## TEAM-WORLD '95

### Kentucky ends the three year Minnesota reign.

One day after the Kentucky Derby, four horseshoe pitchers of that state claimed the TEAM-WORLD Cup at the Beloit, Wisconsin tournament. Sue Snyder, Charlie Meredith, Ron Powell, and Don Titcomb repaid the Minnesota team with their own version of a photo-finish. In 1994 the same Minnesota team won the final game by a nose over Kentucky.

This time the same two competitors, Don Titcomb and Lu Cave, last on the courts with the title on the line, dueled as their teammates tracked the hopeful flight of those last shoes. Titcomb had to win by two points. Courtesy of Cave, he did it with seven points to spare.

Twenty-two teams played a round robin pre-lim starting Friday morning leading to the Sunday afternoon finals. Seven made the final play-offs.

The ladder-type finals began with four teams vying for the fourth position. A strong Quebec team with the tournament high average pitcher, Sylvianne Moisan (81.6%) lost to the second team of Minnesota. On the adjoining courts the top Missouri team dropped a close match with the number one team of Wisconsin.

In the second bracket the home state team won again outpointing the other first game winner, Minnesota -2.

In the losers bracket it was Quebec over Missouri -1 by 3/1 games.

Wisconsin, now fourth on the ladder just held their position as the defending champion Minnesota -1 team stopped the Badgers assent. The formidable Ontario -1 team ranked second with likes of Sandy Janssens, Kevin McLachlin, Stan Leis, and Steve Hohl, became next the conquest of the number one Minnesota team to set-up that fateful final match with Kentucky.

Higest ringer game of the finals happened when Mark Bauman (77.5%) met Sylvianne Moisan (92.5 %)

New entries this year included the family team from Quebec. The Leclerc-Moisan plus Boudreault group drove seventeen hours to

reach the horseshoe rink in the town with the French sounding name of Beloit

Colorado played sponsored by Allen Baptist. Rich Pintor and Paul Lacrosse reportedly asked for sweet rolls so Baptist brought Schneck - Dan Schneck.

Rod Tanner brought one 'Upper' and three 'Lowers' from Michigan. Experiencing top competition, the team allowed him to pitch just one game. "Wait til next year," Tanner declared, "We'll come with two teams - I am going to pitch."

Solidarity is catching on. Teams are taking on the look of real 'teams' with custom shirts. Both Colorado and Michigan dressed with specially embossed "Team-World" uniform shirts - neat. Harvey Wobbe had his Six-Pac team from Missouri looking sharp. Bill Vanderburg of Ontario hawks his many shoes on shirts. The other Ontario team seemed to be showing mostly "ONTARIO." It may be the 'middle ground' between Kevin McLachlin and Steve Hohl, both with an interest in marketing horseshoes.

Gus Schram of Wisconsin, now pitching his new one hook shoe, is considering "Ringle Single" shirts for next year.

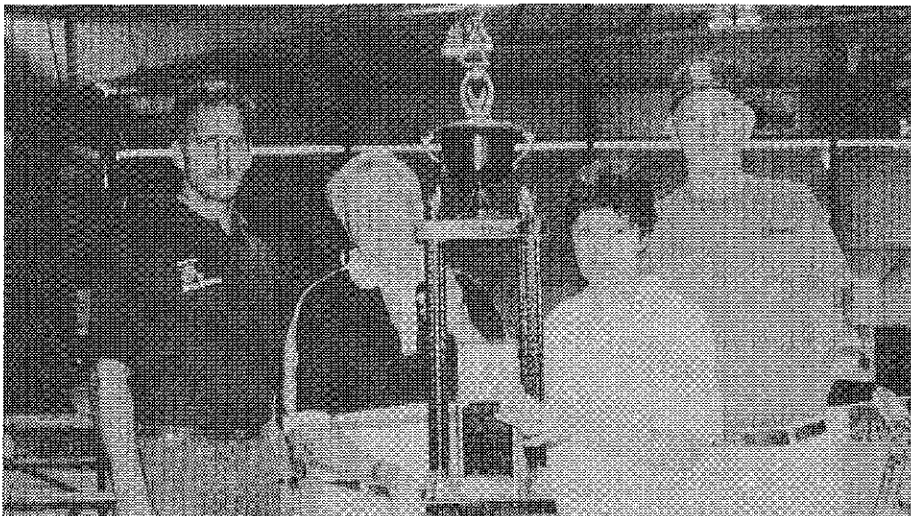
No team from Saskatchewan this year after many consecutive years of competition. Fellow players say, "Wish you were here." To field an even number of teams, the Team-World Committee assembled a 22nd team appropriately called T-W Dream Team, madeup of three Indiana pitchers and one from Tennessee. The T-W team played as unannounced pacers preserving a bit of mystery for the scoreboard.

