Such events include all WHPA open sanctioned tournaments and the two WHPA meetings. Participants earn 15, 10 and 5 points respectively for placing in tournaments. 15 points are earned for attending the State meetings. We have 38 events on the schedule with 20 recorded at this time. 

Profiling Pitcher Lonny Transgrud

Who is the man from Eau Claire now pitching the our championship class? And how did he get there? Is he really a relatively new guy? He has already been cited as a most improved pitcher.

What's his background?

Originally from Valley City, North Dakota, Lonny Transgrud was brought up by parents both playing the game of horseshoes. Their love of the sport ran deep and transferred to their son.

Transgrud was introduced to the 3/4 turn by dad then learning the one and a quarter on his own. He started pitching in a Fargo, ND league in 1992 averaging in the 30's through 1997.

Moving to Marinette, WI in 1998 he found no leagues. After a ten year horseshoe hiatus, he relocated to Eau Claire discovering the Carson Park crew and started out at 37%. In the ensuing years he has bumped his average to 53.8% pitching an even dozen events last year.

Both of his kids, Cole and Cailyn have been pitching four years and love the game. Transgrud remarks: "Wonder where they got that from? I hope they continue. I've learned a lot and (am) still continuing to learn." As he recalls watching the pro's practice at the Cedar Rapids, IA World event.

Since horseshoes has become a family sport it dictates which tournaments he chooses to enter. Closer events take precedence and appearance is another factor. In the mix he is also apt to pitch a few Minnesota events. At all those events he would like to see more point games, 40 points, and, naturally, opportunities for Junior pitchers.

His bread and butter job is detailing dealership cars. He also has a flare for photography and drawing. Asked about goals he responded, "I have too many. Ha-Ha! I love competition, the sound of the shoe making a ringer, who doesn't?"

Observing him addressing the stake is a lesson in concentration, very deliberate form with complete rigid-like control. Transgrud already has; had one 80% game, carries a 180 bowling average, the respect of his peers as a class A pitcher, and is looking forward to a great 2015!


THE COUNT-ALL QUESTION

We brought up the question last time, why don't we put more emphasis on perfect count-all games?

It's the standard scoring system for leagues because of the ease of handicapping. League pitchers are so well versed in count-all that their first tournament, is a change to the cancellation score system and can be challenging.

Some leagues have been known to handicap as slow as 75%, while most settle for 80 or 85% and a few go all the way, 100% hdcp!





100% or all ringer games occur sporadically. Historical perfect games have been recorded in the World Tournament. Guy Zimmerman did it first in the Milwaukee World, 1948, 44 ringers in 44 shoes.

Twenty years later, 1968, the great Canadian, Elmer Hohl recorded the highest ever qualifying score. Using count-all scoring for 200 shoes, Hohl amassed 572 points. It is probably a record of all time as qualifying is no longer deemed necessary. Yet no qualifying game has ever been defined as perfect with all shoes in count.

The table shown is the mid-season standings of the Goldendale Club of Germantown, WI. They pitch three games of 50 shoes weekly. The first four columns are provided by the league secretary. Places are determined by the W/L column. The final four columns are acquired using count-all math. 3rd place is easy: Jim P gets 10 ringers = 30 points. He misses 40 times but converts 30 of them into points. Ergo his conversion factor is 75% and overall 80% of his shoes are in count.

What's your rate of conversion? To determine number of misses deduct ringers production from Pt. Avg. Converted points equal Point avg. minus points of ringers. Divide converts by misses to determine your rate of conversion.

Consult the standings sheet. A bit of luck cannot be discounted. How is Barb in first place with a 15% ringer percentage and converting a little more than half her share of misses? Lucky, lucky.

Consider the difference a perfect game pitcher could make. An ordinary 30 percent pitcher converting all misses into points might carry a point average of 80!

The plum is yours to pick. Attempt to toss a softer shoe with some loft, get some points, and you too could attain that perfect game.

Its an accomplishment that should be recognized in the annual NHPA league stats, the "Top Ten Awards."
