

Why do you like horseshoe pitching? The people? The pitching? If you enjoy both of these, why not take your talent to the highest level . . . the World Tournament? The friends you make seem to be endless and it's the ultimate as far as pitching competition goes. Separated into 16 man classes, it's anyone's ball game to win. The bottom seeded individual has just as good of a chance to win as the top individual in most classes. For instance, when I look at the World Tournament schedule in the Mens division, I noticed 28 classes in a row (from C-I down to P-2) are separated by only 2 ringer % points from top to bottom . . . that's only I ringer in a 40 shoe game. You can't get any tighter. No telling who will win. And history tells us that in this tournament even if you pitch your entering average, you most likely will find your place among the top three.

For me, this tournament charges me up like no other. I really look forward to this. It's the pitching highlight every year by far. SENIOR OLYMPICS

Washington Park Horseshoe Club traditionally hosts their sport for Senior Olympics, following the State Tournament and conducted in Milwaukee as most of the other 22 sports offered.

It is possible to register online for any of the sports offered; wisconsinseniorolympics.org.

Horseshoe pitching seniors are placed in classes of six, pitching 20-shoe games scoring count-all. A one-hundred shoe count-all.

The count-all score effectively ranks all pitchers. Wins and losses may only effect tie scores.

Folks aged from 50 to 100 are invited with gold, silver, and bronze medals for winners of every age group. Lots of medals as the age group shifts every five years.

A T-shirt of the year and a competitors banquet is included along with those medals in all age classes.

NHPA rules apply, except.., ladies 75 yr and over are allowed to move up to a comfortable distance.

Archery, Badminton, Basketball, Bowling, Cycling, Lawn Bowling, Racquetball, Shuffleboard, Softball, Swimming, Table tennis, Track, Triathlon, VolleyBall, Road Race, walk or run, Pickelball, and Golf.

With that many sports venues there might be ,something besides shoes for you. Check it out. Say the horseshoe guy sent you.



A pitcher-profile by Jim Haupt

Former Wisconsin State Boys Horseshoe Champion, of 1997 and 2000, Dustin Dahl, used to be "Pudge," has jumped the river, now pitches competition shoes for his adopted state of Minnesota. We saw him last pitching the Team-World tournament wearing a Minnesota jersey. He's still just across the water from La-Crosse working as a bar manager who jumps the river weekly to pitch shoes with those Coulee people.

He became acquainted with horseshoes through his grandfather and dad at the young age of 14. Entering

his first tournament was undoubtedly his father, Jerry's idea. Dustin recalls that he was 15 years old, in the year 1996, pitching against opponents such as his brother, Barrent and Penny Steinke, coming away with 15%. Furthering his development under the tutelage of Dave Schorbahn, he came back the following year to win the state championship.

Problem was, he merely paved the way for Barrent to win the state title the next two years running before he, himself, won again in 2000. Together they earned the first place scholarship award money in the family four years. Some may also remember his middle brother Chris.

In his young life he has already pitched sixteen world tournaments placing fourth one time with 75% and feels that the pitchers of the world are family.

The promise of Scholarship Fund awards was not an incentive for Dustin but did provide a welcome bonus enjoyed by dad. Together with awards from world tournaments, expenses for the first year of college were covered.

College took him to nearby Winona State where among other studies, he gained a background in cooking, an aligned trade associated with his current profession as bar manager. Look him up when

next in his newly adopted country at the Winona VFW bar.

At age 32 he is definitely the envy of many pitchers, particularly those who have just moved up. Think of it, he has most of 40 years to continue pitching full distance, the backbone of horseshoes.

We, as pitchers and contributors to the WHPA Scholarship Fund, can point with pride to Dustin Dahl as our exemplar product. One of our Wisconsin junior boy champions who has hung on to continue pitching as a 40 footer. Moreover, we need more guys like Dustin, guys who know what is to tap a beer in-between shoes.

Phil-Wahl Open, Holmen, WI

We had our first annual Phil-Wahl Open singles horseshoe tournament at Halfway Creek city park in Holmen, WI Saturday, June 21, 2014. We had a total of fifteen men, women and elders sign up for the tournament including four pitchers from Minnesota.

The courts were recently re-built to NHPA specs and sanctioned in memory of Phil Wahl of Holmen, WI. Phil built the first two courts fifty one years ago and was a dedicated horseshoe pitcher. 
