БЕЛОIT CAME TO CHASE THE WINTER BLUES AWAY.

BOB AND HIS WIFE JEANIE ARE LIVING IN THE APPLETON AREA. THEY HAVE SEVEN CHILDREN (SIX LIVING) AND SEVEN GRANDCHILDREN. RETIRED AFTER 42 YEARS AS A SCIENTIST FOR KIMBERLY CLARK CORPORATION, BOB ENJOYS HOBBIES SUCH AS GOLF, BOWLING AND WOODWORKING.

DURING HIS YEARS IN HORSESHOES HE HAS MET MANY PEOPLE FROM ALL OVER THE STATE WHOM HE CONSIDERS FRIENDS.

Hill 1993 Michigan horseshoe champ



Raymond Hill captured the 1993 Michigan State Open Horseshoe Pitching champion in Adrian, Mich., over the past weekend. Hill added the state open crown to his two world titles and three runners-up in world competition.

The 74 year old Wakefield tosser took on all comers in his initial appearance in state competition.

Hill roared through his opponents, posting a perfect 12-0 mark and clipped the peg for a 72.5 percent ringer consistency.

He had the distinction of setting a single game record of 94.4 percent in ringers.

In his march to the Michigan horseshoe pitching crown, he out-pitched seven former state champions.

The new state champion has been tossing horseshoes in competition since the late 1960's, and really got serious about competing on all levels in the late 1980's and into the 1990's.

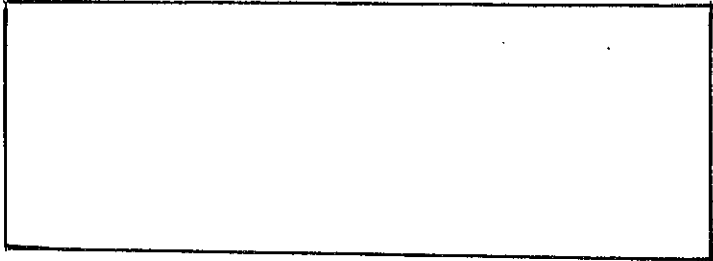

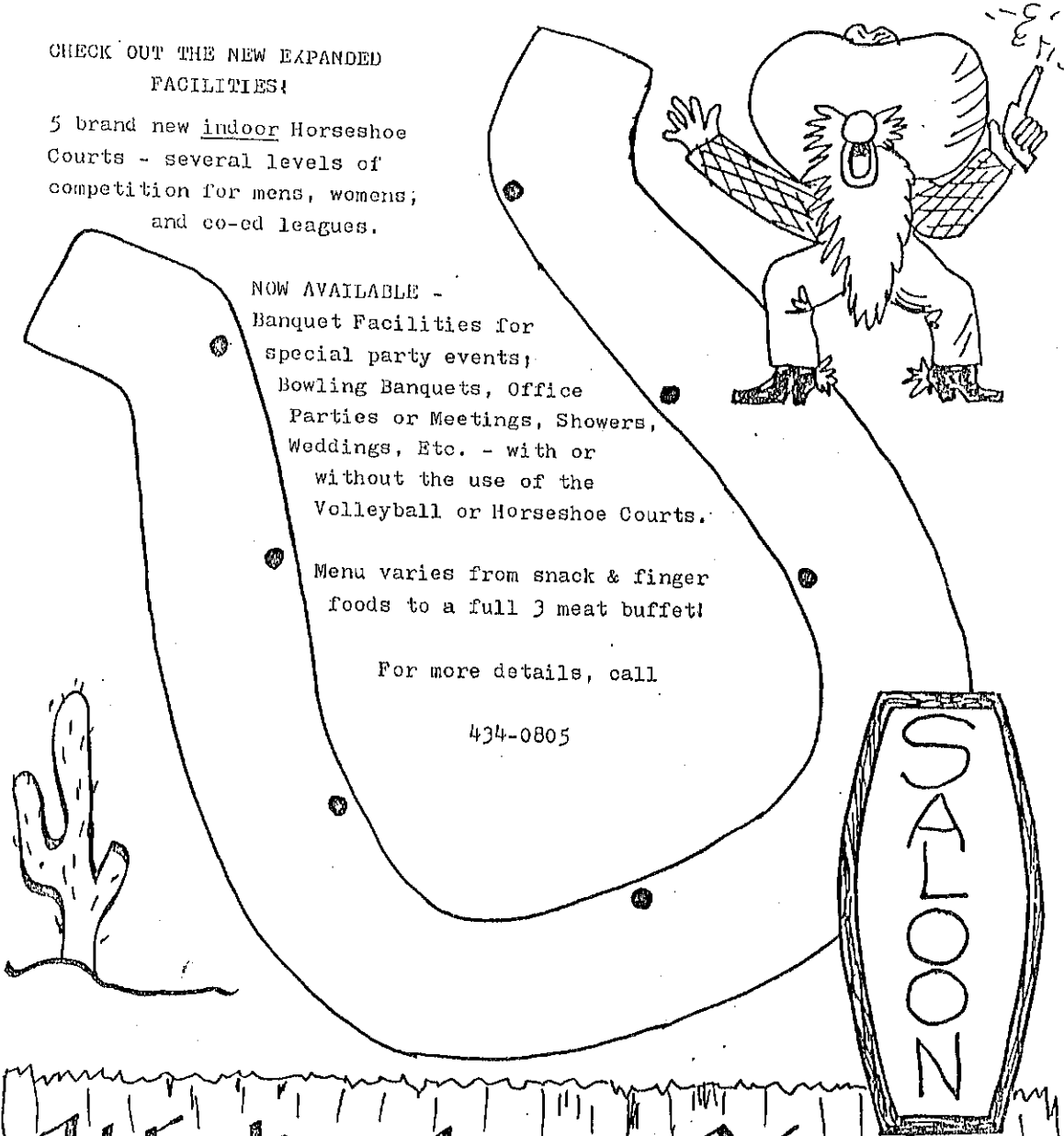
