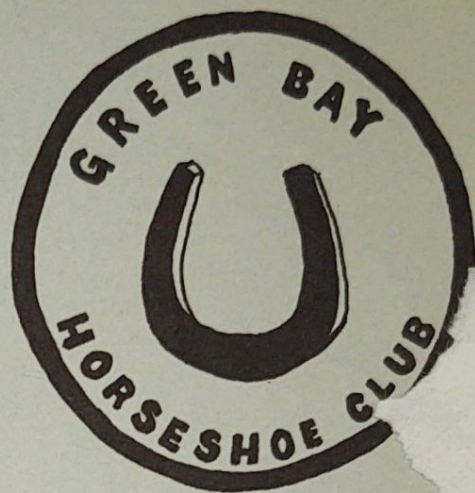

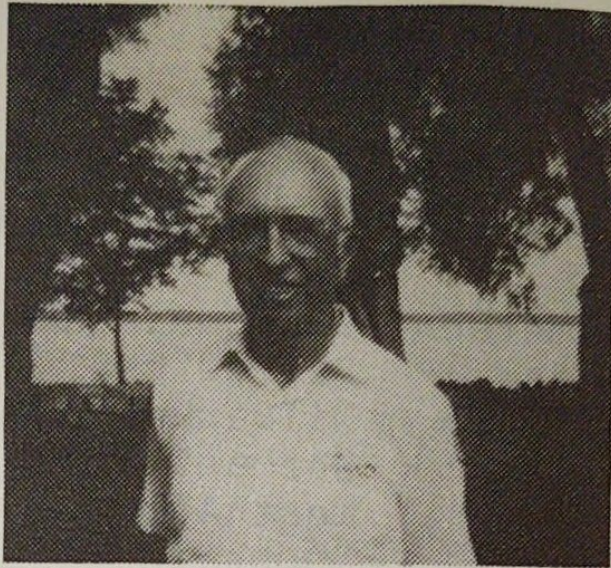

In winning the 1945 Wisconsin State Horseshoe Men's Championship, Casey Jones from Waukesha averaged 85.2%, the highest percent ever recorded in men's state horseshoe competition.



CURT AND BEATY BESTUL

Curt Bestul started pitching horseshoes in 1963. He organized the Eau Claire Horseshoe Club in 1965, and he and his wife Beaty were the very backbone of that club, giving unselfishly of their time and helping others in every way possible. Curt helped organize the Stevens Point and Marshfield clubs and was awarded a trophy from the latter for his assistance to them.

Curt has assisted or chaired many Open and City-County tournaments. He has attended nearly all state meetings and has been Wisconsin delegate to the World Tournament several times. In 1967 he helped organize and charter the Wisconsin Horseshoe Pitchers Association into the NHPA. He has been president of the Eau Claire club, he was NHPA Regional Director for Wisconsin, Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa and Upper Michigan for three years, and Assistant Regional Director for Wisconsin.

Curt has pitched in several World Tournaments in Class B. In 1971 he pitched in the Championship Class when he was the first Wisconsin pitcher since Casey Jones to get into the top class. He placed 31st, with a 68% average.

He won the Eau Claire City-County championship in the years 1967 through 1975, and 1977, 1978, 1982, '83 and '84. In 1970 and 1971 he hit 45 ringers out of 50 shoes for 90% in league play. Twice in tournaments he had nine four-deads in a row with Frank Stinson. In 1981 Curt's dream came true when he won the State Championship at Eau Claire.

At World Tournaments, Curt's attendance was not only as pitcher or spectator; he and Beaty help by marking score or working on statistics in the office.

Curt was born August 14, 1924. He works as a line crew foreman.



BERNICE (BEATY) MCRAE BESTUL was born in Minnesota November 5, 1931, married Curt on June 23, 1950, and has lived in Eau Claire since that date.

Beaty has been very active in the Eau Claire Horseshoe Club, helping to organize it and to establish the leagues conducted by the club. In 1964 the club started an annual report on club and tournament results. Beaty has been the person most responsible for this booklet, called "Four Dead", and each year spends countless hours in preparing it.

