

2019 WHPA Fall Meeting Write-Up— October 19—Lake Delton

President Dobie called the meeting to order at Ipm when we recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Chaplin Ken Heinritz gave the opening prayer. Secretary/Treasurer John Secord gave his reports, read and accepted the minutes from the April meeting. Ist VP Dave Volz reported the current ending balance of 3,502.10.

Jane Smith was absent from the meeting, so Dave Volz read her report. Each year the clubs represented at the state tournament can participate in a competition with the state entrants from their club competing against entrants from other clubs that participate at our annual state tournament. Congratulations to Summit Ridge, this year's winner, and to the Stevens Point club who had 19 pitchers at state. For a club only four years old, this is amazing. This year there were 10 clubs tying for the top club and the results are as follows from 1st to last (need the updates):

Summit Ridge—16 pitchers and a 6.18 average Marshfield—10 pitchers and a 5.5 average Beloit—8 pitchers and a 4.87 average Stevens Point—19 pitchers and a 4.7 average Arkdale—6 pitchers and a 4.66 average Eau Claire—10 pitchers and a 4.4 average Close Does Not Count—7 pitchers and a 4.10 average

Deansville—9 pitchers and 3.88 average Little Bull Falls—9 pitchers and a 3.77 average 2nd VP Kevin Brekke report: Mentioned Sanc-

tioned League. This year had one team from Wisconsin, Ray Groskinsky, Kerry Morris, and Al Huzienga. Next year will be the 16th year and would like to see more teams from Wisconsin. I had Ray say a few words about their experience there. I mentioned the next two World Tournament sites and dates: 2020—Monroe, La, July 13-25. 2021—Winnemucca, Nevada, July 19-31.

3rd VP Report: Sonia was absent. President Dobie read her report. The Junior Scholarship fund is in great shape and a big thank you to all that participated in the growing with juniors raffle which was a great success. It netted 874.00 this year. Current total balance in scholarship fund is 11,871.45 with liabilities of 5,600. Special thanks to all that donated

to the raffle, including the Norm Mauthe family, Tony Scrima, the WHPA membership, Mel and Sonia Cook family, Elaine Troullier, Ken Heinritz, Lonny Transgrud, Tava Cook family, and all who bought tickets. Shout out to the Mauthe family whose donations this year total just over 1,000.00. The Mauthe family—a big part of our WI horseshoe family are horseshoe angels. Plans for 2020 will include our annual "Growing with Juniors" raffle. I am already accepting donations and will up until drawing the winners on Sunday of Labor Day weekend. Join in the fun and donate a prize. Thank you for supporting my ideas and work. Here is an early statement: I do plan on running for another term as your 3rd Vice President in 2020. There was discussion on having more tickets available for the next raffle. For the first time tickets ran out Sunday morning and members would like to see more tickets available for future drawings.

Hall of Fame committee chairman Jeff Secord mentioned to keep sending in your nominations. The committee votes just before the Spring Meeting and it's important to nominate those you feel are worthy. He also mentioned the current inductee Leroy Meyer's induction at state was awesome with the support of Leroy's family and friends that were there. To see current nominees, you can go to whpahorseshoes.com and hit the HOF link.

John Secord did the drawing for the Each One Reach One contest. We had 47 new members this year and we give out two 25.00 awards and five 10.00 awards. They went to in order: Close Does Not Count Club, Dobie, Tom Steinke, Fred Lane, Arkdale Club, Kent Frailing, Brian Herbst. John also mentioned that membership numbers have been going down in recent years. Total membership the last three years: 2017—370, 2018—355, 2019—338.

Paul Wiese represented the Eau Claire club and said things went well hosting state and would consider bidding for state again in the future. The 2020 State Tournament will be hosted by the Beloit Horseshoe Club and will be ready. The club wanted

to thank all those who helped with Team World setup and tear down and will need the help again for things to run smoothly as it did this year. Date for Team World setup will be April 25, 2020.

Membership cards—John Secord mentioned that National will no longer pass out paper membership cards. Everything is online now. If someone needs to renew and cannot online, you can send your renewal in to John and he will do it for you. If you do renew online there is a small fee between one and two dollars. You would go to horseshoepitching.com and click on eshoe. For new memberships, you still have to go through John Secord. Once you are on for the year, you can go to Eshoe and print out a copy of your membership if you want.

Kevin Brekke brought up discussion on having only one meeting in the spring and doing all our business then. Elections and bids for state would be done at the spring meeting, would need bylaw changes. In discussion it seems the members did not want to pursue this. No further action on this.

Online Horseshoe Pitching—Kevin Brekke mentioned that he has participated as a coach for the Online Horseshoe Pitching Youth—and had opportunities to watch and evaluate youth pitchers from all over, even Japan via Facebook Live. Kevin had Paul Wiese get up and explain the Online Horseshoe Pitching movement and how it has grown this year. Paul has been in many online tournaments this year and has a lot of knowledge in the different types of online tournaments

that are out there. Anyone who is interested in this should contact Paul Wiese.

Every fall meeting we take bids for state. This year bids for the 2021 (our 99th) were asked for and no club had a bid ready for the 2021 state tournament. The Beloit Horseshoe Club said it would take it if no one else had a bid. So our 2020 and 2021 state tournament will be in Beloit.

Because the 2022 state tournament is the 100th for the WHPA, there will be more interest in hosting this tournament. Any club wanting to host this state tournament should contact Kevin Brekke who is coordinating this. The Little Bull Falls Club has already contacted me and I have been working with them to get things ready for the bid at the next Fall Meeting. It is preferred to have an indoor facility so weather is not a problem, and there will be a banquet and history display of our 100 years, and possibly other considerations. The Central Wisconsin area would be a good location and I know they will have a strong bid in the fall.

Election of officers—Dobie Gutweiler, President, and Kevin Brekke, 2nd VP. Won by acclamation to another 2-year term.

Next spring meeting will be on April 18, 2020 at the Lake Delton Sportsmen Club. Meeting adjourned.


