

## '92 TEAM WORLD

Telfer Park Sports Arena, prepared by the Beloit Horseshoe Club, will again offer 24 courts for the April 24-25-26 TEAM-WORLD tournament.

Publicity for this year's production is already in action on a national scale. An ad appeared in the last issue of NEWSLINE. Letters of invitation have gone to many of the best pitchers of the NHPA. The goal, to attract the best the sport has to offer, is underway.

Four pitchers to a team, hopefully the best from each state and Canadian province, will compete in a 24-team round robin for the TEAM-WORLD 92 trophy. Nearby states always provide top teams. Some come with three teams. Some of those #2 teams have ranked high in the finals. Other states, although more distant, are expected. Once a pitcher gets to the flavor of team competition it becomes addictive. Once a state fields a foursome at TEAM-WORLD the days are merely numbers until they return the following year.

The WHPA sponsors the Wisconsin #1 team as do some of the other states. However the \$200 entry fee will not dissuade second and third teams. It is a sure bet there will be three entries from this state. True, if an overabundance of high percentage teams enter, the primary state teams will be the preferred entry. The remainder of the field will be seeded by percentage. However some lower average teams have pitched this tournament in the past and it will continue until TEAM-WORLD is exclusively top pitchers or another format is adopted.

Of course the lure is pitching with or against a world class opponent. That would be facilitated through the choice of pitcher match-ups. Could be the flip of a shoe that pits a plough jockey against the world champ. The fun is ; how close can you come? Even the champs stumble on occasion : It could be yours and it would not be the first time it happened.

Spectating this year is going to be easier than ever. Number one; scorekeepers are outside help. Spectators should not feel obligated and should not be pestered. Secondly; admission tickets are only one dollar and the purchase puts the buyer into a cash prize raffle. Bring the family. The Beloit Club will deal; 6 admission/raffle tickets for \$5.

April in Beloit is not Springtime in Paris but close to it. Telfer Park is an indoor hockey arena less the ice. Bring a sweater to watch the pitchers. Take off your sweater to pitch. Park your bags at the Plantation Inn. They offer a special tournament rates of \$35 plus tax for 1,2,3,or4 (as many as you want to squeeze) people for the guest rooms. Make your reservations now; call 1-800-367-2501 and its just five minutes from Telfer Park.

As state entries arrive they will be reported in this TEAM-WORLD column.

## '92 CLUB TEAM

Go, this minute, to your calendar. The annual CLUB-TEAM tournament will be Saturday APRIL 11TH in Beloit at the Telfer Park Sports Arena. Makes no difference where you live : Mark the calendar. Kewaskum, Combined Locks, Eagle, Balsam Lake, Racine, Wausau, Rhinelander, Sheyboygan, Fillmore, Marshfield, this is as close to an engraved invitation as you will receive. There will be an "A" and "B" division. Don't count yourselves out.

The entry fee is \$80/team and the entry deadline is March 28th, two weeks prior. Last year with the same entry fee we were able to assign over 80% of the entry to cash awards. Because the remaining 20% qualified as expenses and an equal award went to "A" and "B", we can justly claim that 100% of the entry fee remains in class.

About two-thirds of the cash is distributed for each game won. Its tough, almost impossible, not to be a cash winner.

First place in the "A" division claims the traveling trophy. The present owners, Platteville, may have some reservations regarding the future home of the trophy but certainly they will defend with trophy in hand. Alas there is no trophy for "B" at this time but the cash award (if there is one) will be equal.

Basically this tournament is setup for team competition among clubs/leagues and area teams. Limits imposed on area teams are three: 1. County team pitchers must reside within that county. 2. If your residence is North of highway 10 team members may originate from any adjacent county. 3. Anything North of Highway 8 is considered one area. A more equitable method has yet to be offered.

In order for the WHPA to be non-profit, our constitution must state to whom our assets will be distributed in the event the WHPA should cease operation. Curt has submitted the following article for vote at the Spring Meeting. I thank Curt for his input.

**ARTICLE XIV** IN THE EVENT THIS ORGANIZATION SHOULD TAKE ACTION TO NO LONGER FUNCTION, THE ASSETS OF THE ORGANIZATION SHALL BE AWARDED TO THE NATIONAL HORSESHOE PITCHERS ASSOCIATION TO BE USED FOR THE PROMOTION OF JUNIOR HORSESHOE PITCHING.

The 1992 Pitcher of the Year award is off to a slow start. Not by the pitchers but by the guy who has to input all the points. Right now it looks like our new woman's champ is the one leading the pack. Keep up the good pitching Edie. The points for this year's tournaments will be slightly different, with all NHPA Sanctioned Tournament points being 26, 16, 12 and 6. All other tournaments on our state list will be 13, 8, 6 and 3. NOTICE TO ALL TOURNAMENT DIRECTORS: A copy of your final results sent directly to me helps keep the standings up to date. Thanks for your cooperation.