The first weekend in May was a few days later this year and brought the warm weather the Telfer Park pitchers yearn for. Although the twenty-four courts are set-up inside, the outside walls of the huge structure are canvas. Outside temperature becomes inside temperature. Lacking the rays of the sun, its like pitching in windless shade - really nice on warm days.

Historically the Team-World has sometimes been facetiously viewed as a Minnesota benefit event. Winners five times in eleven

years including the '92, '93, '94 run indicates their domination. Phyllis Negaard and Dale Lipovsky played on every winning team. The Gopher State has a gang of top pitchers. This year Minnesota lost but in a close match while their #2 team starring Mark Bauman was also in the finals. Look for Minnesota to be back in '96 trying to reclaim 'their' title.

The power of Kentucky remains every team's concern. Note, Sue Snyder has moved to Kentucky. Lois Webster, in school, did not pitch. The state has pitchers on the waiting list- enough to field two teams. - TEAM-WORLD '96 May 3-4-5

Since 1990 when Beloit became the host of Team-World, action at Telfer Park has snowballed. The 24 courts beckoned. Pitchers answered the call. Word spread that the Beloit Club works to find people to keep score. The Wisconsin Club Team tournament found Telfer could handle a big crew for its annual pitch-off. The Encore flourished.

The name "Encore" was selected as following or after the Club Team. Now the wagon is bigger than the team. Makes one wonder which of the two events is dragging or pushing the other. At any rate the Team-World pitchers get to play on clay worked over by thousands of shoes the week before.

