

CASEY JONES



Casey Jones, National Horseshoe Hall-of-Fame member, is one of two horseshoe pitchers being honored by the newly-formed Wisconsin Horseshoe Hall-of-Fame. He won the State Tournament a total of 19 times, three of which were as a Junior. He was runnerup in the National Tournament five times and carried the highest ringer percentage, 87.5%, for many years.

In 1953 his family went into the bowling business. He is the owner of an enviable bowling record. His achievements include 10 games of 300, 13 series of 800, which is the Wisconsin state record for being all sanctioned. On March 24, 1976, he bowled an 802 series.

His family consists of three daughters and one son who died in 1969. They also have three grandsons.

Casey Jones never won the World Title, but for many years he ranked near the top. He was runner up for the title five times and established many records. His 87.5 percent ringers in 1948 still stands as an all time ringer record for an entire tournament. During this stretch he had 13 games out of 31 in which he bettered 90 percent ringers. Today Casey is a successful manager of a large bowling establishment in Wisconsin and one of the top ranking bowlers in the country.
