HALL OF FAME NOMINATION FORM Fall Meeting 2014

The Fall Meeting kicked off at 1:00 p.m. in the Lake Delton Sportsmen's Club with an invocation by Chaplain, Ken Heinritz remembering missing members of the horseshoe family and asking for an even temperament for the 33 members present in their discussions.

President Glenn Bogenschneider,

in the absence of the State Sec-Treas., John Secord, prepared



to read minutes of last meeting proposing that in the future the minutes and treasury report will be printed and available only in that form. Treasury shows a WHPA balance of \$1440.81 to date. One quarter of an hour after the reading all were ready to agree to a print copy. Bogenschneider then proceeded to call upon his fellow board members for their input.

First VP, Jane Smith passed out awards for the competition among clubs at the State Tournament. First place went to a newly named club. See Smith's full report on other pages. She also tendered a suggestion to offer double

P.O.Y. points for State competition. We'll see.

Second VP, Eddie Wheeler, in his mission as Publicity and Membership director contacted Tina Hawkins, the NHPA VP in charge of the same. She

responded with a full page of promotional ideas. Watch this Newsletter for her fertile ideas to repopulate our ranks.

Bogenschneider interjected with, "Membership determines the number of delegates Wisconsin sends to the national convention. We lost one delegate in recent years. Adding that a few years ago we had as many as 483 WHPA members. Did we hear correctly that we now have just 294?

The Bull Falls Club, according to Randy Rein, has opened up their tournament on Friday nights to the public to attract new sanctioned pitchers.

Third VP, Sonia Cook, says thanks to the Jr Scholarship raffle which netted \$659, the total near \$1000, was met with a donation from Helen Sorensen in honor of her late husband Mer, amounting to \$300.

NHPA RD, John Meyer was issuing 2015 cards on site. He told that hasty tournaments to satisfy participation requirements are possible. Requirements are, two pitchers, at least 100 shoes, and sanctioned courts. Call him for a sanction number. Next year is re-certification time for court sanctions. Meyer will be doing so as he pitches various events citing any necessary modifications.

Jane Smith, on behalf of the Newsletter reminded subscribers the annual fee is now \$15 and that a new method of notice of online access is in the works.

Al Huizenga arose to tell of his research on some other state tourna-

ments, first place award, cash awards, and sponsorship. The States considered were just a few, Ohio, Illinois, Indiana, and Missouri.





A pitcher profile by Jim Haupt

Ed Hack is known as an accomplished director of horseshoe events for the Little Bull Falls Club in Mosinee. The club is a nearby offshoot of the old Windy Hill bunch. When Ed was about thirty-five he broke his ankle playing softball with a team of mostly younger fellows from work. It may have been reason to pitch

shoes. No more spikes sliding into second base. Located east side of Wausau, Hack's home is a convenient location for an aspiring horseshoe pitcher.

Regardless, at age 50 he ran into Ken Kosky who sold him on league horseshoes in Ringle whereupon meeting like-minded others of the same aim it naturally led to obtaining an NHPA card other nearby tournaments. Hack likes to remember the time he got lucky enough to blow-out Ivan Ruzic in a Marengo event sponsored by Steve Stevens. He did it pitching a 76% game. It was not too long ago, recalling, he was already pitching thirty feet at the time.

Other hobbies for Hack include ice fishing and dart ball. We now know he can endure the elements, and must be a patient fellow. Evidentially he tunes his pitching accuracy by cross-training with an aligned sports avocation, tossing darts for singles, or is he a triple shooter?

Wausau's big box retailer, K-Mart, shut down after Ed retired from there. Loss of sales of a staple item like suspenders may have been a con-

tributing factor. Those stretchy yardsticks holding up his pants are his signatory dress code. Perhaps only his wife Marcy has seen him without, suspenders that is.

He is known to have been the secretary-treasurer for the Bull Falls Club when they last hosted the state tournament there. As one of the Bull Falls tournament directors, Hack admits part of the reason he attends other tournaments is to return the favor, that and the fun of traveling keeps him on the horseshoe tournament trail. Small towns are high on his agenda.

"Horseshoes needs some younger people", is Hack's proposed cure for NHPA's declining numbers. He looks to the popular bar leagues as fertile recruiting grounds.

Now that Mr. Hack is past 70 yr. of age and pitching at the shorter distance, he foresees possible problems arising from the greater influx of short-distance pitchers. "We are beginning to outnumber the fortyfooters."

We hear you Ed and hope your continued participation, plus the colorful history of our great sport will generate the renewed interest you desire. See you at Bull Falls, Ed.

AAU & HORSESHOES

He found gold!

Tony Scrima, Waukesha horseshoe pitcher and part-time junk picker, found a piece of horseshoe memorabilia, a gold medal awarded to the Amateur Athletic Union, AAU, horseshoe doubles champion of 1937. A friend and fellow picker came across the valued find in a box of bits and pieces he had

glommed on to.



Through Tony, and his son-in-law, Joe's computer, the original possible owners were found. Bob Dunn's recently published book, "AAU National Amateur Horseshoe Pitching Championships," verified the medal was won by both Walter W. Lane

and Hubert Trinkle pitching a combined 63% winning in the 1937 AAU doubles championship.

A quote from winner, Hubert Trinkle, the following year, "Last year Walt and I went to Cincinnati without the support of the local people and won the National AAU senior doubles championship. This year we are going to New York with the support of the populace and hope to do even better." True to his prophecy, in 1938, Trinkle was first in singles, 72.1%, and Lane fourth at 50.6%. Together they again won the doubles while his son, Walt Jr. was half of another doubles team placing 2nd.

The Book details that almost anyone who is not an NHPA champion or has not competed in the championship class is an eligible amateur. Consequently many NHPA pitchers competed in the annual AAU event.

Although prior pitching in a cash tournament

may have been cause of non-entry or dismissal. The sketchy rules of entry were not applied uniformly.

Dunn's book covers all 40 years, 1937 to 1977, of AAU association with horseshoes. It was a time when horseshoes was still regarded as a spectator sport. Only a gifted few had the ability to ring the stake with any degree of repetition.

The individual reports, year by year, of the AAU events list names pitchers of today can recall. Horseshoe history buffs will recognize many. Current pitchers will recognize a few. It is a book of names. Dr. Sol Berman, John Lindmeier, Stan Manker, Carl Lundgren, and Vince Yanetti are a group probably known by name only. Some of us are apt to know or have known: Ralph Dykes, Jack Stout, Harold (Booty) Lange, Clint Sjurset, Dave Loucks, and Art Tyson. Some may have pitched against Roger Ehlers, The foregoing are all considered to have been AAU competitors.

A book excerpt: "To qualify for a national tournament, a pitcher must have an average in the 80's...Any dub can pitch an 80 percent game." (Pop) Woodfield says, "but he can't do it consistently." Author's



note: Is that where the horseshoe pitcher's constant cliche originated? "consistent,"?

Bob Dunn of Minnesota was appointed NHPA Historian in 2008, and has written several horseshoe books, one on shoe collecting. He owns the largest known collection of interesting, formerly used shoes that many pitchers have seen displayed at world tournaments.