Every tournament in Eau Claire has had Beaty handling the entries and results. This means being one of the first ones there and the last to leave at each event. Several years she has acted as co-chairman with husband, Curt.

She pitches in the ladies league at Eau Claire and, although not entering the World Tournament, she has attended many. She served as Wisconsin delegate at some, being an NHPA member. Beaty has kept score at most tournaments she attended, including World, and has spent time working in the office at World Tournaments.

In 1985, she and Curt are co-chairpersons of the World Tournament Committee for the Eau Claire Horseshoe Club to submit a bid for the 1987 World Tournament.

Every successful horseshoe organization has people behind the scenes doing a lot of work that is generally unnoticed by most, and Beaty has been one of these people for many years.

Curt and Beaty have four children, Dottie, Donald, David, and Deborah, all of whom have pitched in World Tournaments, with Debby winning the Junior Girls Championship in 1984 at Huntsville, Alabama.

Curt and Beaty Bestul are to be commended for their contribution to the sport of horseshoe pitching. There is no doubt that their many years of effort and devotion have earned them a place in the Wisconsin Horseshoe Hall-of-Fame.



### ARCHIE JOHNSON

Archie Johnson was born and grew up on a farm in Pulaski where he started pitching horseshoes when he was fifteen years old. As a youngster he pitched with his father and uncles. He started the Pulaski Horseshoe Club in 1956 and had the first tournament for prize money there, at that time the only tournament other than State.

Archie moved to Germantown in 1965 and was responsible for the installation of four lighted courts at Ronnie's Tap. He organized leagues and conducted five tournaments there. He joined the Goldendale Horseshoe Club in 1972 where he pitched in leagues and helped run their tournaments.

In 1972, Archie also built four clay indoor courts at Sussex Bowl and promoted a Horseshoe Banquet held there with nearly 300 attending. Ralph Dykes, then president of the NHPA, was guest speaker. Many past Wisconsin champions were also present. Tournaments were run monthly during the winter and spring of 1973, with many pitchers from Ohio, Minnesota, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, and Wisconsin participating. Curt Day, World Champion, put on an exhibition at the grand opening of the courts and Sussex Bowl.

Archie was the manager of the VFW Post in Sussex, conducting tournaments for four years. He also started Tiddly-Winks as a winter pastime, with Tiddly-Wink tournaments as a result, first at Sussex and now at Brothertown.

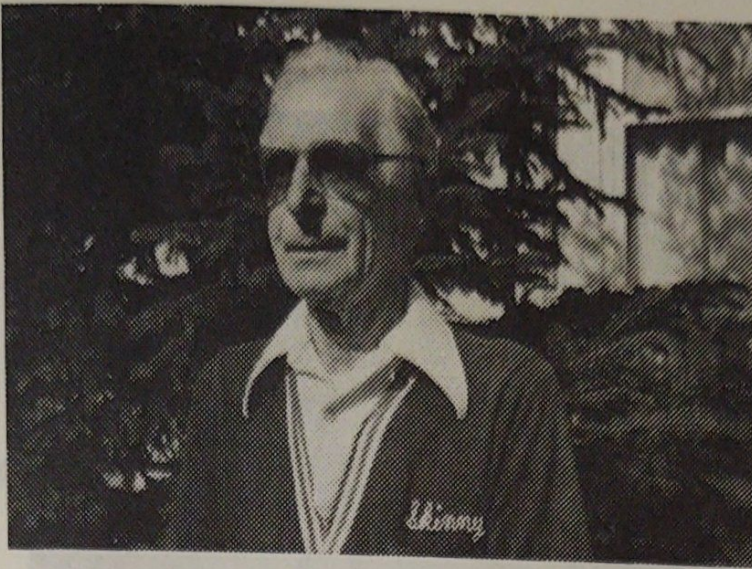
Archie promoted the idea of having a State Association and has been a member since its beginning. He encouraged 50-shoe, instead of 50-point games, which has proved to be very important in the running of a tournament.

Archie and his wife, Mary, are proprietors of Archie's Place in Brothertown, where he has installed four clay courts and has conducted three tournaments.