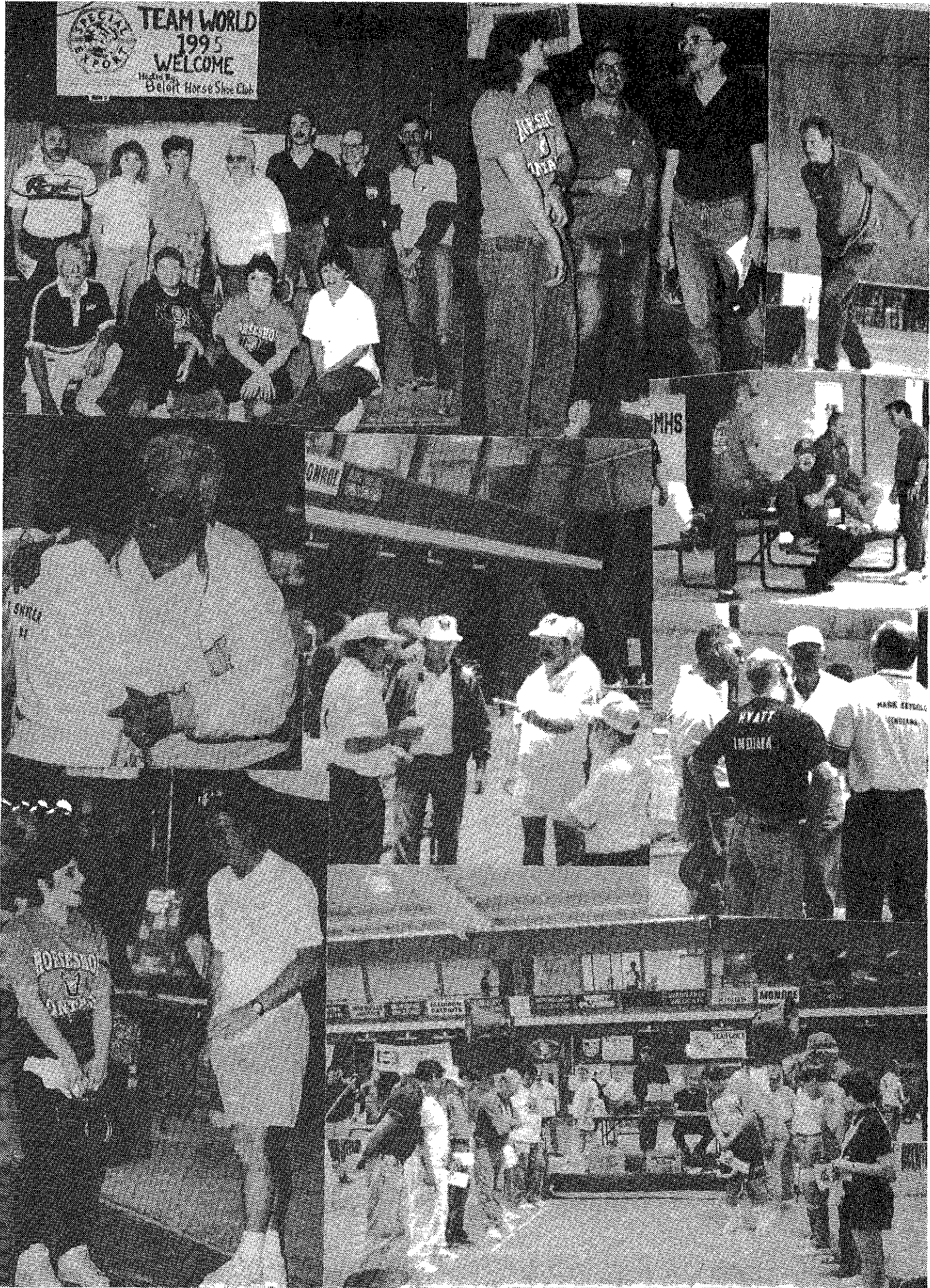

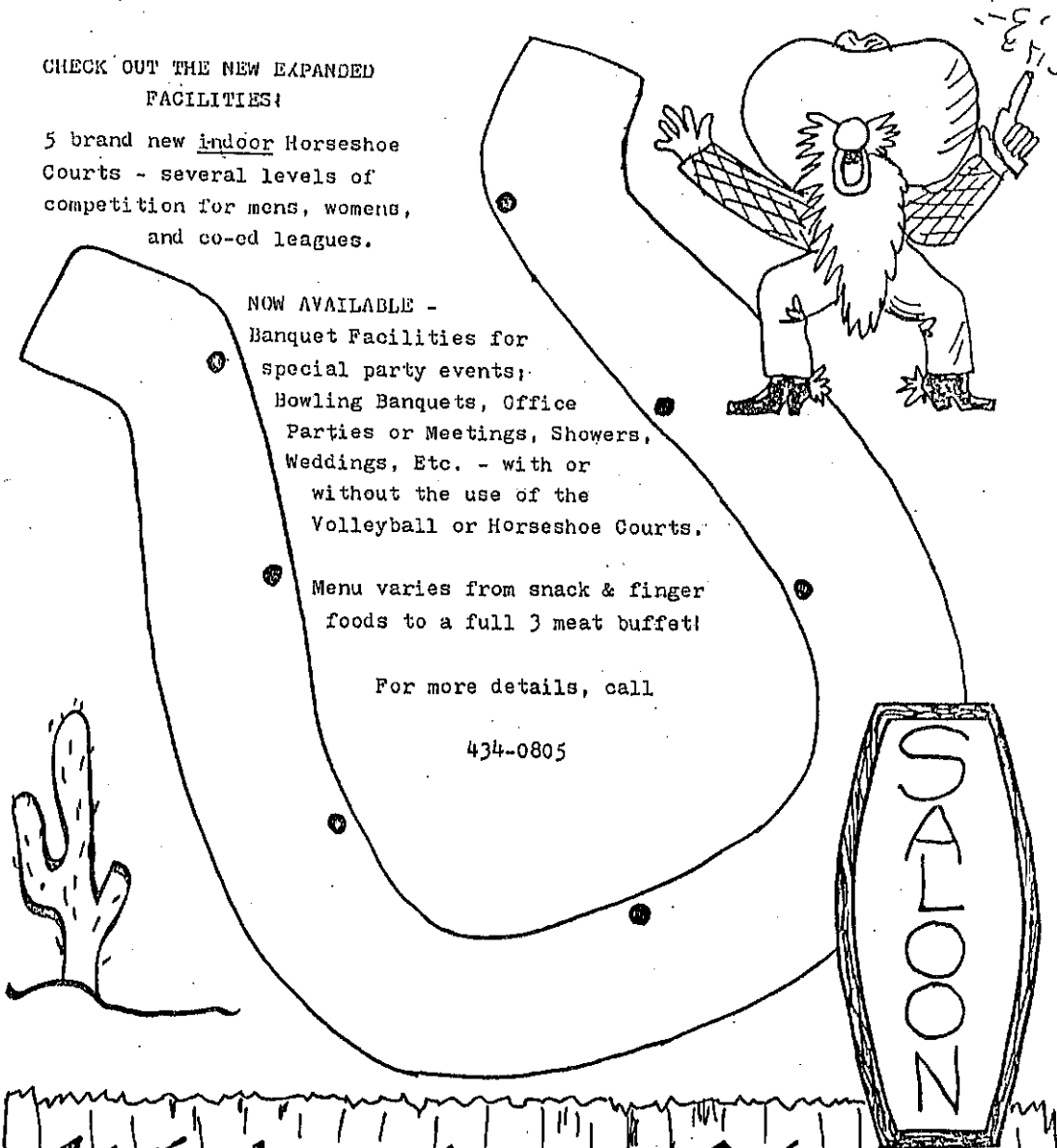