Due to some possible changes in the NHPA Convention format, I feel that item B from our Fall meeting on voting at the NHPA Convention, which was tabled, should remain so until after the 1992 Convention. The date for the this year's convention has been set for July 26th, the day after the tournament has been completed. Those wanting to be a delegate should contact me. The Spring Meeting would be a good time to do so.

All items tabled at the Fall Meeting will be brought up under old business. I expect there will be some new business as there always is. At the Fall Meeting I set a very busy schedule, maybe too much so, as a result we have more to do at this meeting. Time is always precious, but to a pitcher waiting for a game of horseshoe, it becomes more so. Let's keep our meeting business like, let those who wish to speak, do so and those who do, be to the point and as short as possible.

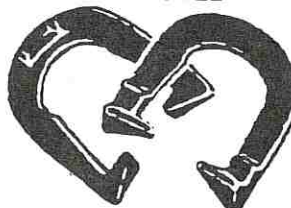

## DOWN AND BACK

What is so different and unique about The Arena Sandbar? Other indoor horseshoe houses in Wisconsin would like to know. How can a former chicken coop suddenly become the 'Mecca' for winter horseshoes in Wisconsin?

Its NEW. Recently 'discovered', (only last year), the Sandbar is riding the 'new' crest seen before in three other indoor houses. Wisconsin pitchers flocked to present and past indoor pitching places when they were new. As time progressed tournament entries and eventually tournament offerings dwindled. The new love became a fleeting crush. As a whole the bulk of the WHPA does little to support indoor pitching facilities.

The Sandbar is different from other indoor houses in one way. The courts are not located in another room. Players pitch in the barroom. Its all one big room. The pitching is the foremost activity of the moment in the building. And the Sandbar, for other folk, is also a gathering spot for food, drink, and catching up on the action. The fact remains, in this house pitching horseshoes on Saturday afternoons is the main event. Almost everyone in the one big room, shoe tosser, social rider, or beverage partaker, is part of it.

Another reason of popularity is the doubles format. While not the favorite of most tournament pitchers, doubles means twice the contestants and zero scorekeepers. The events at Arena are self sustaining, they run alone, with a minimum of supervision.

Pitcher-promoters have accepted the challenge to run events. Platteville and Norm Mauthe treat the Sandbar as their own. Waunakee guys, John Barden, Tip Wipperfurth, and Paul Federer jumped on the opportunity. Beloit and Mouse Beckius said Let's just do it. Locally, Carl Gilbertson and Dick Erdman have chosen to keep a good thing going. A whole group of promoters can keep a few from suffering burnout. Its developing to the way it should be.

The beauty of it is, there's room for promoters and hopefully they will carry the ball too. And when those present and future promoters make a decision to run one, let us hope they tell us. Just a few tournaments at Arena have been advertised. We have a good thing going at Arena but unless you have your ear to the ground it is, as they say, a well kept secret.

## EAU CLAIRE SKI CLUB HALL OF FAME

### CURT BESTUL

He began jumping at an early age on a hill on the family farm near Scandinavia and skied for the Iola, New London and Milwaukee Wood clubs.

In the service during World War II, he was a member of the famed 10th Mountain Ski Troops, which included Tokle and Eau Claire Hall of Famer Jimmy Hendrickson serving as a telephone linemen.

He moved to Eau Claire mainly for skiing in 1948 and became a key member of the Eau Claire Ski Club as a jumper and a worker.

He was the engineer in charge of construction for the original wooden slide at Hendrickson Hill and took the inaugural jump from the slide in 1950 as the city moved into ski-jumping's big-time.

He was awarded the club's Most Valuable Member award at the end of the year and received the award a second time in 1953 after remodeling the Fourth Ward School jump, home of the Flying Eagles.

As an athlete, Bestul distinguished himself in the 1949 national championships at Salt Lake City when he took third place in Class B with jumps of 241 and 235 feet. Teammate Bill Olson won the title.

Between 1948 and the mid-1950s, he was a top finisher in numerous Midwest tournaments.

In 1950, he took third in Class A at Beloit and later that season soared to a new hill record of 191 feet in winning Class A at Glenwood, Minn. At Ironwood, Mich., he turned in the longest jump of the day (in competition with the world-record ski-flyer at the time) but fell and suffered a broken leg.

He came back the next year to participate in the U.S. Olympic Team tryouts at Iron Mountain, Mich.

Bestul also set a hill record at Plymouth in 1952 and a year later placed second in the tournament at Eau Claire.