You can be sure that wherever Archie lives, there will be people swinging horseshoes nearby soon after he moves there.

We congratulate Archie on his many years of tournament participation and promotion of the sport of horseshoe pitching and are happy to present him with this 1985 Wisconsin Horseshoe Hall-of-Fame award.





C. L. OLLERMAN

C. L. "Skinny" Ollerman, who was born April 29, 1912, started playing horseshoes with shoes from farm horses at the age of fourteen. He became interested in the game and continued to play in his backyard and at the city playgrounds.

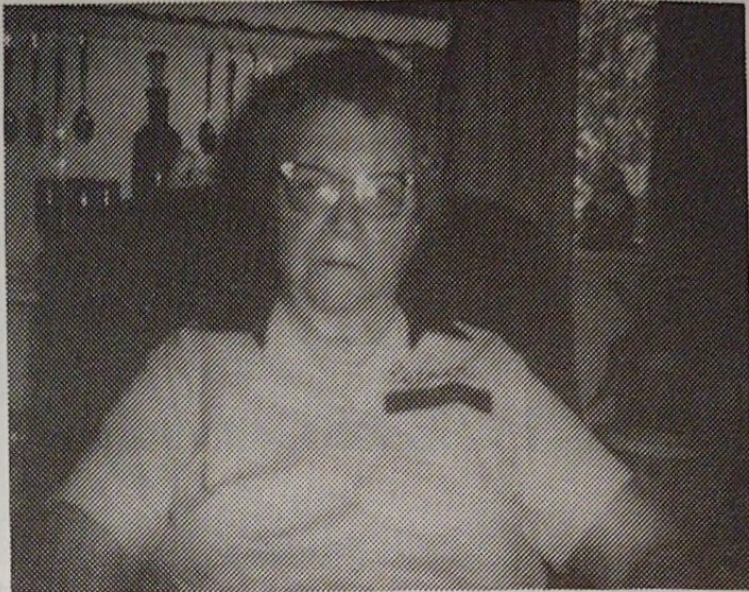
Skinny joined the Fond du Lac Horseshoe Club in 1947; he was elected Secretary-Treasurer in 1949 and has held the office continuously since then. He helped to increase the club membership from eight to the present 100 members, plus twelve subs. He has been tournament director for the club and assists in setting up tournament schedules. He is always ready to help in any way to better the club, which has grown from six courts to the present sixteen at the county fairgrounds. He was a State Association Vice-President in 1979 and 1980.

Skinny won the City Championship in 1962 and 1970, and second place in doubles in 1978. He has participated in many state and local Wisconsin open tournaments.

Skinny was a meat cutter by trade and has been retired for ten years after 30 years of service for local supermarkets. He and his wife, Adell, celebrated 45 years of marriage on July 21. They have one daughter, Patricia (Mrs. Howard) McCadden, and three granddaughters, Lori, Vicki, and Dawn.

Skinny says "It has been my pleasure to meet wonderful people around the state during my travel to their tournaments and state events - sure have made a lot of friends."

We congratulate Skinny for his many years of dedication and contribution to the sport of horseshoe pitching and are happy to name him to the Wisconsin Horseshoe Hall-of-Fame in 1985.



### ESTHER VOIGT

Esther Voigt, who celebrated her 82nd birthday on May 16, has been pitching horseshoes for 22 years, eighteen years with the Fillmore Horseshoe Club which was started in 1965 on her property. Since 1978, the Fillmore club has sponsored the successful Fillmore USA Open.

Esther entered numerous tournaments throughout the state, finishing second in many behind her daughter, Darlene, who was four years State Women's Champion. She and her partner won the club championship in 1984.

Esther is also active in couples' bowling. She has bowled for over 40 years, many years twice a week.

Esther was raised on a farm and, after her marriage to Clarence Voigt, started her own rug weaving business, which she had for 33 years. She still operates a candy shop.

Esther has six children, five of whom are active in horseshoe pitching, along with grandsons and a son-in-law. She has thirteen grandchildren and eighteen great-grandchildren, with two more on the way.