He retired from the sport in 1955 and became one of the nation's better horseshoe pitchers, a sport he continues to excel at today.

Bestul, 67, retired 5 years ago after working as a lineman for NSP.

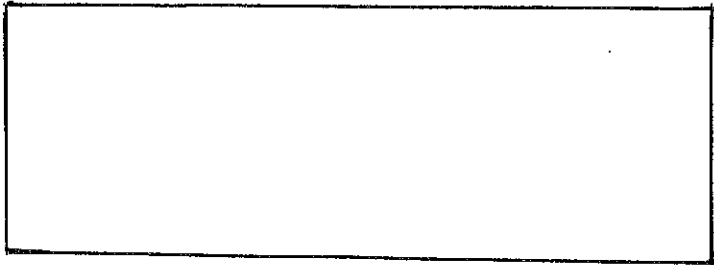

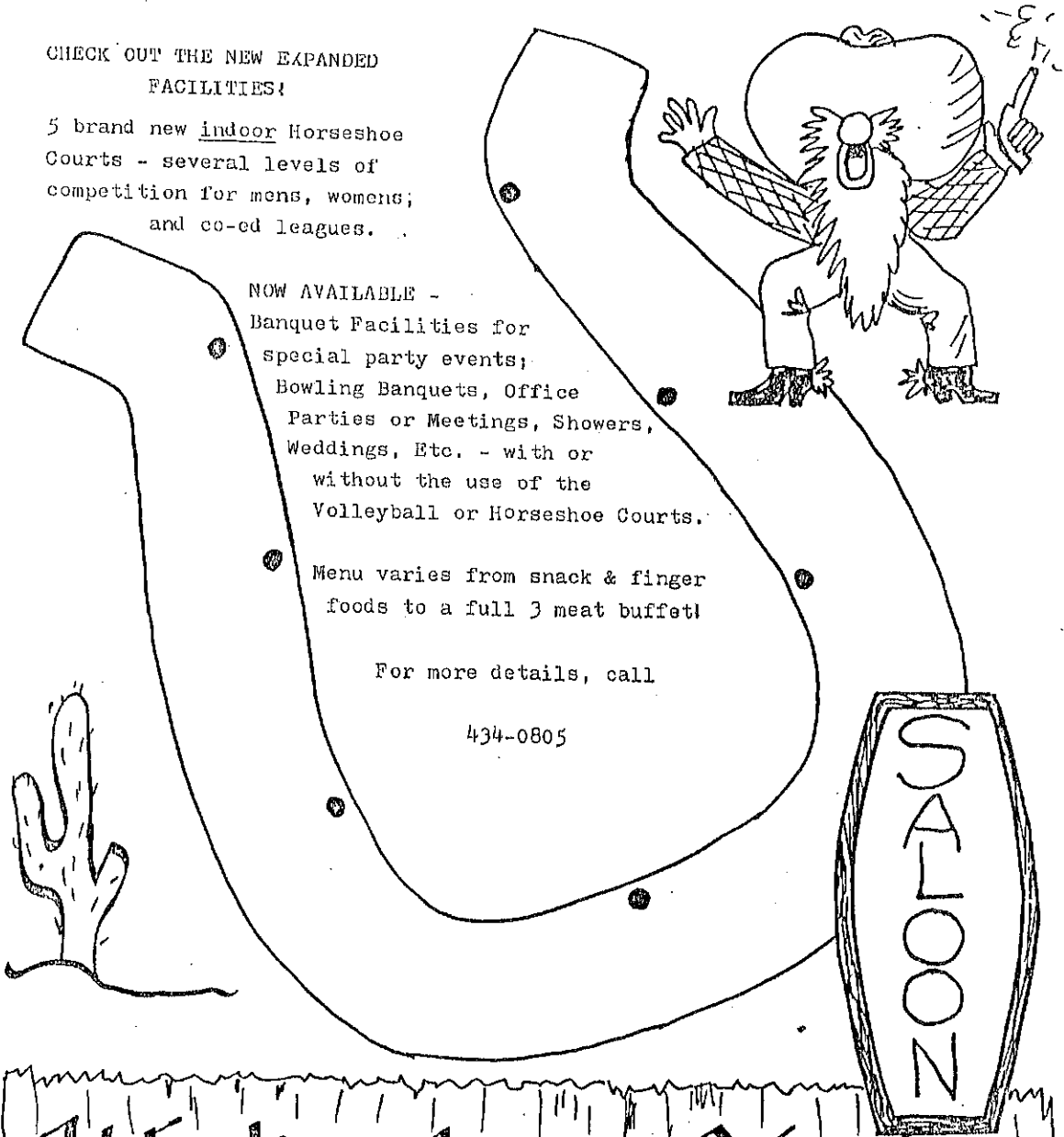
